Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 1 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SSG Randy Harnath, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general order or regulation, and one specification of false official statement in violation of Articles 92 and 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of a violation of a lawful general order or regulation and one specification of wrongful interference with an adverse administrative proceeding in violation of Articles 92 and 131g, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to be reduced to the grade of E-4.

On 5 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SGT Jarrod C. Balch, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of cruelty and maltreatment in violation of Article 93, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for 6 months. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 8 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC Tucker Houston, United States Army, was convicted pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault resulting in substantial bodily harm and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 20 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SSG Kyle Stewart, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of disrespect toward a commissioned officer and one specification of drunk and disorderly in violation of Articles 89 and 134 UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 22 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SGT Charles N. Tutt, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of resisting apprehension, one specification of failing to obey a lawful regulation, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 87a, 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3 and to be confined for 90 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

October 2021

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 28 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PV1 Elan-Ray Anglin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey an order or regulation, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, four specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, one specification of burglary, one specification of larceny, and one specification of conduct of a nature to bring discredit upon the armed forces in violation of Articles 92, 112a, 121, 129, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 61 months, to forfeit all pay and allowances, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 1 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SSG Eduardo Ruiz Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery upon a child under the age of 16 years and one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon his spouse in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of assault upon his spouse in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to perform 60 days of hard labor without confinement, to be restricted to the limits of Fort Benning for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 2 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Haniel S. Ramocan-Reece, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of escaping from confinement, two specifications of willfully disobeying a commissioned officer, one specification of failing to obey a lawful order, one specification of communicating a threat, two specifications of assault consummated by battery upon a spouse, one specification of aggravated assault with a dangerous weapon, and three specifications of domestic violence in violation of Articles 87a, 90, 92, 115, 128, and 128b, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military panel composed of enlisted and officer members of one specification of desertion, one specification of failing to obey a lawful order, one specification of wrongfully destroying property not owned by the U.S. military, and one specification of assault consummated by battery upon a spouse in violation of Articles 85, 92, 109, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of child endangerment, one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of aggravated assault with a dangerous weapon in violation of Articles 119b, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

October 2021

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 7 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SFC Joshua Beasley, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of failure to obey order or regulation, one specification of aggravated sexual assault, and one specification of drunk and disorderly in violation of Articles 92, 120, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 15 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SSG Billie R. Collins, United States Army, was convicted by military panel composed of officer and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 19 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Christopher M. Villalobos, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of disrespecting a superior commissioned officer, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, two specifications of disrespecting a noncommissioned officer, two specifications of wrongfully using a controlled substance, two specifications of communicating a threat, and one specification of animal abuse in violation of Articles 89, 90, 91, 112a, 115, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 130 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 20 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Charvonte L. Gantt, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of fleeing apprehension, two specifications of willfully disobeying a lawful order from a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of assault consummated by battery in violation of Articles 87a, 90, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 175 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 26 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SFC Virginia M. Pieciak, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer and one specification of assault consummated by battery in violation of Articles 90 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6.

October 2021

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 27 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Tanner McLaughlin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, total forfeiture of pay, to be confined for 180 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 1 October 2021 at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Armando Lopez, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120 UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 46 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 8 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Private, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of rape in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 13 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, PV1 Romello D. Cade, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of seven specifications of failure to go to appointed place of duty, one specification of assault of a noncommissioned officer, one specification of disrespect toward a noncommissioned officer, two specifications of wrongful use of controlled substance, one specification of child endangerment, one specification of assault consummated by battery, one specification of battery upon a child under the age of 16, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct in violation of Articles 86, 91, 112a, 119b, 120b, 128, 128b, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault of a noncommissioned officer, one specification of child endangerment, and four specifications of sexual assault of a child in violation of Articles 91, 119b and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 662 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 15 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Julius Batts, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault, one specification of a violation of a lawful general regulation, and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Articles 80, 92, and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ. The

members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 21 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of three specifications of sexual assault of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ.

On 21 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 92 and 112a, UCMJ.

On 21 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Anthony Glaude, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement and one specification of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Articles 107 and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 38 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 28 months.

On 27 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Fauztin Desmonda, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of solicitation of the production of child pornography, three specifications of sexual assault of a child, five specifications of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of possession of child pornography in violation of Articles 82, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 14 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. A pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 1 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, a Master Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a Military Judge of two specifications of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of cruelty and maltreatment, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 92, 93, and 128, UCMJ.

On 2 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Toney E. Henderson, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of indecent conduct, one specification of rape of a child, one specification of assault consummated by battery upon his spouse, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of disorderly conduct in violation of Articles 120, 120b, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ.

October 2021

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 198 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 5 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PV1 Shawn S. Campbell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of indecent recording, one specification of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of assault upon a law enforcement officer in violation of Articles 120c and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 13 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PV1 Holden M. Modlin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute, two specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful introduction of controlled substances, and one specification of aggravated assault by strangulation in violation of Articles 112a and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of breach of medical quarantine, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of wrongful possession of controlled substances, one specification of rape, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 81, 84, 92, 112a, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 22 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 13 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, SPC Keaone A. Borja, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of distributing an indecent recording in violation of Article 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 2 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 14 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, PV1 Christopher S. McDonald, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of making false official statements and two specifications of wrongful possession and use of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 107 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeiture of \$400.00 per month for two months and to be confined for 70 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

October 2021

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 15 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PFC Skyler Stemen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of three specifications of wrongful introduction of controlled substances with intent to distribute, three specifications of wrongful distribution of controlled substances, and one specification of wrongful use of controlled substances in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 14 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, SGT Johntavious A. Walker, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and two specifications of aggravated assault in violation of Articles 115 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 15 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, Specialist Eric H. Horton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of aggravated assault with a dangerous weapon upon an intimate partner in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 10 months. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 18 October 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Curtis S. Olson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 19 October 2021, at a Special Court-Martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, PV2 Chris A. Garcia, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempt to distribute a controlled substance and two specifications of the wrongful use and possession of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 80 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 45 days, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

October 2021

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 20 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, a Private, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 20 October 2021, at a special court-martial consisting of military judge alone convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, MSG Joseph A. Bodenstein, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of larceny in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 35 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 22 October 2021, at a Special Court-Martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, PV1 Fabian M. Ramos, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer and one specification of the wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 90 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeitures of \$400 per month for two months and to be confined for 71 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 26 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SPC Sun T. Xiong, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child and one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 13 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 29 October 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, SPC Reilly S. Sherwin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful order and one specification of false official statement in violation of Articles 92 and 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3 and to be confined for 14 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

No courts-martial reported for the Fifth Judicial Circuit in the month of October 2021.
