**First Judicial Circuit**

On 5 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PV2 Matthew Conner, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault and two specifications of indecent language in violation of Articles 120 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 23 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 6 December 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Jamel Brown, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absent without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1 and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The pretrial agreement had no effect on the sentence.

On 7 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, 1LT Aidan L. Gaffney, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge of one specification of failing to obey a lawful order and one specification of domestic violence in violation of Articles 92 and 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of failing to obey a lawful order, one specification of larceny, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of violating a state statute, assimilated by 18 U.S.C. § 13 in violation of Articles 92, 121, 128b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to be confined for 15 days.

On 15 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, a Specialist, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of six specifications of distribution of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ.

On 16 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Joshua L. Walker, United States Army, was convicted by a panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, one specification of communicating a threat, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Articles 107, 115, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape, four specifications of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated

by a battery in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$1,833 pay per month for 1 month, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 14 days.

**Second Judicial Circuit**

On 1 December 2022, at a special court-martial composed of a military judge alone convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SSG Charles A. Stokes, United States Army, was convicted contrary to his pleas of one specification of disrespecting a superior non-commissioned officer and one specification of disobeying a lawful order in violation of Articles 91 and 92, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of disrespecting a superior officer in violation of Article 89, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to no punishment.

On 2 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Winslow Stanley, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military-judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted indecent viewing, one specification of unlawful entry, and two specifications of violating the State of Georgia's peeping tom statute in violation of Articles 80, 129, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 5 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, 1LT Jay Alvelo-Roman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of maltreatment, one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, one specification of fraternization, and one specification of extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 93, 133, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 6 December 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Benjamin Sibley, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to make a false official statement and one specification of false official statement in violation Articles 81 and 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1.

On 7 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Brandon Woodall, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of domestic violence in violation of 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 450 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

## December 2022

### Summarized Report of Results of Trial

On 12 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC LaMondey T. Long, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of larceny in violation of Articles 81, 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 31 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 12 December 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, SFC Irvin Landa, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, two specifications of prohibited activities with a trainee by a person in a position of special trust, and one specification of the wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 92, 93a, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and to be confined for 60 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 13 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SSG Adam S. Page, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 54 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 13 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV1 Tony L. Butler, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful order in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 172 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 16 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Monteo Brooks, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 20 December 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Jeffrey Buhl, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of wrongfully engaging in extramarital conduct in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded.

**Third Judicial Circuit**

On 1 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, CW2 Nicholas J. Ehler, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of abusive sexual contact and one specification of unlawful entry in violation of Articles 120 and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 2 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Captain, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of one specification of unlawful use of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 2 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Jalen D. Thomas, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of voluntary manslaughter in violation of Article 119, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 100 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 2 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SSG Joel A. Corrinard, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault consummated by battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 72 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 8 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, SFC Sam Ly, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual abuse of a child involving indecent conduct and one specification of battery upon a child under the age of 16 in violation of Articles 120b and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 8 December 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Staff Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of three specifications of maltreatment and one specification of conduct prejudice of good order and discipline in violation of Articles 93 and 134, UCMJ

On 8 December 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, PV2 Gaspar J. Caballero, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of distributing a controlled substance,

and one specification of larceny in violation of Articles 112a and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 13 December 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SSG Simon L. Cantu, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of prohibited activities with a military trainee by a person in position of special trust in violation of Article 93a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5, to be confined for 7 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

### **Fourth Judicial Circuit**

On 1 December 2022, at a general court-martial, convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SFC Viphakone Keoaroun, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault upon a child under the age of 16 in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was sentenced to be reprimanded and to be reduced to the grade of E-6. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 2 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, CPL Jesse Campbell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of committing a lewd act with a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 5 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SGT Reinierluke Bulatao, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of maltreatment and two specifications of assault consummated by battery in violation of Articles 93 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3 and to be confined for 5 months. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 6 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SSG Ryan R. Robey, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave and one specification of wrongful disposition of military property in violation of Articles 86 and 108, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 150 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 8 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, PFC Conner Twogood, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 11 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a pretrial agreement.

On 8 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PV2 Dylan L. Reese, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion and one specification of absence without leave in violation of Articles 85 and 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 120 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 12 December 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC Mykal A. Brooks, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of aggravated assault causing grievous bodily harm in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to E-1 and to be confined for 25 days. The punishment was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 14 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC David Carl M. Sandbergen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of wrongfully communicating a threat, one specification of committing a lewd act upon a child who had not attained the age of 16 years, one specification of wrongfully possessing child pornography, and one specification of wrongfully viewing child pornography in violation of Articles 90, 92, 115, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 15 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PV1 Nelson A. TorresJuarez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of assault, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of unlawful entry in violation of Articles 112a, 128, 128b, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 15 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Major, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 16 December 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PV2 Monte L. Maxey, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful order and one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 92 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 180 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

**Fifth Judicial Circuit**

On 14 December 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SGT Koffi Adjamgba, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of five specifications of making a false official statement and one specification of larceny in violation of Articles 107 and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4 and to be confined for 4 months.
