

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 02 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Eustis, Virginia, SPC Robert W. Nelson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of eight specifications of larceny, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be confined for 32 days.

On 05 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PVT Linvin C. Doty, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Military District of Washington, District of Columbia, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault upon a child, and one specification of indecent exposure, in violation of Articles 120b, and 120c, UCMJ.

On 11 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, 1LT Steven Brown, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 107, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be dismissed from the service.

On 11 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SFC Palikna T. Tosie, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of simple assault, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, two specifications of aggravated assault, and two specifications of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade E-1, to be confined for 2 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited reduction to the grade of E-4, and confinement to 5 months and 29 days.

On 19 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC James K. Morphew, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of battery upon a spouse, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of battery upon a spouse, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 19 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SGT Frank K. Hertel II, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of seven specifications of rape of a child, ten specifications of sexual abuse of a child, one specification of possession of child pornography, one specification of production of child pornography, and one specification of distribution of child pornography, in violation of Articles 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances to be confined for 36 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 25 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Enoch Dabanka, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 195 days and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 26 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort McNair, Washington D.C., a Captain, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of three specifications of sexual assault, and three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ.

On 29 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at West Point, New York, a Cadet, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 02 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Dmitri Pittman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of disrespecting a superior noncommissioned officer, one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, four specifications of assault, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 91, 113, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be confined for 14 days.

On 02 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, PV2 Justin B. Hurst, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of communicating a threat, and four specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 115, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 03 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Hugo L. Font Macias, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of resisting arrest, one specification of escaping pretrial confinement, one specification of disrespect to a superior commissioned officer, one specification of damaging government property, two specifications of possession of a controlled substance, two specifications of introducing a controlled substance onto a military installation, one specification of unlawfully carrying a concealed weapon, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 87a, 89, 109, 112a, 114, and 115, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 11 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV2 Dylan P. Williams, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Article 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 20 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 11 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Jeremiah M. Espinoza, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of wrongful disposition of military property, two specifications of larceny of military property, and one specification of unlawful breaking and entering, in violation of Articles 81, 108, 121, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 36 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGT Justin T. Saputo, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongfully distributing intimate visual images, in violation of Article 117a, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to forfeit \$800.00 pay per month for two months.

On 18 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of three specifications of sexual assault, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 24 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Trevar D. Tinsley, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 26 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of four specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 30 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, PVT Braeden I. Holt, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 112a, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 133 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 03 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Markell K. Bateman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge did not impose any punishment on the accused.

On 03 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Myles A. Bell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of resisting apprehension, and one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Articles 87a, and 113, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3.

On 05 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Ikeem Singleton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of larceny, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SGT Jakob D. Swan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 75 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement commuted the discharge to a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, PFC Nathaniel K. Jones, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 21 days.

On 09 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base San Antonio, Texas, PFC Noah M. Raney, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of involuntary manslaughter, in violation of Article 119, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 27 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 11 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, PFC Eddie R. Holland, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of communicating a threat, and one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Articles 115, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,361.00 pay per month for 9 months, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base San Antonio, Texas, SSG Dustin A. Weber, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of maltreatment, two specifications of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 93, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 30 months, to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 9 months.

On 13 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Presidio of Monterey, California, PFC Shayne C. Grindstaff, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 15 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 17 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SSG Anterrion L. Gaines, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of violation of a lawful general regulation, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 14 days.

On 18 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SPC Blake A. Barshinger, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempt to commit a lewd act upon a child, and one specification of committing a lewd act upon a child, in violation of Articles 80, and 120b,

UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 15 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 19 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, SPC Nigua J. Mack, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of rape, one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of unlawful entry, in violation of Articles 115, 120, 128, and 129, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted sexual assault, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 80, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to E-1, to be confined for 21 years and 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 22 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Wesley A. Avila, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of solicitation, one specification of false official statement, three specifications of sexual abuse of a child, one specification of producing child pornography, one specification of distributing child pornography, two specifications of possessing child pornography, and two specifications of indecent language, in violation of Article 81, 82, 107, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of sexual abuse of a child, and four specifications of indecent language, in violation of Articles 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 27 years and 2 months, and to be discharged from service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 23 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SFC James C. Harder, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Articles 90, and 113, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6, and to be confined for 14 days. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 5 days.

On 25 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, CW2 Terence L. Priest, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 4 months.

On 25 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SFC Joshua T. Kennedy, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military panel composed

of officers and enlisted members, of one specification of cruelty and maltreatment, in violation of Article 93, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of cruelty and maltreatment, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 93, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 26 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SFC Kareem R. Green, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and two specifications of willful dereliction of duty, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6, and to be confined for 100 days.

On 29 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Deshawn E. Sturkey, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Article 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 240 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 02 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Danica R. Stocksen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to commit larceny, ten specifications of selling military property, and two specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 81, 108, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to pay the United States a fine of \$3000, to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 5 months, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 02 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Terry J. Singleton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 25 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 03 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PV2 Rodney L. Green, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful appropriation of a military firearm, in violation of Articles 92, 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to

be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 03 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Lewron C. Lacey, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of accessory after the fact to aggravated assault with a dangerous weapon, two specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, and one specification of false official statement, in violation of Articles 78, 92, and 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 08 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC Fabian E. Rodriguez, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of failure to obey a lawful general order, and one specification of breach of the peace, in violation of Articles 92, and 116, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1000.00 pay per month for 3 months, and to be confined for 26 days.

On 09 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SFC Jose G. Ramos, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of aggravated assault upon an intimate partner, in violation of Articles 92, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 11 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Zachary L. Tillman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 20 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Ivan P. Grimm, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 21 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SFC Chad M. Stone, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$250.00 per month for 2 months.

On 10 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC Ricardo J. Vega, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of indecent language, in violation of Articles 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 4 months.

On 11 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, SPC Austin D. Roberts, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Presidio of Monterey, California, CPT Luis L. Ballesteros, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of absence without leave, three specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of extortion, one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 86, 92, 112a, 127, 133, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 13 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 15 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, CW2 Kyle J. Swope, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, two specifications of obstructing justice, and one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentlemen, in violation of Articles 128, 131b, and 133, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of distributing intimate images, and five specifications of indecent recording or broadcasting, in violation of Articles 117a, and 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 315 days, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 17 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of three specifications of sexual assault, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ.

On 18 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Isaac Q. McLeod, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of escape from confinement, one specification of sexual abuse of a child, one specification of production of child pornography, and one specification of distribution of child pornography, in violation of Articles 87a, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-

1, to be confined for 5 years, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 18 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PFC Courage Kamara, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 15 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 19 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, SGT Zaid N. Talfah, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4.

On 22 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PV2 Nathen R. Elliott-Brown, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 120 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 23 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PV2 Jacob E. Jackson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and one specification of missing movement, in violation of Articles 86, and 87, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 24 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, a First Lieutenant, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of sexual assault, and one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer, in violation of Articles 120, and 133, UCMJ.

On 25 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, a Chief Warrant Officer Two, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of one specification of rape of a child, and two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ.

On 26 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Edward Arreaga, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of maltreatment, and five specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 93, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of four specifications of abusive sexual contact, and three specifications

of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 141 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 26 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PFC Austin Hamilton, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of rape, and one specification of aggravated sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of rape, one specification of aggravated sexual contact, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 26 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SGT Logan M. Myers, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of communicating a threat, three specifications of assault, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of attempt to impede the administration of justice, in violation of Article 115, 128, 128b, and 131b, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to perform 45 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 29 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, PFC Kevin K. McGuire, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, eight specifications of wrongful appropriation, two specifications of making a check without sufficient funds, and four specifications of dishonorable debt, in violation of Articles 90, 121, 123a, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 244 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 30 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, SPC Charionta L. Jones, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to her pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by battery, one specification of unlawful entry, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 128, 129, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of unlawful entry, in violation of Articles 128, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be confined for 30 days.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 04 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SGT Joseph D. Cantrell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct, in violation of Articles 92, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of four specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 45 days.

On 05 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, PVT Devon S. Ross, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced to the accused to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Vicenza, Italy, SGT Robert J. Guzman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of maltreatment, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Articles 92, 93, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 54 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 10 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Vicenza, Italy, SPC Dakota R. Kohlhof, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of a violation a lawful general regulation, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of child endangerment, and one specification of reckless endangerment, in violation of Articles 92, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 11 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Vicenza, Italy, SFC Keith M. Johnson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of overindulgence of alcohol, in violation of Articles 86, 92, and 112, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6, and to be confined for 14 days.

On 16 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SGT Nathaniel J. Aschcroft, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation

of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to grade of E-3, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 17 June 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SFC Trazarra K. Patman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, one specification of larceny, and one specification of wrongfully impeding an investigation, in violation of Articles 107, 121, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6, and to be confined for 2 months.

On 22 June 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, PVT Idris K. Wright, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of resisting apprehension, one specification of disrespect toward a noncommissioned officer, and two specifications of assault upon a person in the execution of law enforcement duties, in violation of Articles 87a, 91, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 7 months.

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
