

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

Second Judicial Circuit

On 01 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Brian M. Winters, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of wrongful disposition of military property, and two specifications of larceny of military property, in violation of Articles 108, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PVT Ellis S. Klein, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of violation of a lawful general order, one specification of drunk on duty, one specification of distribution of intimate images, one specification of indecent conduct, and one specification of stalking, in violation of Articles 86, 92, 112, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 32 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 22 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV2 Kurtis J. Gilbert, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault upon a military police officer, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 180 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 23 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT David T. Burgin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of murder, in violation of Article 118, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 35 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 27 years.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 02 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Ross C. Arrington, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to forfeit \$801.00 pay per month for 2 months.

On 07 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC Jorge M. Morales, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assaulting a noncommissioned officer, one specification of wrongfully opening mail, four specifications of larceny, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 91, 109a, 121, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 179 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 April 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Justin A. Thomas, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and one specification of false official statement, in violation of Articles 86, and 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of absence without leave, one specification of disrespecting a noncommissioned officer, and one specification of disobeying a noncommissioned officer, in violation of Articles 86, and 91, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3.

On 13 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PV2 John O. Hobbs, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and four specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful appropriation, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 16 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 14 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SGT Kevin V. Zazueta, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 14 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PV2 Eduardo Aceves, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 13 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 15 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SGT Jonathan D. Davenport, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of six specifications of desertion, one specification of the wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 85, 112a, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 185 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Chris L. McKenzie, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 107, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for 3 months, and to perform hard labor without confinement for 15 days.

On 20 April 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Ryan D. Harvey, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 April 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC Derek L. Perry, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of unlawful entry, in violation of Articles 115, 128b, and 129, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of communicating a threat, and one specification of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 115, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1.

On 21 April 2020, at a special court-martial, convened with military judge alone, at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SSG Robert D. Isaak, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to be confined for 15 days.

On 23 April 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Donovan L. Pearman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of fleeing apprehension, two specifications of damage to military property, two specifications of drunken operation of a vehicle, and one specification of consuming liquor while under the age of 21, in violation of Articles 87a, 108, 113, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 55 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 22 April 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, PVT Pierre D. Morris, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of communicating a threat, two specifications of wrongful appropriation, and one specification of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 86, 112a, 115, 121, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 255 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 23 April 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, PVT Troy D. Scurry Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave and three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 55 days, to forfeit \$840.00 pay per month for 2 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 April 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and four specifications of battery upon a spouse, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ.

On 28 April 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Hubert W. Steptoe, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Daniel W. Wolfe, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, 2LT Shane W. Schlak, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, two specifications of possessing child pornography, and one specification of distributing child pornography, in violation of Articles 133, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, in violation of Article 133, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 25 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 15 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SSG Randy V. Wint, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of false official statement, in violation of Article 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5, and to be confined for 60 days.

On 16 April 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, MSG Patrick M. Malone, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of indecent language, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-7, and to be confined for 21 days.

On 21 April 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SFC James M. Madden, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Articles 120, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 42 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 36 months.

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
