First Judicial Circuit

On 3 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SGT Daniel D. Pulley, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 11 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 14 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at the U.S. Military Academy in West Point, New York, CDT Noah Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of six specifications of possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 48 months, and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 17 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of maltreatment of a subordinate and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Articles 93 and 120, UCMJ.

On 20 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PV2 Wyatt Harbaugh, United States Army, was convicted, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of indecent language to a child, two specifications of committing a lewd act with a child, one specification of producing child pornography, and three specifications of possessing child pornography in violation of Articles 120b and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 49 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 20 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SSG Alexander Parris, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to violate a lawful general order, two specifications of violating a lawful general order, one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of obstruction of justice, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 81, 92, 131b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 120 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

October 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 25 October 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SGT Joshua Franklin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation and one specification of dereliction of duty in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 3 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 4 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Ozzie Alvarez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 25 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 5 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, 2LT Marcus J. Mitchell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of failure to report, one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, and one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation in violation of Articles 86, 89, and 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 6 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Derrick Chester, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault of a child, one specification of producing child pornography, and one specification of receiving child pornography in violation of Articles 120b and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for thirty months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 6 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SGT Suguru L. Saito, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of viewing child pornography and one specification of possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 60 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 12 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, a Private First Class, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of sexual assault and one specification of kidnapping in violation of Articles 120 and 125, UCMJ.

On 14 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of two specifications of committing a lewd act upon a child and one specification of battery upon a child under the age of 16 in violation of Articles 120b and 128, UCMJ.

On 19 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Zackery Wilcox, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be discharged from service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 19 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SSG Jeron Jarrett, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 20 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGT Edward T. McTear, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted sexual assault in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 25 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC James Gibbs, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 15 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 26 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Rucker, Alabama, a Captain, United States Army, was acquitted of three specifications of aggravated sexual abuse of a child, one specification of abusive sexual contact with a child, and six specifications of battery upon a child under the age of 16 in violation of Articles 120b and 128, UCMJ.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 3 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, SPC Louis E. Charland, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of violating a lawful general order, seven specifications of wrongfully distributing a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongfully possessing a controlled substance,

one specification of wrongfully manufacturing a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongfully using a controlled substance in violation of Articles 81, 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 3 October 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Zachary Patterson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion and one specification of wrongfully using a controlled substance in violation of Articles 85 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 62 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 6 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Jonathan C. Anthony, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 92 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3 and to be confined for 30 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 8 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, PFC Jacob Singletary, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members of one specification of attempted rape of a child and three specifications of committing a lewd act upon a child in violation of Articles 80 and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit of all pay and allowances, to be confined for 66 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 13 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC William A. Webster, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1 and to be confined for 274 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 14 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of two specifications of domestic violence in violation of 128b, UCMJ.

On 15 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SFC Terrance Brown, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of attempt to commit a lewd act upon a child in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child and one specification of attempted use of interstate commerce to persuade and coerce a minor to travel to engage in sexual activity in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 28 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 19 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 19 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Andrew R. Taylor, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of disrespecting a superior commissioned officer, two specifications of disobeying a lawful command, and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 89, 90, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 167 days, to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 20 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Jonathan E. Soto, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of obstructing justice in violation of Article 131b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of failure to obey an order, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of sexual assault in violation of Articles 92 and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 35 days.

On 21 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of sexual assault of a child in violation of Articles 120b, UCMJ.

On 22 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, a Sergeant First Class, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of three specifications of abusive sexual contact, two specifications of sexual assault, three specifications of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of indecent viewing in violation of Articles 120, 120b, and 120c, UCMJ.

October 2022

On 25 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, MAJ Joseph Esquivel, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, four specifications of making a false official statement, three specifications of patronizing a prostitute, two specifications of extramarital sexual conduct, and two specifications of adultery in violation of Articles 92, 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to be confined for 155 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 26 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Charles M. O'Neill, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of indecent language in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 121 days, and to be discharged from the service with bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 27 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Joshua R. Mabins, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 25 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 28 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC Trenton W. Orr, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Articles 80 and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 26 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 28 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, 1LT Marcus Rodholm, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of indecent recording in violation of Article 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

October 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 28 October 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Trinidad J. Valsquez, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 112a and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, to be confined for 150 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with terms of a plea agreement.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 6 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault, one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ.

On 13 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, PFC Joseph C. Hallinan, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 14 October 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SGT Antonio Cruz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 180 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 26 October 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, SPC Marc G. Denz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongfully damaging property other than military property and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 109 and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.
