

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 03 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, CPT Earnest Copeland, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, of three specifications of false official statement, in violation of Article 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit \$2,000.00 pay per month for 5 months, and to be restricted for 2 months to the limits of Fort Knox, Kentucky.

On 04 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Eustis, Virginia, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 11 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SGT Andre B. Redding-Williams, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of a false official statement, and one specification of larceny of private property, in violation of Articles 107, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Myer-Henderson Hall, Virginia, MAJ Burke D. Sorenson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of larceny, and one specification of wrongful appropriation, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to forfeit \$500.00 per month for two months.

On 14 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Eustis, Virginia, a Sergeant First Class, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ.

On 19 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC Joshua M. Conner, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of false official statement, in violation of Article 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 179 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 19 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Brian C. Henderson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 107, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PV2 Naomi C. Webster, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon her spouse, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to perform 15 days hard labor without confinement.

On 25 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SSG Michael J. Hale, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of possession of child pornography, and one specification of distribution of child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 months.

On 31 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Jesse E. Spyker, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of negligent homicide, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 31 August 2020, at a Special court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SSG Brian Milliser, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey an order or regulation in violation of Article 92, UCMJ; one specification of false official statement in violation of Article 107, UCMJ; and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to reduction to the grade of E-4, 15 days of confinement and a Bad-Conduct Discharge. A pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 10 August 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, MSG Kieran A. Cuddihy, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of failure to obey a lawful general order, and one specification of wrongful appropriation, in violation of Articles 92, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-7.

On 12 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Chief Warrant Officer Five, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of wrongful disposition, and two specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 108, and 121, UCMJ.

On 19 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV2 Kadarius D. Glenn, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of wrongful disposition, one specification

of burglary, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 81, 108, 129, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 25 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ.

On 27 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Colonel, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of three specifications of sexual assault, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 28 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SSG Phillip M. Johnson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 18 months.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 04 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Anthony R. Kirk, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of eight specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and three specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 240 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 06 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Robert N. Patton, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of attempted sexual assault, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 12 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of attempted sexual assault, one specification of failure to obey a general regulation, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 80, 92, and 120, UCMJ.

On 13 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Tyril T. Andrews, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one

specification of reckless operation of a vehicle, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 113, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be confined for 45 days.

On 18 August 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 19 August 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of drunk and disorderly, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ.

On 25 August 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Erik Arenasbecerra, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon an intimate partner, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. Contrary to his plea, the accused was convicted of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon an intimate partner, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct, in violation of Articles 92, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 210 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 26 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, a Private, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 01 August 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Deontay K. Parham, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of insubordinate conduct towards a noncommissioned officer, four specifications of failure to obey order or regulation, two specifications of wrongful use of controlled substances, one specification of larceny, and two specifications of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 86, 91, 92, 112a, 121, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 270 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 06 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, a Private, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 10 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SPC Noah D. Tanski-Jett, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child and one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 13 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, WO1 David W. Carter Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of maltreatment, and one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Articles 93, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months.

On 19 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, SPC Jaquez R. Davis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of aggravated assault, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 14 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Christian Z. Dow, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of possession of child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted sexual assault, one specification of abusive sexual contact, one specification of battery on a spouse, and one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Articles 80, 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. A military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 14 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 26 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Jarrod J. Angeja, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and two specifications of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 15 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 12 months.

On 26 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, a Private First Class, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of three specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 26 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Charles A. Reynolds, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child, and two specifications of attempted sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 27 August 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PFC Ladayshia N. Warren-Morant, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to her pleas, of two specifications of disobeying a lawful command by a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 90, and 131b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of disrespecting a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of false official statement, in violation of Articles 89, and 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$700.00 pay per month for 2 months, and to be confined for 7 days.

On 27 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Margarito Miramontes, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of six specifications of sexual assault, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 28 August 2020, at a special court-martial, at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC Jeremi T. Turner, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of violation of a lawful general order, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 90, 92, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 95 days.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 04 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Caserma Ederle, Vicenza, Italy, CPT Joshua C. Spsychalla, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of attempt to view child pornography, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days.

On 26 August 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SGT Juan J. Cardona, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The

military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 6 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 61 months.

On 31 August 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SFC Jerome R. Floyd, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 107, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 121 days.
