Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 2 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of abusive sexual contact and one specification of simple assault in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ.

On 2 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PV2 Desmian Greer, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of false official statement in violation of Article 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault, two specifications of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1 and to perform 15 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 2 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SSG Daniel A. Dickey, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of failure to obey a general regulation, three specifications of failure to obey a general order, one specification of maltreatment, and two specifications of making a false official statement in violation of Articles 92, 93, and 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of failure to obey a general regulation, one specification of failure to obey a general order, one specification of maltreatment, eight specifications of false official statement, five specifications of abusive sexual contact, one specification of assault consummated by battery, one specification of assault with a dangerous weapon, and one specification of obstructing justice in violation of Articles 92, 93, 107, 120, 128, and 131b, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to forfeit two-thirds pay per month for three months, and to be reprimanded.

On 11 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SSG Angel Acosta, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of cruelty, oppression, or maltreatment of subordinates in violation of Article 93, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of cruelty, oppression, or maltreatment of subordinates, one specification of destroying personal property, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of obstruction of justice in violation of Articles 93, 109, 120, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4.

On 14 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SFC Eric W. Balkiz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of six specifications of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of prohibited activities with a military trainee by a person in a position of special trust, one specification of making a false official statement, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 92, 93a, 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and to be confined for 121 days. The sentence was consistent with terms of a pretrial agreement.

March 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 17 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PV1 James Bryson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance and one specification of indecent language communicated to a child in violation of Articles 112a and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 37 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 25 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Joshua Falbe, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded.

On 30 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC Joseph Cook, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful use of controlled substance, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer in violation of Articles 90, 112a, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 190 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 31 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SGT Charles K. Shepherd, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of possessing child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 420 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 2 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Gary L. Goins, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault of a child, three specifications of sexual abuse of a child involving sexual contact, one specification of sexual abuse of a child involving indecent communication, one specification of violating a general order, and one specification of obstructing justice in violation of Articles 92, 120b, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 42 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

March 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 3 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PV1 Tyler J. Monroe, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance and three specifications of assault consummated by a battery and in violation of Articles 112a and 128, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted of three specifications of aggravated assault, ten specifications of assault consummated by a battery, two specifications of domestic violence, two specifications of kidnapping, and one specification of obstruction of justice in violation of Articles 128, 128b 125, 131b, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of aggravated assault in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 120 months and 15 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 9 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Staff Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of abusive sexual contact and two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 14 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Jacob A. Dickerson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of dereliction in the performance of his duties and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 92 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 75 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 16 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Rucker, Alabama, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of six specifications of sexual assault and eight specifications of cruelty and maltreatment in violation of Articles 93 and 120, UCMJ.

On 18 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGM Travis Alfred, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of wrongfully and willfully discharging a firearm under circumstances such as to endanger human life in violation of Article 114, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of communicating a threat and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 115 and 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of communicating a threat, three specifications of assault, and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 115, 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-7 and to be confined for 12 months.

March 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 22 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Martin Turrubiarres Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of conspiracy in violation of Article 81, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 100 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 25 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Matthew S. Turner, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a regulation, one specification of wrongfully manufacturing a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongfully possessing a controlled substance, and one specification of larceny of government property in violation of Articles 112a, 92 and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 25 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, CW2 Jonathan K. Cunningham, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers of one specification of making a false official statement, one specification sexual abuse of a child involving indecent communication, and one specification of wrongful interference with an adverse administrative proceeding in violation of Articles 107, 120b, and 131g, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be dismissed from the service.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 1 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SFC Antrone S. Vaughn, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon an intimate partner in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of communicating a threat and three specifications of assault consummated by a battery upon an intimate partner in violation of Articles 115 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6, to forfeit \$2,000 pay for 3 months, and to be confined for 10 days.

On 1 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, SSG Andre I. Gonzalez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a general regulation and one specification of false official statement in violation of Articles 92 and 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of violating a general regulation, one specification of conspiracy to obstruct justice, and two specifications of obstructing justice in violation of Articles 92, 81, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

March 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 2 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Kyle G. Burris, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 4 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Private First Class, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 7 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Zane A. Marek, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of larceny in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of larceny in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 25 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 9 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of two specifications of aggravated assault in violation of 128b, UCMJ.

On 9 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, SPC Gustavo Benitez-Vasquez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of committing a lewd act upon a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of four specifications of attempting a lewd act upon a child in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 16 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 10 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, MSG John T. Long, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of sexual assault of a child in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault of a child in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

March 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 11 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Jade Johnson, United States Army, was convicted by an enlisted panel, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact and two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 11 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Sergeant First Class, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of abusive sexual contact, one specification of indecent exposure, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 92, 120, 120c, and 128, UCMJ.

On 17 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, PFC Sean Rymer, United States Army, was convicted by an enlisted panel, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault and two specifications of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The panel sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,440.00 pay per month for 3 months, to be reprimanded, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 22 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, PV2 Ashley N. Price, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of malingering, five specifications of failure to go to her appointed place of duty, one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, four specifications of willfully disobeying a commissioned officer, and one specification of disorderly conduct in violation of Articles 83, 86, 89, 90, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 40 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 22 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, SGT Brooke Williams, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance and two specifications of child endangerment in violation of Articles 112a and 119b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of being absent without leave and two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 86 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a pretrial agreement.

March 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 24 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV1 Richard A. Roel, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failing to go to his appointed place of duty, one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of assault consummated by a batter, and one specification of disorderly conduct in violation of Articles 86, 89, 90, 115, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 10 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 24 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Justin A. Pickens, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of making a false official statement and two specifications of larceny in violation of Articles 107 and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 108 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 25 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV2 Weston E. Bloom, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 30 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, PV2 Kentrell M. Luckett, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 10 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 3 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Eric D. Williams, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1 and to be confined for 150 days.

On 2 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Saquan M. Butler, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongfully communicating a threat, two specifications of willful and wrongful destruction of private property, and one specification of domestic violence by strangulation in violation of Articles 109 and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 155 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

March 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 2 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Duy D. Dinh, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, three specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute, and one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance with intent to distribute in violation of Articles 92 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 3 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SFC Kristofer P. Reynolds, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of violating a lawful general regulation and one specification of drunkenness in violation of Articles 92 and 134 UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of maltreatment, one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Articles 93 and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5.

On 3 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, PV1 Ellic B. Trimble, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of obstruction of justice in violation of Articles 112a and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 180 Days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 4 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Miguel Arroyo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful attempt to distribute child pornography and one specification of wrongful possession of child pornography in violation of Articles 80 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 540 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 10 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Chandler A. Suire, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general order, one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, one specification of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of underage drinking in violation of Articles 92, 113, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 121 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

March 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 11 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PV2 Moises Ortega, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of insubordinate conduct toward a noncommissioned officer, one specification of aggravated assault, and three specifications of assault upon a military policeman in the execution of their duties in violation of Articles 91 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 345 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 11 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SFC Jamel Walker, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of providing a false official statement, one specification of rape, and one specification of aggravated sexual contact in violation of Articles 107 and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of maltreatment in violation of Article 93, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 5 years and 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 11 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Korea, a Sergeant First Class, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 22 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC David S. Parler, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 22 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SGT Jesse A. Westbrook, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle resulting in bodily injury in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 200 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Anthony Allred, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of rape, one specification of sexual assault, one specification of rape of a child, one specification of battery on a child under the age of 16, and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 120, 120b, 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of rape, two specifications of sexual assault, one specification of battery on a child under the age of 16, and two specifications of domestic violence in violation of Articles 115, 120, 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 21 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

March 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 25 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, PV2 Brandon B. Anthony, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 38 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 28 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, PFC Samuel H. Quiroz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to obstruct justice, one specification of false official statement, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 81, 107, 112a, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 340 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 29 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Tyler K. McKnight, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to wrongfully distribute a controlled substance, one specification of conspiracy to wrongfully manufacture a controlled substance, one specification of the wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and one specification of the wrongful manufacture of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 81 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 29 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, PV2 Matthew P. White, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of wrongfully introducing a controlled substance, one specification of wrongfully possessing a controlled substance, one specification of wrongfully using a controlled substance, one specification of wrongfully distributing a controlled substance, and one specification of conspiracy in violation of Articles 81 and 112a, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of wrongfully introducing a controlled substance, one specification of wrongfully possessing a controlled substance, one specification of wrongfully distributing a controlled substance, and one specification of obstruction of justice in violation of Articles 81, 112a, 131b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted introduction of a controlled substance and one specification of wrongfully distributing pictures and videos of his drug use in violation of Articles 80 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 25 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 9 March 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, SGT Kiara N. Williams, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to violate a general order and two specifications of violation of a general order in violation of Articles 81 and 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 15 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 15 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, a Sergeant First Class, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of attempted indecent recording and two specifications of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Articles 80 and 120b, UCMJ.

On 30 March 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, SSG Jorge L. Espinal, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of forgery, one specification of false official statement, and one specification of larceny of military property of a value of more than \$1,000 in violation of Articles 105, 107, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 120 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.
