

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 09 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at the United States Military Academy, CDT Christopher K. Inzinga, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his guilty plea, of the wrongful use, possession, and distribution of controlled substance analogues in violation Articles 92 and 134 of the UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be dismissed from the service.

On 09 July 2020, at a special court-martial convened at the United States Military Academy, SFC Michael L. Deeds, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of failure to obey a lawful general order, one specification of abuse of a training leadership position, one specification of false official statement, and one specification of extramarital misconduct, in violation of Articles 90, 92, 93a, 107, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of obstructing justice, and one specification of providing alcohol to someone under 21 years old, in violation of Articles 131b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5, and to be confined for 78 days.

On 12 July 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort McNair, Washington, D.C., SSG Dale Rojas, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his pleas, of four specifications of cruelty and maltreatment in violation of Article 93, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of abusive sexual contact and one specification of cruelty and maltreatment in violation of Articles 120 and 93, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5 and to be confined for 30 days.

On 16 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, a Second Lieutenant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 17 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PFC Wendell W. Carpenter IV, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute, and one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Jorge E. Trigueros, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of sexual assault and abusive sexual

contact, 120. of The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced in grade to E-1, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 25 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, PV2 Mison J. Mickle, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of attempted abusive sexual contact, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 80, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SFC Roberto Aikanoff Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of seven specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of four specifications of attempted rape of a child, four specifications of rape of a child, and two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Articles 80, and 120b, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 20 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Eustis, Virginia, SPC Tyler A. Jansen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, and two specifications of indecent recording, in violation of Articles 120 and 120c, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of sexual assault, and one specification of indecent recording, in violation of Articles 120 and 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 30 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PFC Kahlil D. Hedrington, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape, and one specification of burglary, in violation of Articles 120, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 28 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 02 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Brian C. Docilet, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual

assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. A military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 180 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 10 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC George L. Rolle, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of wrongful sale of military property, and one specification of unlawfully concealing a weapon, one specification of larceny, and one specification of breaking and entering, in violation of Articles 81, 108, 114, 121, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, confined for 24 months and discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 11 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PFC Jonathan C. Lauture, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, four specifications of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse, one specification of simple assault with an unloaded firearm, and four specifications of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 90, 128, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 775 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 13 July 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Malik T. Barber, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault with a dangerous weapon in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 121 days.

On 15 July 2020, at a special court-martial empowered to adjudge a bad-conduct discharge, convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Savion Rouse, United States Army was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of wrongful sale of military property, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 81, 108, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 16 July 2020, at a general court-martial, convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PVT Alexander R. Soto, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his pleas, by a military judge, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of wrongful possession of LSD, one specification of wrongful possession of marijuana with intent to distribute, and one specification of wrongful distribution of marijuana in violation of Article 81, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for a period of 42 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 20 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SSG Ladonies P. Strong, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to her pleas, of one specification of negligent homicide, and one specification of prevention of authorized seizure of property, in violation of Articles 134 and 131e, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of involuntary manslaughter, one specification of reckless operation of a vehicle, and two specifications of dereliction of duty, in violation of Articles 119, 113, and 92, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 22 July 2020, at a special court-marital convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of unlawful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 24 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SSG Jason A. Lopez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of larceny, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and two specifications of possessing an unregistered firearm, in violation of Articles 121, 128, and 134 UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 18 months. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 358 days.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 08 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, SPC William J. Frias, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 121 days.

On 09 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a First Lieutenant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 15 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Paul A. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, one specification of producing child pornography, one specification of distributing child pornography, one specification of receiving child pornography, and one specification of possessing child pornography, in violation of Articles 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 24 years, and to be discharged from service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 16 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, PVT Abbie S. Cruz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 22 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 17 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Private, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of five specifications of rape, and two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 20 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Rodney L. Payne, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of attempted indecent recording, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days.

On 22 July 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general order, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ.

On 23 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ.

On 29 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of attempted premeditated murder, one specification of wrongful appropriation, and one specification of aggravated assault with a dangerous weapon, in violation of Articles 80, 121, and 128, UCMJ.

On 30 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, Inmate Payton K. Cork, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of assault upon a person in the execution of law enforcement duties, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault upon a person in the execution of law enforcement duties, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 3 years.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 02 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SGT Harrison B. Poe, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of indecent exposure, in violation of Articles 120, and 120c, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced

to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 06 July 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Jakob S. Stocksen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy steal military property, one specification of conspiracy to sell military property, and one specification of false official statement, in violation of Articles 81, and 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of selling military property, in violation of Article 108, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to perform 90 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 10 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Michael E. Claggett, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for 2 months.

On 10 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Jordan C. Bonner, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his plea, by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, of one specification of false official statement, in violation of Article 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 10 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Henry, Republic of Korea, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of six specifications of sexual assault, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 13 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SSG Michael C. Gales, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 92, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 13 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Kenyatta A. Chapman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of rape of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to

forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 20 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 15 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC Lavon C. Blaylock, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse, and one specification of aggravated assault upon a spouse, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of destruction of property, one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 109, 128, 128b, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 210 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of three specifications of rape in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 17 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, PV2 Dejon A. Yearling, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 92, and 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 90 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 20 July 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SFC Claude S. Bryant, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for one month.

On 22 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, CPT Brandon L. Thurman, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of wearing unauthorized insignia, and one specification of a false official statement, in violation of Articles 106a, and 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wearing unauthorized insignia, and one specification of a false official statement, in violation of Articles 106a, and 107, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit \$4422.00 pay per month for 6 months, and to be restricted for 60 days.

On 24 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SFC Patrick H. Hatfield Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one

specification of indecent liberty with a child, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact with a child, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 27 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SFC Duane W. Schwartz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of attempted enticement of a child, in violation of Articles 80, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 29 July 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, a Sergeant First Class, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of four specifications of maltreatment, in violation of Article 93, UCMJ.

On 29 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SGT Paul R. Leonard, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, and to be confined for 180 days.

On 29 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PFC Raymond A. Salas Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged with a bad-conduct discharge.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 11 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, a Specialist, was acquitted by a panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault, three specifications of aggravated assault, and twelve specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ.

On 16 July 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SPC Darrick E. Johnson, United States Army, was convicted by a panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of dereliction of duty, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of willful disobedience of a noncommissioned officer, in violation of Article 91, UCMJ. The

military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 2 months and 15 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 22 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, a Chief Warrant Officer Two, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of one specification of larceny, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ.

On 23 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SPC Derrick J. Thornton, United States Army, was convicted by a panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 30 July 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SSG Troy E. King, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of 16 specifications of wrongful appropriation, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of wrongful appropriation, one specification of obstructing justice, and one specification of obtaining services by false pretenses, in violation of Articles 121, 131b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 3 months.
