First Judicial Circuit

On 19 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at West Point, New York, SFC Robert J. Dominguez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of false official statement and one specification of reckless endangerment in violation of Articles 107 and 114, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 months.

On 27 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PV2 Elijah N. Jeffers, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of viewing child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 35 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 28 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Alejandro Rodriguez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 14 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. A pre-trial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 8 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SFC Sean M. Garrad, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a spouse, one specification of aggravated assault upon a spouse, and one specification of aggravated assault with an unloaded firearm upon a spouse in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 18 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of cruelty and maltreatment in violation of Article 93, UCMJ.

On 15 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, PV2 Tristan W. Presley, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of wrongful possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of committing a lewd act with a child and two specifications of production of child pornography in violation of Articles 120b and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 16 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 25 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SPC Reese Day, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 120 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 25 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of disobeying a lawful command in violation of Article 91, UCMJ.

On 25 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, CPL Kaleel Simmonds, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of domestic violence against his spouse in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3 and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 26 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV1 Alexis B. Ricketts, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer and one specification of domestic violence against her spouse in violation of Articles 90 and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 27 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PV2 Trent M. Morlock, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 90 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1 and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

July 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 28 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, SFC Joshua Vaughan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault and four specifications of domestic violence in violation of Articles 128 and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 8 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Andrea Ramirez, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to her pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to manufacture a controlled substance with intent to distribute, one specification of conspiracy to distribute a controlled substance, and one specification of false official statement in violation of Articles 81 and 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful manufacture of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Articles 90, 112a, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 18 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, SPC Nathaniel J. Davis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of conspiracy to commit robbery with a dangerous weapon in violation of Article 81, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 20 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV1 Reginald Gleaton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 15 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 21 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SSG William E. Waters, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of violating a general regulation and four specifications of assault upon a child under the age of 16 in violation of Articles 92 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

July 2022

On 28 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 2 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Raymond A. Price, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of simple assault with an unloaded firearm, four specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and two specifications of domestic violence in violation of Articles 128 and 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, three specifications of domestic violence, and one specification of adultery in violation of Articles 128, 128b, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 11 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SGT Adam T. Reyes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of soliciting distribution of child pornography, two specifications of receiving child pornography, two specifications of distributing child pornography, and two specifications of possession of child pornography in violation of Articles 82 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 34 months, to forfeit all pay and allowances, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 14 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Malik J. Wiley, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of insubordinate conduct toward noncommissioned officers, two specifications of communicating a threat, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of disorderly conduct in violation of Articles 91, 115, 128b, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of damage of non-military property in violation of Article 109, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 80 days.

On 18 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, PFC Deonte F. Cannon, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of larceny, one specification of domestic violence, one specification of burglary, and one specification of receiving child pornography in violation of Articles 90, 121, 128b, 129, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongfully soliciting child pornography, one specification child endangerment, two specifications of committing a lewd act,

and four specifications of domestic violence in violation of Articles 82, 119b, 120b, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 790 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 21 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Alberto Esparza, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of solicitation of production of child pornography, one specification of possession of child pornography, one specification of distribution of child pornography, and two specifications of receipt of child pornography in violation of Articles 82 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 48 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 22 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Delcarlo McCullough, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to report, five specifications of willfully disobeying the order of a superior commissioned officer, two specifications of willfully disobeying a noncommissioned officer, one specification of disrespecting a noncommissioned officer in the execution of his office, and one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle in violation of Articles 86, 90, 91, and 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 99 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 26 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, SSG David B. Ortiz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of four specifications of sexual assault of a child, one specification of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of assault in violation of Articles 120b and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 10 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 27 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Charles Gwinn, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of distributing a controlled substance and one specification of wrongfully using a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 180 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

July 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 27 July 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, a Private, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of rape and one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 13 July 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SPC Carlos Jimenez-Sarmiento, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of resisting apprehension and one specification of provoking speech and gestures in violation of Articles 87a and 117, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 121 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.
