

MEMORANDUM FOR SEE DISTRIBUTION

SUBJECT: Suspension of On Post Driving Privileges for Those Who Do Not Appear In Traffic Court

1. Driving on Fort Benning, Georgia is a privilege and is conditioned upon the driver abiding by the rules and regulations promulgated by this headquarters.
2. All drivers are required to take one of the following actions upon receiving a citation (DD Form 1805) from any authorized law enforcement officer on Fort Benning, Georgia.
 - a. If section A of the citation is checked, the driver is required to appear in court on the date and location listed.
 - b. If section B of the citation is checked, the driver is required to either pay the fine as outlined in section B, or appear in court on the date and location listed.
3. If neither action outlined in paragraph two (2) above is taken by the driver prior to the close of court on the date indicated by the citation, the driver will be issued a **SUSPENSION OF INSTALLATION DRIVING PRIVILEGES** which will notify the driver of the reason for the suspension.
4. Procedures for appealing suspensions of installation driving privileges are listed in USAIC Regulation 210-5, section IV, paragraph 6-10 through 6-12. Suspensions based on this order will be IAW AR 190-5, paragraph 2-4 and will be in effect for one year. Suspensions based on this order shall be lifted upon proof that the driver in question has either paid the fine as outlined in section B of the citation, or appeared at the next available court date.
5. The procedures outlined in this memorandum shall be incorporated in to the next publication of USAIC Regulation 190-5, Vehicle Traffic Regulation.
