MEMORANDUM FOR Commander, 41st Brigade Engineer Battalion, ATTN: LTC John Dupeire, North Riva Ridge Road, Building 10120, Fort Drum, NY 13602

SUBJECT: Coat of Arms for the 41st Engineer Battalion

1. The coat of arms for the 41st Engineer Battalion amended this date to correct the authorizations and update the blazon of the crest, was:

a. **Originally approved** for the 41st Engineer Battalion (Combat) by letter QMGRH 424.2 & 421.4, The Office of The Quartermaster General, 21 October 1954.

b. **Redesignated** for the 41st Engineer Battalion effective 1 September 1985 by letter DAAG-HDP-A, The Institute of Heraldry, 2 May 1985.

c. **Amended** to add a crest by letter DAAG-HDP-A, The Institute of Heraldry, 16 January 1986.

2. The blazon and symbolism of the design are as follows:

BLAZON

SHIELD: Per chevron Argent and Gules, a wreath of a branch of olive and a branch of oak, Vert.

CREST: From a wreath Argent and Gules, on a mountain Vert capped Argent two cubit arms vambraced, hands in gauntlets saltirewise of the first (Silver Gray), the dexter hand grasping a sword of the second and the sinister hand a hammer of the like.

MOTTO: VIGOR ET VALOR (Strength and Spirit).

SYMBOLISM


SHIELD: Red and white are the colors for the Corps of Engineers; combined with green they allude to the Battalion's service in Italy during World War II, as does the wreath taken from the Italian national emblem. The red triangular shape, used to represent a mountain, refers to the organization's former designation of "Mountain" Battalion and to the service in the Apennines.

AAHS-IHS (840-10a)

SUBJECT: Coat of Arms for the 41st Engineer Battalion

CREST: The arms in armour in combination with the hammer and sword symbolize the unit's World War II combat participation as "fighter" and "builder." The mount suggests the unit's original designation as a "Mountain" Battalion and also refers to the unit's World War II campaigns in Italy's Po Valley and North Apennines region. The colors green, white and red allude to the Italian flag and further suggest World War II campaigns.

3. This authorization is in accordance with paragraph 5-59, AR 840-10. A copy of this letter will become a part of your permanent organizational history file.

SUBJECT: Distinctive Unit Insignia for the 41st Engineer Battalion

1. The distinctive unit insignia amended this date to update the description, was:
 - a. **Originally approved** for the 41st Engineer Battalion (Combat) by letter QMGRH 424.4 & 421.4, The Office of The Quartermaster General, 21 October 1954.
 - b. **Redesignated** for the 41st Engineer Battalion effective 1 September 1985 by letter DAAG-HDP-A, The Institute of Heraldry, 2 May 1985.
2. The description and symbolism of the design are as follows:


DESCRIPTION

A Silver color metal and enamel device 1 3/32 inches (2.78 cm) in height overall consisting of a shield blazoned: Per chevron Argent and Gules, a wreath of a branch of olive and a branch of oak, Vert; and attached below the shield a Silver scroll inscribed "VIGOR ET VALOR" in Red letters.

SYMBOLISM

Red and white are the colors for the Corps of Engineers; combined with green they allude to the Battalion's service in Italy during World War II, as does the wreath taken from the Italian national emblem. The red triangular shape, used to represent a mountain, refers to the organization's former designation of "Mountain" Battalion and to the service in the Apennines. The motto translates to "Strength and Spirit."

3. This authorization is in accordance with AR 670-1. A copy of this letter will become a part of your permanent organizational history file.

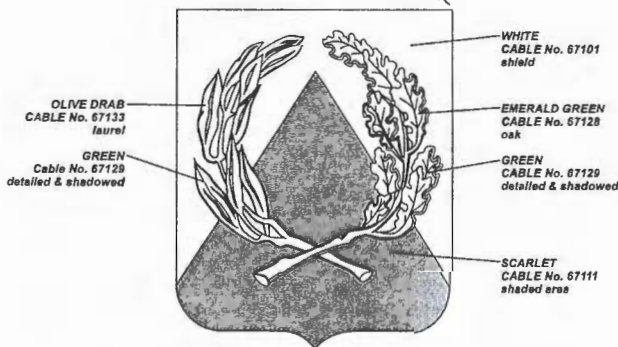
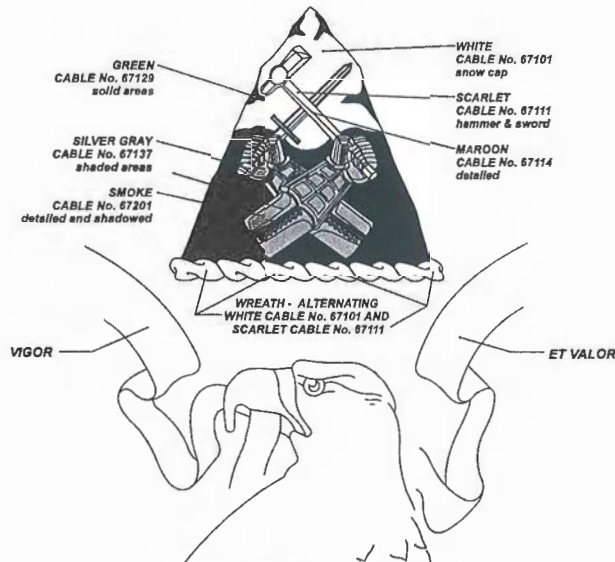
