SUBJECT: Authorized Heraldry for the U.S. Army Medical Readiness Command, East

1. As a result of the redesignation of the Regional Health Command, Atlantic to the U.S. Army Medical Readiness Command, East, the following heraldic items are redesignated effective 14 April 2022:

a. A distinctive unit insignia:

(1) **Originally approved** for the Northern Regional Medical Command on 17 December 2012.

(2) **Redesignated** effective 01 October 2016 for the US Army Regional Health Command, Atlantic with symbolism updated.

b. A distinguishing flag IAW TIOH Drawing No. 5-1-0777.

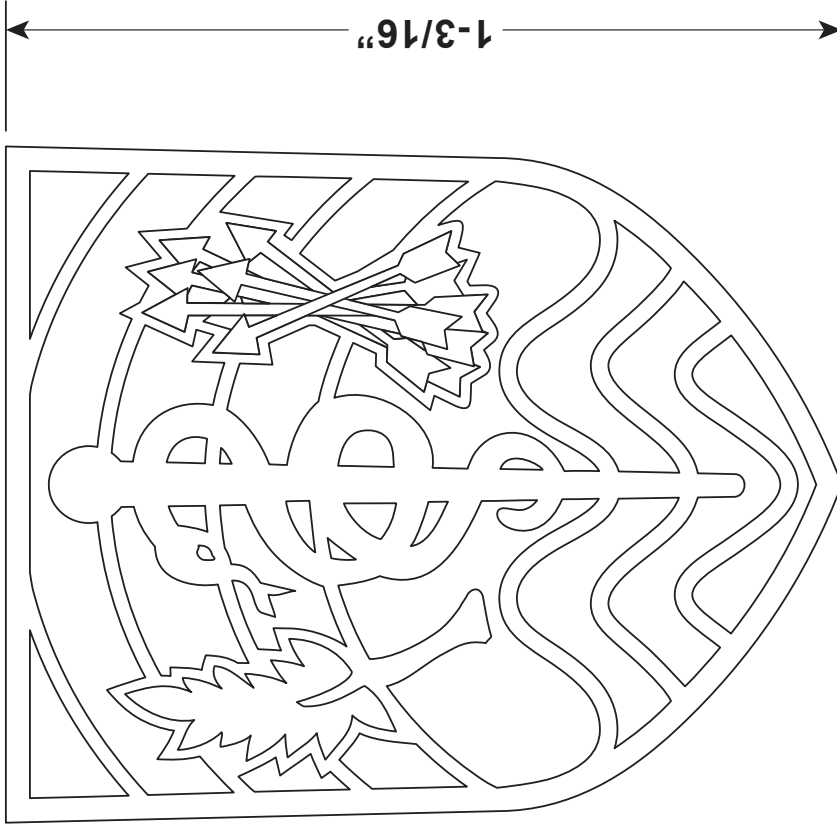

## MEDICAL READINESS COMMAND, EAST UNITED STATES ARMY



### DISTINCTIVE UNIT INSIGNIA

**Description.** A silver metal and epoxied shield shaped device 1-3/16 inch (3.02 cm) in height blazoned as follows: Argent, two arches Azure and Gules in chief, an in base barry wavy of three of the second, between an olive branch Vert in dexter and a bundle of seven arrows Or in sinister, a Rod of Aesculapius entwined with a serpent in base Argent (Silver) eyed Vert.

**Symbolism.** The white field in the background represents the purity of intention in supporting the treatment of wounded, ill and injured soldiers, as well as the medical environment. The red, white, and blue colors refer to the colors of the United States, and are arranged in a rainbow to represent the hope of the patients and their families under the Command's care. The Rod of Aesculapius is a historic symbol of the medical profession. The olive branch symbolizes peace and the thirteen leaves denoting the thirteen original colonies. The bundle of seven arrows represents the seven Medical Treatment Facilities under the Command. Together, they refer to the duty of the Command to oversee the service members' treatment during both war and peace. The undulating water refers to the Atlantic Ocean and the Great Lakes which border the region.

**Background.** The distinctive unit insignia was originally approved for the Northern Regional Medical Command on 17 December 2012. It was redesignated effective 1 October 2016, for the US Army Regional Health Command, Atlantic with the symbolism updated. It was redesignated 14 April 2022 for the Medical Readiness Command, East.

Building 2264, Joint Base San Antonio (JBSA)-Fort Sam Houston, TX 78234

Mission: Ensure delivery of healthcare services for eligible beneficiaries within assigned area of  
responsibility within MEDCOM. Provide regional support to Medical Department Activities  
(MEDDAC), Medical Centers (MEDCEN), Dental Health Commands (DHC), Public Health  
Commands (PHC), and branches, and sections at levels equivalent to the support provided to  
a dental or medical activity by the collocated MEDCEN, MEDDAC, or health clinic.

Effective date: 1 October 2022

Additional instructions:

(a) Unit and personnel files/records will be maintained and disposed of in accordance with  
AR 25-400-2.

(b) This unit redesignation was authorized by the U.S. Army Center of Military History. The  
authorization documentation for this action should be retained in the organization's historical  
files as outlined in Military History: Responsibilities, Policies and Procedures (AR 870-5).

(c) Unit organization and manpower structure will be documented on the MRC, East  
(W07TAA) FY23 TDA.

(d) Logistical support will be provided by MEDCOM (W3VYAA).

(e) The Commanding General, Military District of Washington (MDW), serves as the  
General Court-Martial Convening Authority (GCMCA) for MRC, East (W07TAA). The  
Uniform Code of Military Justice (UCMJ) structure and general administration of military justice  
is established by the GCMCA via separate documentation as authorized by AR 27-10, Military  
Justice.

(f) Commander will ensure coordination with the appropriate servicing civilian personnel  
support offices to complete labor obligations (if applicable) and to effect any necessary changes  
in appropriate civilian personnel data and pay systems to update civilian personnel and pay  
records.

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(g) In accordance with Chapter 5 of AR 600-8-6, Personnel Accounting and Strength Reporting, a Personnel Asset Inventory will be conducted NLT 14 calendar days prior to unit reorganization/redesignation.
