

## **Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

### **First Judicial Circuit**

On 02 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC Kalib S. Yohn, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of domestic violence, in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of breach of peace, two specifications of aggravated assault, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 116, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 14 days.

On 05 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of committing a lewd act upon a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ.

On 06 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, MSG John J. Hasenbein, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of reckless endangerment, in violation of Article 114, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to no punishment.

On 12 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC Jacob A. Strickland, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault, four specifications of sexual assault, two specifications of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of indecent conduct, in violation of Articles 80, 120, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted sexual assault, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 8 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 12 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, SGT Jermy E. Hardin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of the wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, of one specification of false official statement, and two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 107, and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempt to commit sexual assault, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 20 March 2020, on remand at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Nicholas J. Wright, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of simple assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. Previously, on 07 September 2017, at a general court martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Nicholas J. Wright, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of attempted abusive sexual contact, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of violating a Tennessee state statute for underage drinking, in violation of Articles 80, 120, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of four specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. Based on both the 2020 and 2017 convictions, the military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC Donovan P. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 86, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of possession of a weapon while a fugitive, in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 14 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PVT Naquille A. Everson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 112a, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful broadcast of intimate visual images, in violation of Article 117a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days.

### **Second Judicial Circuit**

On 02 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, CPL Drew L. Detherow, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of dereliction of duty, and one specification of wrongful distribution of intimate visual images, in violation of Articles 92, and 117a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 45 days.

On 03 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SPC Erica L. Marley, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 90,

and 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 107, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct-discharge.

On 04 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Matthew K. Snyder, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempted murder, and one specification of aggravated assault upon a child, in violation of Articles 80, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Article 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 36 months, and discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 05 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, CPT Kevin M. Barnes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for 2 months.

On 09 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Mackenzie Waite, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 11 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Stephen M. Holtsclaw, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to possess a controlled substance with the intent to distribute, and three specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 81, and 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Private First Class, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 12 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, a Private, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of rape, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 17 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, CW2 Anthony E. Fielden, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days.

On 31 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, WO1 Hashim M. Miller, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, and one specification of assault, in violation of Articles 92, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

### **Third Judicial Circuit**

On 05 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, 1LT Ryan M. McEntee, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, in violation of Articles 120b, and 133, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 16 months, and to be dismissed from service.

On 06 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, SSG Daniel Gonzalez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of assault, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 11 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, SSG David P. Pyle, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of maltreatment, and one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Articles 93, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 3 months. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 30 days.

On 11 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, PFC Austin M. Roe, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 28 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 11 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SSG Randy P. French, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of

officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of attempted sexual assault, two specifications of abusive sexual contact, and two specifications of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Articles 80, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of maltreatment, and one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Articles 93, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to perform 90 days of hard labor without confinement, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 27 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC David Perez-Sanchez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted sexual assault, and one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, in violation of Articles 80, and 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 31 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SSG Samuel M. Kimani, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, and one specification of wrongful appropriation, in violation of Articles 113, and 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempting to leave the scene, and one specification of reckless endangerment, in violation of Articles 80, and 114, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to be reduced to the grade of E-5.

#### **Fourth Judicial Circuit**

On 02 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, SGT Rodney A. Duncan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of forgery, in violation of Article 105, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be confined for 45 days.

On 03 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SGT Matthew N. Vazquez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 75 days.

On 04 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation Articles 92, and 131b, UCMJ.

On 05 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Hien V. Le, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SGT Steven W. Sims, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 120 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 11 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, a Sergeant First Class, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of rape, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 12 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Brandon J. Kosiek, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 80 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Christopher R. Salcido, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of indecent language to a child, one specification of indecent language, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 15 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 13 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SGT Rafael Cuevasibarra, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 92, and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of maltreatment, two specifications of abusive sexual contact, one specification of sexual assault, and two specifications of assault, in violation of Articles 93, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 40 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 13 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, SPC Shawn T. Martinez, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel

composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, in violation of Article 90, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault of a child, five specifications of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of wrongfully communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 120b, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to be confined for 14 days.

On 16 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PV2 Dajon J. Gray, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 110 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Datwan K. Watson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of breaking restriction, two specifications of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, in violation of Articles 87b, 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 19 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Robert L. Hunt, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempting to commit a lewd act upon a child, and one specification of communicating indecent language, in violation of Articles 80, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 20 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PVT Vincent G. Scarborough, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 6 months, and to be confined for 51 days.

On 23 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, PFC Julian P. Payne, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 26 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PV2 Romon L. Hammond, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of false official statement, three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, three specifications of wrongful appropriation, and nine specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 90, 107, 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 355 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Joshua MB Tobias, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of dereliction of duty, one specification of false official statement, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 92, 107, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 31 March 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT Dylan A. Day, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 12 months, to be confined for 350 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 121 days.

### **Fifth Judicial Circuit**

On 12 March 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Wiesbaden, Germany, SSG Alejandro M. Figueroa, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specifications of aggravated assault upon a child, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of aggravated assault upon a child, and one specification of child endangerment, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 11 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.
