

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 12 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Lawrence T. Bostic, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, two specifications of sexual assault of a child, and one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Articles 107, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 42 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 13 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SGT Jason D. Ellis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 14 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 12 months.

On 28 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PFC Yousef A. Milhem, United States Army, was convicted by the military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of battery upon a spouse, in violation of Articles 90, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be confined for 90 days.

On 29 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, CW5 Christopher J. Clark, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of wrongfully violating a lawful order, two specifications of wrongfully violating a lawful general order, and one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and gentlemen, in violation of Articles 92, and 133, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days, and to pay a \$600.00 fine.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 04 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Thomas M. Walker, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 04 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Rasheed A. Walker, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86,

UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 150 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 06 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Kelvin Santos, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, two specifications of wrongful disposition of military property, two specifications of larceny of military property, and one specification of unlawful breaking and entering, in violation of Articles 81, 108, 121, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 58 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, the convening authority agreed to suspend all confinement in excess of 12 months and to remit the suspended period of confinement upon the completion of SPC Santos's cooperation in other criminal proceedings.

On 06 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PVT Shane W. Austin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of reckless endangerment, and one specification of discharging a firearm under circumstances that endangered human life, in violation of Articles 92, and 114, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 160 days.

On 12 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC James M. Mims, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 9 days.

On 12 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PV2 Robert L. Brown, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 2 months, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 13 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Glenn S. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of possession of child pornography, one specification of viewing child pornography, and one specification of receiving child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 14 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Arturo Ruiz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of ten specifications of larceny, and ten specifications of burglary, in violation of

Articles 121, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 360 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Lionel Garcia, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempting to commit sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Articles 80, and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Mickey A. Keeney, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of larceny, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 20 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 29 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PV2 Timothy Golden, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement disapproved any adjudged discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 13 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, MAJ Ronald E. Martin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded.

On 14 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of cruelty and maltreatment, in violation of Article 93, UCMJ.

On 19 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, PVT Davione L. Germany, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of failure to obey a lawful general order, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and six specifications of distribution of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of absence without leave, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled

substance, in violation of Articles 86, 90, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 354 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 20 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, PFC David J. Velez-Acosta, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be confined for 30 days, and to perform 90 days hard labor without confinement.

On 20 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SGT Darrell A. Lilly, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of endangerment, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of discharging a firearm under circumstances that endangered human life, in violation of Articles 128, 114, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, three specifications of endangerment, one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of obstructing justice, and one specification of violating a Kansas Criminal Code, in violation of Articles 92, 114, 115, 131b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 21 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, PFC Logan P. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion, and three specifications of fraudulent use of credit cards, debit cards, and other access devices, in violation of Articles 85, and 121a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of eight specifications of attempting to defraud by use of credit cards, debit cards, and other access devices, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SGT Jesus J. Mendoza, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of disobeying a commissioned officer, and three specifications of assault, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of five specifications of assault, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 128, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 22 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SSG William J. Netherton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of domestic violence, in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ.

The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 6 months.

On 26 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Jorge L. CedenoMarquez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 81, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 36 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 26 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, PFC Obed V. LopezRivera, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy, in violation of Article 81, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 01 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Jonathan J. Thomas, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 04 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Edwin A. Adrian, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 05 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PFC Pablo Padilla, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempt to wrongfully distribute a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance unto a military installation, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 80, and 112a. The military judge sentenced him to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 120 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a plea agreement limited confinement to 9 months.

On 08 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Lance E. Colbert, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of murder, in violation of Article 118, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of communicating a threat, one specification of premeditated murder, and one specification of indecent language, in violation of Articles 115, 118, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for life without the eligibility for parole, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 08 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Gabriel O. Inaboya, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 107, 112a, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 105 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 11 May 2020, at a special court-martial, convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SFC Shvoda M. Gregory, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of negligent dereliction of duty, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit \$1000.00 per month for 1 month, and to perform 20 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 12 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Romel D. Gilmore, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of discharging a firearm under circumstances that endangered human life, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 114, and 131b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of accessory after the fact, four specifications of attempted murder, and two specifications of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 78, 80, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 11 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Presidio of Monterey, California, SPC Angelo C. Hernandez Dianda, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of attempted indecent visual recording, one specification of indecent visual recording, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 80, 120c, 128, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 20 months, to forfeit \$100.00 pay per

month for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 13 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Daniel A. Toledoocampo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of desertion terminated by apprehension, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 14 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ.

On 19 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PFC Tyler D. Morgan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of accessory after the fact, one specification of attempted murder, one specification of conspiracy to obstruct justice, one specification of obstruction of justice, and one specification of false official statement, in violation of Articles 78, 80, 81, 107, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 126 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 21 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Kane M. Manley, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of larceny, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to forfeit \$365.00 pay per month for 2 months, and to perform 20 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 26 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Eric J. Brooks, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, and two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Dylan C. Meche, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 29 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT Terrance J. Oliver, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of rape of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 78 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Tamico K. Chasteen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 107, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 29 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Marquise J. Miller, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, one specification of reckless endangerment, one specification of discharging a firearm under circumstances that endangered human life, one specification of unlawfully carrying a concealed weapon, two specifications of assault, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 107, 114, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 40 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 29 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Enrique Guerra, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery on an intimate partner, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for 2 months, and to be confined for 14 days.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 07 May 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SGT Jun H. Song, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Articles 112a, and 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 4 months.

On 12 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, PV2 Maurice D. Pierce, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of breach of the peace, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 116, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge

sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 months and 15 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, PFC Gaige P. Wynne, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 1 year, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

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
