Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 1 April 2021, at a court-martial convened at Fort Eustis, Virginia, SSG Kendrick D. Robinson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of the following: two specifications of Failure to Obey a Regulation, two specifications of Cruelty and Maltreatment, and one specification of assault consummated by battery in violation of Articles 92, 93, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 152 days, reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 01 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Anthony Tait, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of rape of a child, two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a minor, in violation of Articles 120b and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the services with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

06 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Melvin Morel De Los Santos, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful distribution of lysergic acid diethylamide (LSD), one specification of wrongful possession of LSD, and one specification of wrongful possession of methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA) in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 14 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 07 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SFC Abdel Howard, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of battery upon his spouse in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to perform 1 month of hard labor without confinement. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 09 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PFC Philip Sola, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 14 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, LTC Robert M. Baba, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of Dereliction of Duty, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge of three specifications of Wrongful Possession of a Controlled Substance, and nine specifications of Larceny of Military Property, in violation of Articles 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of False Official Statement, in violation of Article 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be dismissed from the service.

16 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort George G. Meade, Maryland, SGT Nelson O. Rodriguez, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted rape by force, two specifications of rape by force, one specification of aggravated assault, one specification of assault consummated by battery and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 80, 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 36 months and to be dishonorably discharged.

On 16 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, SFC Gary Shuler, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of battery upon a child under the age of 16 or immediate family member in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of domestic violence-assault by strangulation in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded.

On 21 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, a Staff Sergeant United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of five specifications of sexual assault and three specifications of assault consummated by battery in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ.

On 23 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SGT Tony Collins, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, one specification of selling military property, two specifications of larceny, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of unlawful entry, in violation of Articles 107, 108, 121, 128, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 30 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Shane Edwards, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of seven specifications of sexual abuse of a child and one specification of rape of

a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 years and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 11 years.

On 29 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort George G. Meade, Maryland, SSG Damian E. Maldonado, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer in violation of Article 89, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, three specifications of cruelty and maltreatment, one specification of false official statement and one specification of indecent language, in violation of Articles 89, 90, 93, 107, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit \$1050.00 pay per month for 2 months and to perform hard labor without confinement for 2 months.

On 29 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC Jeremy Ramos, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful distribution of intimate visual images, one specification of wrongful distribution of a visual image of sexually explicit conduct, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 117a and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$500 a month for two months, and to be confined for 12 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 02 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, CPT Jeffery Butcher, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of abusive sexual contact, and three specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to 30 days confinement and to be dismissed from the Service.

On 9 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGM Quincy Martin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of failure to obey a lawful regulation and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 92 and 134, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of three specifications of maltreatment, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact in violation of Articles 93 and 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and to be confined for 6 months.

On 14 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Matthew Horton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery and one specification of aggravated assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 14 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 16 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Rucker, Alabama, SPC Yancy H. Reyes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of larceny and one specification of assault consummated by battery in violation of Articles 121 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 45 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 27 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Kevin Miles, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, one specification of indecent recording, and one specification of possession of child pornography in violation of Articles 120, 120c, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 100 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Justin Reaper, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of resisting apprehension, one specification of communicating a threat, two specifications of child endangerment, four specifications of aggravated assault upon a spouse or intimate partner, and four specifications of assault consummated by battery upon a spouse or intimate partner in violation of Articles 87a, 115, 119b, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 32 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 1 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at JBSA-Fort Sam Houston, Texas, PFC Noe A. Retana, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 1 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, PV2 Michael J. Rivera Leon, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a general order, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongfully distributing a controlled

substance, and one specification of violating a general order, in violation of Articles 92 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 52 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. A pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

On 1 April 2021, at a General Court-Martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SGT Antoni B. Frinkley, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempted unpremeditated murder, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of an offense not capital, in violation of Articles 80, 90, 92, 128, and 134, UCMJ. On 2 April 2021, the military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 22 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 6 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, 1LT Christopher E. Alfaro, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of false official statements, three specifications of fraternization and, one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 90, 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 100 days and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 6 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Ivan R. Juarez-Cid, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 07 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, PFC Adam T. Leathorn, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to commit sexual assault, one specification of conspiracy to obstruct justice, one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 81, 120, 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 4 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 694 days.

On 7 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, PV2 William E. Overs V, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to a dishonorable discharge, to be reduced in rank to E1, and to be confined for 40 months. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 07 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SGT Marquise T. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 20 days, and to receive a reprimand.

On 8 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SPC Piotr N. Lewis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of involuntary manslaughter, in violation of Article 119, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the Accused to be confined for 42 months, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 8 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Randall E. Tenijieth, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer and two specifications of battery upon a spouse in violation of Articles 90 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was found not guilty of one specification of reckless endangerment and two specifications of drunk and disorderly in violation of Article 114 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 08 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at JBSA-Fort Sam Houston, Texas, SSG Reginald L. Amos, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of aggravated assault, two specifications of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of child endangerment in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ.

On 12 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, a Staff Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of Failure to Obey A Lawful Order, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ.

On 13 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Travis L. Poole, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave and three specifications of wrongful appropriation in violation of Articles 86 and 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of nine specifications of larceny in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 95 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 22 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Andre Edwards, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in

violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 36 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 27 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Thomas Yopez, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 28 months and discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 30 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Brandon W. Cepeda, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of 2 specifications of sexual assault, and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 32 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 27 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at JBSA Fort Sam Houston, Texas, CPT Anthony D. Aponte, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of domestic violence and one specification of stalking, in violation of Article 128b and 130, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be dismissed from the service.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 01 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 02 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PFC Luis E. Leija, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of fleeing the scene of an accident, and one specification of driving under the influence of alcohol in violation of Articles 111 and 113, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 120 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct-discharge. A pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

On 2 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of aggravated assault and one specification of battery upon a child under the age of 16 in violation of Article 128, UCMJ.

On 7 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Kristopher D. Mauser, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of murder in violation of Article 118, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 7 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SSG Ronald C. Booth, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a general regulation and one specification of bigamy in violation of Articles 92 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of failure to obey a general regulation and of one specification of assault consummated by battery upon child under 16 years in violation of Articles 92 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and restricted to Fort Bliss for 2 months.

On 8 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, Warrant Officer One Monroe J. Staples, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conduct unbecoming of an officer and a gentleman in violation of Article 133, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be fined \$600.

On 8 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SGT Mariano Cerrud, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by battery in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault with intent to commit sexual assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. On 9 April 2021, the military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 46 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 12 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC Ruben A. Pagan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of conspiracy to wrongfully distribute marijuana and two specifications of failure to obey a lawful general regulation in violation of Articles 81 and 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 100 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. A pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

On 14 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SGT Febsonsmith A. Tara, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of destruction of personal property, one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of domestic assault in violation of Articles 109, 115, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 295 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-

conduct discharge. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 14 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SGT Eric M. Torness, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement and two specifications of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 107 and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 15 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual assault and one specification of assault on an intimate partner in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ.

On 15 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Brian M. Darden was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order from a commissioned officer, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 86, 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 60 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 16 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Symone T. Brown, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault by inflicting grievous bodily harm upon the spouse of the accused, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 16 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Jordan R. Payne, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to wrongfully distribute marijuana, one specification of making a false official statement, and one specification wrongful distribution of marijuana, in violation of Articles 81, 107, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1 and to be confined for 50 days. There was no pretrial agreement in this case.

On 16 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Korea, a Private (E-2), United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120 UCMJ.

On 17 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Zachary B. Craghead, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of four specifications of sexual assault and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 120 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of four specifications of sexual assault, one specification of indecent recording, one specification of distributing an indecent recording, two specifications of aggravated assault, one specification of communicating a threat, two specifications of extramarital conduct, and one specification of child pornography in violation of Articles 120, 120c, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for two years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 17 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, Captain Austin C. Otocky, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of larceny in violation of Article 121, Uniform Code of Military Justice. The military judge sentenced the accused to be fined \$700, with a recommendation to suspend \$500 of the adjudged fine for a period of 3 months.

On 20 April 2021, at a General court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC Colton T. Mellette, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of maiming in violation of Articles 128a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 12 years and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 21 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, CPT Justin A. Williams, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentlemen, in violation of Articles 128 and 133, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy to commit extortion, and one specification of extortion, in violation of Articles 81 and 127, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded.

On 21 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SPC Giovanni A. Caban, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance (LSD) and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance (LSD) with intent to distribute, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 22 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Demetrius T. White, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to

his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 90, 128, 128b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1 and to be confined for 121 days. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 23 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Terrel J. Haywood, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongfully stealing mail and two specifications of fraudulent use of credit cards, in violation of Articles 109a and 121a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 365 days, to pay the United States a fine of \$5,000.00 dollars, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 23 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of breaking quarantine and one specification of failing to obey a lawful order, in violation of Articles 84 and 90, UCMJ.

On 28 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SGT Nauvoo T. Faualo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of wrongful interference with an adverse administrative proceeding and one specification of giving a false official statement in violation of Articles 81 and 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongfully using marijuana in violation of Article 112a. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days, and to be reduced to E-4. A pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

On 29 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Staff Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of attempted rape, one specification of rape, one specification of aggravated sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 80, 120, and 128 UCMJ.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 2 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Caserma Ederle, Italy, SFC Kendall Gilbert, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wearing an unauthorized badge, one specification of signing a false official record, two specifications of assault consummated by battery and one specification of obstruction of justice in violation of Articles 106a, 107, 128, and 131b UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wearing an unauthorized badge, one specification of signing a false official record, three specifications of assault consummated by battery, and two specifications of child

endangerment in violation of article 106a, 107, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5 and to be confined for 180 days. The sentence was in accordance with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 23 April 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of breaking quarantine and one specification of failing to obey a lawful order, in violation of Articles 84 and 90, UCMJ.

On 8 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Vicenza, Italy, SSG Mitchell Bentley, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 15 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, a Private (E-2), United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 24 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of rape, two specifications of sexual assault, and one specification of aggravated assault in violation of articles 120 and 128, UCMJ.

On 29 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SGM Randall J. Clapham, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of violating a lawful order, and one specification of rape using force likely to cause death or grievous bodily harm in violation of Articles 92 and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of maltreatment, two specifications of abusive sexual contact, one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of assault consummated by battery in violation of Articles 93, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 30 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Kleber Kaserne, Germany, SFC Hector G. Irizarry, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of aggravated assault, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and two specifications of communicating a threat in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to

the grade of E-6, to forfeit \$1500.00 pay per month for 3 months, and to perform 90 days of hard labor without confinement.

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
