

## **Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

### **First Judicial Circuit**

On 02 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SSG Christopher D. Brown, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 110 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 02 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SPC Bradley A. Cook, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and two specifications of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 03 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, a Private First Class, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 11 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PV2 Tucker A. Wright, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 15 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Meade, Maryland, SFC Mark A. Pearson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of the wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded.

On 16 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SFC Joel S. Johnston, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of communicating a threat, two specifications of abusive sexual contact, two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of indecent communication in violation of Articles 115, 120, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 16 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of three specifications of willful dereliction of duty, one specification of a false official statement, three specifications of larceny of military property of a value of more than \$500.00, and two

specifications of larceny of military property of a value of less than \$500.00, in violation of Articles 92, 107, and 121, UCMJ.

On 17 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, SSG Donald R. Fletcher II, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a regulation, and one specification of prohibited activities with recruit or trainee by person in position of special trust, in violation of Articles 92, and 93a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct, in violation of Articles 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5, and to be confined for 35 days.

On 18 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, 1SG Cecil J. Graham, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a regulation, one specification of prohibited activities with recruit or trainee by person in position of special trust, and one specification of obstructing justice, and in violation of Articles 92, 93a, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-7, and to be confined for 45 days.

On 23 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PV2 Shaquan H. Dobson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 29 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 23 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Langley Eustis, Virginia, PFC Ricardo G. Burgos, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 270 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Jeffery R. Kauffman-Baden, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and three specifications of obstruction of justice, and in violation of Articles 107, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 28 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Ralph F. Fox, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of damaging nonmilitary property, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of battery upon a child, in violation of

Articles 92, 109, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 132 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

### **Second Judicial Circuit**

On 03 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, a Private, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of abusive sexual contact, one specification of indecent exposure, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120, 120c, and 128, UCMJ.

On 10 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Robert W. Reading, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 111, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for 3 months, and to perform 30 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 11 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SFC Albert R. Elmore, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge of two specifications of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of assault consummated by battery, one specification of aggravated assault, and five specifications of child endangerment, in violation of Articles 92, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 10 months.

On 15 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGT Christopher R. Batissa, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of rape of a child, and two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 54 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 16 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SFC Ianclaire E. Mallari, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 17 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Gordon, Georgia, a Private, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 18 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Shawn E. Shaffer, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, four specifications of selling military property, and four specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 92, 108, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 23 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SFC Julian F. Colmeiro, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of dereliction of duty, and one specification of negligent discharge, in violation of Articles 92, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to perform 3 months of hard labor without confinement.

On 30 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ.

### **Third Judicial Circuit**

On 01 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, CW3 Derek C. Bartunek, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$1,162.00 pay per month for 2 months, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 01 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, SPC Nihan G. Johnnie, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her plea, of one specification of child endangerment, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 22 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 months.

On 10 September 2020, at a General Court-Martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, a Captain, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of wrongfully using a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 14 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Noah J. Krebs, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of false official statement, one specification of aggravated assault, and one

specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 90, 107, 128, and 131b, and 90, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of maiming, and seven specifications of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 128a, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be confined for 37 months, and to be discharged from service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, PVT Isaiah R. Highsmith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 112a, and 131b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of disobeying a noncommissioned officer, one specification of wrongful possession of a synthetic substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a synthetic substance, in violation of Articles 90, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 138 days, and to be discharged from service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 September 2020, at general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV2 a Private, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of three specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 24 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, 1LT Samuel B. Badders, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of fraternization, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 12 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 24 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV2 Jose A. Perez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 121 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Jose A. Munoz-Garcia, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

#### **Fourth Judicial Circuit**

On 03 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Jacob D. Seagrove, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to

his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by battery, and two specifications of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape, one specification of sexual assault, two specifications of assault consummated by battery, and three specifications of communicating a threat, in violation of Article 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 6 months.

On 03 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Colonel, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of one specification of abusive sexual contact, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 133, UCMJ.

On 08 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Johnathan R. Bush, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 08 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, MSG Dimitri L. Kearse, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of failure to report, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of dereliction of duty, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to forfeit \$1,500.00 pay per month for 4 months.

On 09 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, SPC Shane M. Kriete, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of ten specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Articles 112a, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 36 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 September 2020, at a General court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Jacob A. Quintana, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 18 months.

On 15 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SGT Angel M. Perez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant

to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct, in violation of Articles 92, 128b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 150 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Brandon J. Hoelle, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and two specifications of larceny of military property, in violation of Articles 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC William R. Parham, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of larceny, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 10 days.

On 18 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, CPT Hunter S. Hamilton, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of fraternization, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of eight specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be dismissed from the service.

On 18 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened, at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, MAJ Joseph H. Bowden III, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to a fine of \$800.00.

On 21 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, SGT Albert N. Yeboah, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of false official statement, two specifications of larceny of military property, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 107, 121, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 60 days.

On 25 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SSG Todd K. Greenhow, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of failure to report, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 86, and 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of false official statement, and one specification of

extramarital sexual conduct, in violation of Articles 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 days.

On 25 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC Nathan A. Fitzgerald, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Article 128, and Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days.

On 30 September 2020, at a general court-martial at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Juan G. Escobar, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant of his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 3 months.

### **Fifth Judicial Circuit**

On 09 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SSG Jason T. Lambert, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5, and to be confined for 2 months.

On 21 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SPC Maximiliano Torresmonsalve, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, one specification of larceny, and three specifications of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 120, 121, and 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of kidnapping, and two specifications of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 115, 125, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement reduced the discharge characterization from a dishonorable discharge to a bad-conduct discharge.

On 23 September 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, a Specialist, was acquitted by a panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of resisting apprehension, one specification of breach of the peace, one specification of simple assault, one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a person in the execution of law enforcement duties, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 87a, 116, 128, and 134 UCMJ.

On 30 September 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of rape, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.
