

**January 2021**  
**Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

**First Judicial Circuit**

On 08 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PFC Jordan Bellazer, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of sexual assault of a child in violation of articles 120 and 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape and four specifications of sexual abuse of a child in violation of articles 120 and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 14 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Eustis, Virginia, SPC Ewin G. Videa, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 360 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 19 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, PVT Michael S. Cotham, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of obstruction of justice in violation of Articles 112a and 131b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 90 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 26 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Christopher Tuten, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery and one specification of adultery in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E1, and to perform 30 days hard labor without confinement. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 28 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Daryl Jenkins, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 10 days

and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 29 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, SSG Craig D. Vinson, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of damaging nonmilitary property, one specification of larceny of military property, and one specification of larceny of other than military property in violation of Articles 109 and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and to be confined for 4 months. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

### **Second Judicial Circuit**

On 14 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Kemuel I. Hood, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 48 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 21 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SGT Jonathan G. Hernandez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of false official statement and two specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 107 and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1600 pay per month for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 22 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, 2LT Ebony R. Washington, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her The accused was acquitted of one specification of communicating a threat, and one specification of reckless endangerment in violation of Articles 114, and 115, UCMJ. pleas, of three specifications of assault consummated by battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to confinement for six months and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

### **Third Judicial Circuit**

On 06 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Lawrence Wallace, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement and one specification of sexual assault in violation of Articles 107 and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the

service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 07 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SSG Brian Espey, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of destroying non-military property, four specifications of assault upon an intimate partner, two specifications of obstruction of justice, one specification of animal abuse, and one specification of extramarital conduct, all in violation of Articles 109, 128, 131b, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of communicating a threat, two specifications of abusive sexual contact, one specification of wrongful appropriation, four specifications of assault upon an intimate partner, and one specification of drunk and disorderly in violation of Articles 115, 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced he accused to be reprimanded, to be confined for 20 months, and to receive a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 14 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SSG Kevin W. Too, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of six specifications of attempted indecent visual recording and three specifications of indecent visual recording in violation of Articles 80 and 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 125 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 22 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Jarius M. Harris, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Articles 107, and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be restricted to the confines of Fort Hood for 30 days, and to perform 30 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 27 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SGT Deonte A. Leshore, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of abuse of training leadership position, in violation of Article 93a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3 and to be confined for 60 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 27 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Quinshawn L. Cash, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, two specifications of rape, three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of aggravated assault by strangulation, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 92, 112a, 120, 128,

and 131b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, one specification of aggravated assault by inflicting substantial bodily harm, one specification of aggravated assault by strangulation, one specification of extramarital sexual conduct, and one specification of obstruction of justice in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 40 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, PV2 Clayton L. Mobley, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas of one specification of sexual assault of a child and one specification of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 54 months, and to be discharged from the service with a Dishonorable Discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

#### **Fourth Judicial Circuit**

On 04 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Chakeilon N. Madge-Bean, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her plea, of one specification of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 45 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 07 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, SGT Davawn J. Chester, United States Army, was convicted by an enlisted panel, contrary to his plea, of one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Article 115, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of communicating a threat, four specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of violating California Penal Code 270 in violation of Articles 115, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to serve 60 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 07 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Joel Stilianou, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of dereliction of duty, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct in violation of Articles 92, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of maltreatment of a subordinate, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of articles 92, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and to be confined for 23 days. A pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

On 08 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SGT Norris D. Nouredinecastro, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of failure to go to his appointed place of duty at the time prescribed and one specification of disrespect to a superior noncommissioned officer in violation of Articles 86 and 91, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer and one specification of willfully disobeying the lawful order of a noncommissioned officer in violation of Articles 89 and 91, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for one month and to perform hard labor without confinement for 14 days.

On 19 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, SGT Lajayleus J. Kinnebrew, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of disrespecting a superior commissioned officer, one specification of breaching the peace, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 89, 116, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 21 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 21 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 120, UCMJ.

On 22 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, PVT Kellen Frisque, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a lawful order; two specifications of the wrongful use of a controlled substance, two specifications of the wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, one specifications of the wrongful introduction of controlled substance and, one specification of obstructing justice in violation of Articles 90, 112a, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 23 months, and to receive a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 22 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PV2 Logan W. Foster, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of indecent conduct in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, six specifications of sexual assault, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and in violation of Articles 92, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for five days, and restriction for 30 days.

On 25 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Korea, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 27 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Quinten Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of failure to obey a lawful command, one specification of disrespect to a superior noncommissioned officer, one specification of wrongful appropriation, and one specification of assault consummated by battery in violation of Articles 90, 91, 121, and 128, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge of one specification of communicating a threat in violation of Article 115, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of false official statement, one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of larceny in violation of Articles 107, 120, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to total forfeitures, to be confined for 325 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 28 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Dylan T. Kelly, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge, and to be confined for 150 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

### **Fifth Judicial Circuit**

On 09 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, a Private, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of two specifications of false official statement, and four specifications of sexual assault in violation of Articles 107, and 120, UCMJ.

On 12 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SSG Sylvio A. Soler, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of obstructing justice in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 75 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited reduction to the grade of E-2.

On 13 January 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SGT Marion L. McMillian, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas of one specification of domestic violence and one specification of indecent conduct in violation of Articles 128b and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 21 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, PVT David B. Wills, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to

his pleas, of one specification of unlawful entry and two specifications of drunk and disorderly conduct in violation of Articles 129 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 23 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SGT Jacob C. Abernathy, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful possession of child pornography and one specification of wrongful distribution of child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three counts of possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 22 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 29 January 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, a Chief Warrant Officer, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of eight specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.
