First Judicial Circuit

On 2 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, a Master Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of dereliction of duty in violation of Article 92, UCMJ.

On 3 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SGT Anthony Kirby, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 50 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 10 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort McNair, Washington, D.C., SFC Hunter Knight, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of violation of a lawful order, four specifications of domestic violence, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 92, 128b, and 134, UCMJ. A military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and to be confined for 60 days.

On 10 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, a First Lieutenant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 10 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, CPT Mawil Gomez-Valerio, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

November 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 17 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PV1 Dominic Diaz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 15 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, SSG Kalah U. Wilson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of violating a lawful general order in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$1,500.00 per month for 3 months, to be fined \$2,000.00, to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 21 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 30 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort McNair, Washington, DC, SPC Ismael G. Armentaruz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of violating a lawful regulation and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 92 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, to be confined for 7 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 1 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV1 Noah P. Hulihan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of domestic violence by strangulation, one specification of aggravated assault by strangulation, and one specification of possession of child pornography in violation of Articles 128, 128b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 34 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 8 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, PV1 Samuel H. Duncan, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of obstruction of justice in violation of Article 131b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of false official statement and one specification of aggravated assault in violation of Articles 107 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$920.00 pay per month for 2 months, to be reprimanded, to perform 2 months of hard labor without confinement, and to be restricted to the limits of Fort Benning for 60 days.

November 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 8 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Oliver Duncan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer and three specifications of domestic violence in violation of Articles 90 and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 10 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Matthew Allen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of resisting apprehension, two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, three specifications of assault on a noncommissioned officer, one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of assault in violation of Articles 87a, 90, 91, 92, 112a, and 128, UCMJ. The Military Judge sentenced the Accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 15 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Christopher Anderson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 16 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SPC Jonathan D. Scrivener, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 16 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PV1 Christian Jobin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongfully damaging private property, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and four specifications of domestic violence in violation of Articles 109, 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 16 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

November 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 17 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of three specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 29 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Alfredo Morales, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 3 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SSG Enrique Castro, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of false official statement and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Articles 107 and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 14 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 4 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Anderson A. Antepara, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 32 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 10 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, CPT Ross E. Downum, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of wrongfully using a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$1,000.00 for one month, to be reprimanded, and to be restricted for 30 days.

On 15 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, MAJ Sergio O. Lopez-Garcia, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of larceny in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to pay a fine of \$30,000.00, to be reprimanded, and to be confined for 180 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

November 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 17 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Juan E. Ramirez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 128 and 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of willfully and wrongfully damaging property, one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of kidnapping, and two specifications of disorderly conduct in violation of Articles 109, 115, 125, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, to be confined for 10 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 29 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SSG Joshua J. Franklin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 2 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SFC Erick Felix, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 36 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 2 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC Christopher M. Anaya, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of fleeing apprehension, one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of child endangerment, two specifications of aggravated assault with a dangerous weapon, and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 87a, 113, 115, 119b, 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 20 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 2 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, PFC Thomas N. Chapman, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of soliciting sexually explicit images of a minor and four specifications of possessing, receiving, viewing and distributing child pornography in violation of Articles 82 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 35 months, and discharged from service with a bad-conduct discharge.

November 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 3 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of three specifications of abusive sexual contact and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ.

On 3 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, SGT Victor Bello, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of selling or disposing of government property and two specifications of larceny of government property in violation of Articles 108 and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 80 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 4 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SSG Bryce W. McKinnis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3 and to be confined for 50 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 8 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PV1 Carlos J. Upegui, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 24 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 8 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SSG Bartholomew D. Viers, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of larceny, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 121, 128b, 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of making a false official statement, one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of sexual assault, one specification of larceny, four specifications of domestic violence, and two specifications of bringing discredit upon the armed forces in violation of Articles 107, 115, 120, 121, 128b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and to be confined for 120 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 8 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Staff Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, of two specifications of larceny of military property of a value over \$1,000.00 in violation of Article 121, UCMJ.

November 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 9 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SPC Kodjo Akoloh, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child and one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child involving indecent communication in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 9 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Dylan M. Ray, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2 and to be confined for 60 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 10 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Coty J. Boudreaux, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of larceny in violation of Articles 85, 90, 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, to be confined for 183 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 14 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Jason J. Lewis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of possessing and viewing child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 14 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, MAJ Jason Rivard, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of making a false official statement, three specifications of larceny of military property, and four specifications of making a false writing in connection with a claim in violation of Articles 107, 121, and 124, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be restricted for two months and to be reprimanded. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

November 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 17 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Staff Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 18 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SFC Robert Ramirez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6 and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 19 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SGT Philip L. Prall, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to be restricted for 30 days.

On 21 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Christopher E. Sanchez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of maltreatment in violation of Article 93, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 207 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 22 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC Jan L. CottoReyes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of destruction of non-military property, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and three specifications of domestic violence in violation of Articles 90, 109, 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of disobeying an order from a superior commissioned officer in violation of Article 90, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

November 2022

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 22 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, SPC Derrick Henderson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of making a false official statement and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 107 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy and one specification of making a false official statement in violation of Articles 81 and 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, to be confined for 15 days, and to perform 15 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 28 November 2022, at a general court-martial at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC Andrew A. Perez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$917.00 pay per month for 3 months, to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 90 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 10 November 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Vicenza, Italy, SPC Jimmy D. Tingle, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be confined for 120 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 November 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, PV2 Jeffery A. Demayo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation and three specifications of sexual assault in violation of Articles 92 and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 32 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.
