**Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

**First Judicial Circuit**

On 5 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC Robert Lundsten, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault by causing bodily harm and four specifications of domestic violence in violation of Articles 120 and 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape and one specification of animal abuse in violation of Articles 120 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 25 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 6 May 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, 2LT Zachery L. Massey, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance and one specification of assault consummated by battery upon a spouse in violation of Articles 112a and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 14 days and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 6 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, MSG Paul Casiano, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of seven specifications of violation of a general order, one specification of distribution of an intimate visual image, two specifications of wrongful interference with an adverse administrative proceeding, one specification of extramarital sexual conduct, and three specifications of indecent conduct in violation of Articles 92, 117a, 131g, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 80 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 9 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Dawson Vancil, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of attempted sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 150 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 11 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Meade, Maryland, SPC Francis R. Enow Besong, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of assault consummated by battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

## **May 2022**

### **Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

On 17 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SSG Phillip A. Floyd, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of attempted indecent recording and three specifications of indecent recording in violation of Articles 80 and 120c, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of attempted indecent viewing in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 19 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, CW2 Sina Aroum, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of making a false official statement and two specifications of wrongfully selling military property in violation of Articles 107 and 108, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$2,843.00 pay per month for 3 months. The sentence was consistent with the terms of his plea agreement.

On 24 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SSG Cesar Abanto, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of dereliction of duty and one specification of reckless endangerment in violation of Articles 92 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and to be confined for 95 days. A pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

### **Second Judicial Circuit**

On 5 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV2 Oscar A. Batres, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault and one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon an intimate partner in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 46 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 6 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Panashe Ncube, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

**May 2022**

**Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

On 12 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV1 Cha Sepulveda, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 21 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 13 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Noah P. Hulihan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of abusive sexual contact and two specifications of sexual assault of a child in violation of Articles 120 and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 84 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 17 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG David A. Rankine, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of disobeying a lawful order, two specifications of wrongfully using a controlled substance, one specification of wrongfully importing a controlled substance, one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 92, 112a, 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 5 years and 1 month, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 19 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PV1 Alexander M. Wilson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 4 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 19 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, a First Lieutenant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of committing conduct of a nature to bring discredit upon the armed forces in violation Article 134, UCMJ.

On 24 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SSG Christian N. Segovia, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of maltreatment in violation of Article 93, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

## **May 2022**

### **Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

On 25 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, PV1 Jose I. Ramirez Del-Villar, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy in violation of Article 81, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 27 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Rucker, Alabama, SPC Hannah Deese, United States Army, was convicted by a military Judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be confined for 121 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 31 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, PV1 Erik D. Medina, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of aggravated assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 18 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

### **Third Judicial Circuit**

On 2 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, CPT Robin A. Morales, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of larceny of military property of a value less than \$1,000.00, and one specification of false official statement in violation of Articles 81, 121, and 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 75 days, and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 16 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SSG Nicholas J. Crayne, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of solicitation, three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, three specifications of wrongfully distributing a controlled substance, one specification of wrongfully possessing a controlled substance, and one specification of receipt of stolen property in violation of Articles 82, 112a, and 122a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

**May 2022**

**Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

On 6 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base San Antonio–Fort Sam Houston, Texas, a Sergeant First Class, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of two specifications of violating a lawful general regulation, and one specification of maltreatment of subordinates in violation of Articles 92 and 93, UCMJ.

On 6 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SFC Jeremiah R. Pierce was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to steal military property of a value of more than \$1,000.00 and one specification of larceny of military property of a value of more than \$1,000.00 in violation of Articles 81 and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 7 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 14 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SSG Daniel D. Herman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement and six specifications of wrongful broadcast of intimate visual images in violation of Articles 107 and 117a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of failing to obey an order or regulation and one specification of wrongful broadcast of intimate visual images in violation of Articles 92 and 117a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 13 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 16 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base San Antonio–Fort Sam Houston, Texas, CPT Derek T. Witteman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of larceny in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 17 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, SSG Dillon P. Humphreys, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault upon his intimate partner in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3 and to be confined for 60 days.

On 19 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Kyle E. Garman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse and one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child under 16 years in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

## **May 2022**

### **Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

On 20 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SSG Kevin J. Caraballo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of engaging in prohibited activity with a military trainee by a person in position of special trust in violation of Article 93a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 14 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 23 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, PFC Joshua S. Heartsill, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully and wrongfully damaging property other than military property and two specifications of domestic violence in violation of Articles 109 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 15 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 24 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Private (E-1), United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of rape of a child and two specifications of sexual assault of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ.

### **Fourth Judicial Circuit**

On 4 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PV1 Tyler K. Howard, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of strangulation, and one specification of aggravated assault on a child in violation of Articles 107 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 93 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 4 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Maleik D. Dubose, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

## May 2022

### Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 4 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, PV2 Franklin M. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 1 month, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 4 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, 1LT Adalberto Brinkman-Coronel, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a minor, one specification of absent without leave, one specification of possession of child pornography, three specifications of distribution of child pornography and one specification of indecent language in violation of Articles 80, 86, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 years and 10 days and to be dismissed from the service.

On 6 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Chas E. Phillips, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of wrongfully communicating a threat and three specifications of battery upon a spouse in violation of Articles 115 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 40 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 11 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, PFC Christopher A. Oen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of soliciting the production and distribution of child pornography, three specifications of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of receiving and viewing child pornography in violation of Articles 82, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 33 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 12 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, Aaronkyle C. Martos, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child involving indecent communication in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted viewing and producing child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 months and 25 days and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

**May 2022**

**Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

On 12 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SFC Richard T. Riddle, United States Army, was convicted, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted assault consummated by a battery upon an intimate partner and one specification of communicating a threat in violation of Articles 80 and 115, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon an intimate partner, and one specification of unlawful entry in violation of Articles 90, 115, 128, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6, to forfeit \$2149.00 pay per month for 1 months, and to perform 10 days of hard labor without confinement. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 12 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, MSG Matthew H. Dine, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 12 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, PV2 Matthew P. White, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of wrongfully possessing a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongfully using a controlled substance in violation of Articles 90 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1 and to be confined for 70 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 12 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC James C. Bionaz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 670 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 13 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SSG Alexander Torres, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of disrespect of a warrant officer, one specification of disrespect of a noncommissioned officer, and one specification of failure to obey a lawful order in violation of Articles 91 and 92, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to a forfeiture of \$1,941 pay per month for 6 months and to perform 40 days of hard labor without confinement.

**May 2022**

**Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

On 14 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, MSG Matthew H. Dine, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of failing to obey a lawful order in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days.

On 18 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Austin B. Garrigus, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of domestic violence by strangulation in violation of Articles 120 and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 665 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 18 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, MAJ Kenneth A. Slezak, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to be restricted for two months.

On 19 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, SSG Daniel J. Valdez, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, one specification of disrespect toward a superior noncommissioned officer, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery of his spouse in violation of Articles 86, 89, 90, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of failure to report, one specification of disrespect of a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of willfully disobeying an order by a superior commissioned officer in violation of Articles 86, 89, and 90, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5 and to perform 30 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 20 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SGT Ruben Sanchez Agosto, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to a fine of \$1,000. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 21 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SSG Kyle W. Burreson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault inflicting grievous bodily harm to a child under the age of 16 years and one specification of conduct of a nature to bring discredit upon the armed forces in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of 5 specifications of aggravated assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ.

## May 2022

### Summarized Report of Results of Trial

The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 9 years, and to receive a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 24 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, PV1 John Christopher IV, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of two specifications of wrongfully using a controlled substance in violation of Articles 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$300 pay per month for 2 months and to be confined for 21 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 24 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, PV2 Christopher E. Sperow, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, three specifications of sexual abuse of a child involving indecent communication, four specifications of sexual abuse of a child involving indecent exposure, nine specifications of extortion, one specification of solicitation to produce and distribute child pornography, three specifications of distribution of child pornography, one specification of indecent communication, one specification of production of child pornography, and one specification of communicating a threat in violation of Articles 86, 120b, 127, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 22 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 9 years.

On 25 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PV1 Laavon D. Owens, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 15 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 25 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Antonio Galvan IV, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of accessory after the fact in violation of Article 78, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 26 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, SPC Anthony D. Cabanillas, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault on a superior commissioned officer, one specification of willfully disobeying a noncommissioned officer, one specification of leaving the scene of a vehicle accident, one specification of drunken or reckless operation of a vehicle, and one specification of reckless endangerment in violation of Articles 89, 91, 111, 113, and 114, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused

to be reduced to the grade of E-2, to forfeit \$1,000 pay per month for 5 months, to perform 40 days of hard labor, and to be confined for 80 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 26 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SGT Rene D. Alfaro, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation and three specifications of sexual assault in violation of Articles 92 and 120, UCMJ. The accused was sentenced to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

### **Fifth Judicial Circuit**

On 2 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, SPC Nicholas D. Amador, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of simple assault and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 128 and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 2 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, SPC Nicholas D. Amador, United States Army was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of simple assault and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 128 and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 6 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Wiesbaden, Germany, PV2 Trevon K. Coley, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of failing to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of manslaughter, and one specification of aggravated assault in violation of Articles 81, 92, 119, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of leaving the scene of an accident and one specification of murder in violation of Articles 111 and 118, UCMJ. The accused was sentenced by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 years, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

**Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

On 11 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault, two specifications of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 120 and 128b, UCMJ.

On 13 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, SPC Ethan H. Kibler, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of failing to obey a lawful order, two specifications of domestic violence, and one specification of destroying non-military property in violation of Articles 86, 92, 128b, and 109, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongfully communicating a threat and one specification of assault in violation of Articles 115 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 290 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 20 May 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, SPC Ronald Bellan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault on a superior noncommissioned officer, one specification of disrespecting a noncommissioned officer, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 91 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2 and to be confined for 55 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 24 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SPC Tayron D. Davis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted sexual assault in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 120 days and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 31 May 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.
