Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 5 March 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, PFC Christopher Beckman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance and two specifications of possession with intent to distribute a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$250.00 pay per month for 3 months, to be confined for 150 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 9 March 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SGT Gaige M. Caward, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general order in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of violating a lawful general order and two specifications of maltreatment of a subordinate in violation of Articles 92 and 93, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2 and to perform 60 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 15 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC Steven A. Navarro, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of fifteen specifications of rape of a child, two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, three specifications of possession of child pornography, and six specifications of production of child pornography in violation of Articles 120b and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 35 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 16 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PV2 Daniel E. Alegria, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion and one specification of absence without leave in violation of Articles 85 and 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Additional March 2021 to November 2021

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 18 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Lesley J. McNair, District of Columbia, a Colonel, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 30 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SSG Randall S. Hughes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of rape, one specification of sexual abuse of a child, one specification of indecent language, one specification of adultery, one specification of solicitation, and three specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 120, 120b, 128 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, ten specifications of sexual assault, three specifications of assault, one specification of indecent conduct with a child, two specifications of obstruction of justice, one specification of kidnapping, and two specifications of adultery in violation of Articles 112a, 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be to be confined for 165 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 18 April 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, 1LT Justin R. Miller, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of false official statement, two specifications of conduct unbecoming an officer, and one specification of fraternization in violation of Articles 92, 107, 133 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 3 June 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, a Private First Class, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of child endangerment and four specifications of aggravated assault on a child under the age of sixteen years in violation of Articles 119b and 128, UCMJ.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 3 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV1 Kelvin T. Winfield, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of destroying or damaging nonmilitary property and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 109 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted kidnapping, one specification of fleeing apprehension, one specification of disobeying a lawful order, one specification of overindulgence in intoxicating liquor or drugs, one specification of assault, and one specification of unlawful entry in violation of Articles 80, 87a, 92, 112, 128, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Additional March 2021 to November 2021

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 12 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SSG Terry Montgomery, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of aggravated assault and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of aggravated assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 16 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Walter J. Banks, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 25 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 26 March 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV1 Michael F. Dunn III, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to perform 90 days of hard labor, to be confined for 120 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 30 March 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SSG Quincy Ottley, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted indecent visual recording and one specification of indecent visual recording in violation of Articles 80 and 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 31 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PVT Jason Fry, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted indecent visual recording and one specification of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Articles 80 and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 11 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 9 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, PVT Shane C. Portner, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of attempted fraudulent use of an access device and one specification of making a false official statement in violation of Articles 80 and 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 270 days, to forfeit

all pay and allowances, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 10 March 2021, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, PV1 Philip J. Monticello, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of fraudulent use of an access device and one specification of attempted use of an access device in violation of Articles 80 and 121a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 90 days, to forfeit \$1190 pay per month for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 24 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, PV2 Ryan Q. Locklear, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault and of one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days.

On 24 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, MAJ Travis Reisner, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault upon a commissioned officer in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 45 days and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 24 March 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, SPC Morris C. Comia, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of indecent recording in violation of Article 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 15 November 2021, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Air Field, Hawaii, PFC Felipe Macias III, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted sexual assault and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 80 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$500 pay per month for 2 months and to perform 2 months of hard labor without confinement.
