

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 02 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SGT Ashraf S. Warda, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of rape, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 120, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 7 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 05 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Jose L. Crispin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of two specifications of indecent video recording, in violation of Article 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 13 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 06 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of larceny of government property, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ.

On 07 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SGT Michael A. Hollingsworth, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful distribution of an intimate visual image, one specification of battery upon an intimate partner, one specification of aggravated assault, one specification of assault by strangulation, and two specifications of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 117a, 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of violating a general regulation, two specifications of false official statements, three specifications of communicating a threat, one specification of indecent recording, one specification of indecent exposure, one specification of assault by strangulation, three specifications of battery upon an intimate partner, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of stalking, two specifications of obstructing justice, one specification of extramarital sexual conduct, one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 92, 107, 115, 120c, 128, 128b, 130, 131b, 134. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 07 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, PVT Gianni D. Delgado, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of six specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, two specifications of possession with intent to distribute a controlled substance, and one specification of carrying a concealed weapon, in violation of Articles 112a, and 114,

UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 990 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 07 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PVT Andrew L. Walle, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 14 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PV2 Kayla M. McCarthy, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of desertion, three specifications of absence without leave, three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 85, 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 months and 6 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 16 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, LTC David J. Young, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 133, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of maltreatment, and three specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 93, and 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to forfeit \$9,816.00 pay per month for 6 months.

On 17 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SPC Warren C. Berry, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of attempt to make a visual recording, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 20 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at West Point, New York, CPT Eric L. Wilson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, two specifications of disobeying a lawful general regulation, and one specification of prohibited activities with a military trainee by a person in a position of special trust, in violation of Articles 90, 92, and 93a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 128, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 15 days, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 22 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PV2 Cameron M. Mays, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to

his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance, one specification of larceny, and one specification of assault upon a person in the execution of law enforcement duties, in violation of Articles 107, 112a, 121, and 128, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted of two specifications of attempted indecent viewing, one specification of insubordinate conduct towards a noncommissioned officer, one specification of sexual assault, and two specifications of assault upon a commissioned officer, in violation of Articles 80, 91, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, and two specifications of indecent recording, in violation of Articles 120, and 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 48 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PVT Nicholas J. Apgar, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of rape, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 49 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 30 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of conspiracy to obstruct justice, one specification of sexual assault, two specifications of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 81, 120, and 131b, UCMJ.

On 30 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SPC Zachary D. Walker, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a general regulation, one specification of drunk on duty, and one specification of animal abuse causing death, in violation of Articles 92, 112, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to E-1, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 01 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of rape of a child, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 120b, and 134, UCMJ.

On 06 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Gordon, Georgia, a Chief Warrant Officer Two, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ.

On 07 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Kyle M. Pratt, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of maltreatment, in violation of Article 93, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4.

On 15 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Jeremy T. Simpson, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, in violation of Article 89, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of false official statement in violation of Articles 89, and 107, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to be reduced to the grade of E-5.

On 16 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, PVT Jorge A. Lopez-Alvarado, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of assault, in violation of Articles 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$866.00 pay per month for two months, to perform 45 days of hard labor, to be restricted to the limits of Fort Benning for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 20 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, SSG Mathew D. Herrman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of prohibited activities with a military trainee by a person in a position of special trust, in violation of Article 93a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 22 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, a Private, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of four specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 22 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, CW2 Andre X. Tate, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer, in violation of Article 92, 128b, and 133, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to be confined for 6 months.

On 26 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PVT Carter D. Taylor, United States Army was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to use a controlled substance, one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, and two specifications of wrongful

use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 81, 92, and 112a UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$1155.00 for 12 months, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Darren M. Newcomb, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of coercion and enticement of a minor, in violation of Articles 80, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 28 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGM Lavander R. Wilkerson, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of false official statement, in violation of Articles 92, and 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6.

On 28 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SSG Denzel C. Cooper, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 92, and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of providing alcohol to a minor, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 1 year, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 02 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Noah M. Hoefs, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge, of one specification of violating a lawful general order, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse, in violation of Articles 92, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 125 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 07 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, SSG Jeffrey B. Bowens, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of wrongful possession of child pornography, in violation of

Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 12 months.

On 07 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Sergio A. Lopez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted premeditated murder, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of child endangerment, one specification of aggravated assault in which grievous bodily harm was inflicted, and one specification of burglary with intent to commit premeditated murder, in violation of Articles 80, 90, 119b, 128, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 21 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 20 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV2 Terry L. Hogan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, two specifications of child endangerment, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, in violation of Articles 92, 119b, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 121 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 22 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV2 Andrew N. Firmes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, in violation of Articles 90, and 92, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, in violation of Articles 90 and 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to perform 14 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 26 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Lazaro S. Juarez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of attempting sexual assault, and one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Articles 80, and 120, UCMJ.

On 28 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Jamacus G. Pitts, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to

his pleas, of two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of larceny, and one specification of fraudulent use of an access device, in violation of Articles 112a, 121, and 121a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of abusive sexual contact of a child, and two specifications of sexual assault of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 02 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of attempted murder, one specification of rape, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 80, 120, and 128, UCMJ.

On 05 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Nicholas T. Poole, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of larceny, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy to commit larceny, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 10 days.

On 07 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Christopher S. Stevick, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea of one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of distribution of child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 20 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 07 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, SSG Nicholas A. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of destruction of military property, and seven specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 108 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for 7 months. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited reduction to the grade of E-5.

On 14 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Alexander P. Carter, United States Army, was convicted by military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of wrongful use of a controlled

substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded.

On 14 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 23 October 2020, at a sentence rehearing convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, MSG Andrew D. Steele, United States Army, was sentenced by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members to be reduced to the grade of E-5. Previously, on 19 May 2017, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, MSG Andrew D. Steele, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, and one specification of fraternization, in violation of Articles 92, and 134, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge of one specification of indecent exposure, and one specification of disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 120c, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of conspiracy, two specifications of cruelty and maltreatment, two specifications of sexual assault, one specification of disorderly conduct, and one specification of unlawful entry, in violation of Articles 81, 93, 120, and 134, UCMJ.

On 19 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SGT Joseph A. Beckett, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of simple assault, in violation of Articles 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of five specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 125 days.

On 20 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Neil B. Beaubrun, United States Army, was convicted by military judge alone, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of failure to obey a lawful general order, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of false official statement, three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of possession of a controlled substance, and two specifications of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 92, 107, 112a, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 165 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 22 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of three specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 25 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, SGT George E. Alsobrooks, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of

one specification of communicating a threat, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 115, and 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 66 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 27 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SFC Cedric Bermudez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 1 day, and to pay a fine to the United States in the amount of \$1,100.00.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 20 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, MAJ Donald V. Wood, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge, of one specification of destruction of nonmilitary property, one specification of larceny, and one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, in violation of Articles 109, 121, and 133, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of stalking, in violation of Article 130, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 1 month.

On 23 October 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SFC Anthony A. Seymour, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of false official statement, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 107, and 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of false official statement, in violation of Article 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 45 days.

On 23 October 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SPC Shekinah G. Quaye, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of damaging non-military property, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 92, 109, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to no punishment.
