First Judicial Circuit

On 12 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Mark N. Ceniza, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of the plea agreement.

On 19 September 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, MSG Timothy O. Winter, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery on a child under the age of 16 in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 60 days.

On 23 September 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Marcellus McGlothlin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failing to obey a lawful order or regulation and one specification of communicating a threat and in violation of Articles 92 and 115, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 23 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky SFC Thuan T. Nguyen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault of a child in violation of 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 20 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 10 years.

On 28 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Aaliyah Toney, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of damaging non-military property and one specification of aggravated assault in violation of Articles 109 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be confined for

145 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 28 September 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SGT Wesley D. Clark, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance and three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 160 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 29 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Thomas R. Edwards, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of dereliction of duty in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of four specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to be confined for 65 days.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 13 September 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, PV2 Kaelan L. McElroy, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 45 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 13 September 2012, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Alexander Erwin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of larceny in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 50 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 23 September 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Angel Rivera Gonzalez, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to perform 15 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 24 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SGT Anthony J. Longres, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of assault with a dangerous weapon, and

one specification of burglary in violation of Articles 115, 128, and 129, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault with a dangerous weapon in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, SPC Jose Tezanos-Alvarez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy and two specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance in violation of Articles 81 and 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of violating a lawful general order, one specification of wrongfully manufacturing a controlled substance, three specifications of wrongfully distributing a controlled substance, one specification of wrongfully possessing a controlled substance, and one specification of child endangerment in violation of Articles 81, 92, 112a, and 119b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 16 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 28 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Nicholas Seeman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 29 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV1 Isaac Gomez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of aggravated assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 75 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 29 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Christopher I. Triplett, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 360 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 1 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SSG Carlos D. Locke, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement and one specification of sexual assault and in violation of Articles 107 and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 18 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 1 September 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, SSG Michael Martinez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault with a loaded firearm and one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 260 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 14 September 2022, at special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PV1 Malasia D. Howard, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her plea, of one specification of larceny in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to perform 60 days of hard labor without confinement. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a pretrial agreement.

On 14 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, 2LT Joel Y. Easter, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of false official statement, two specifications of assault consummated by battery, two specifications of obstruction of justice, and one specification of wrongfully engaging in extramarital sexual conduct in violation of Articles 107, 128, 131b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 12 months, to forfeit all pay and allowances, and to be dismissed from the service. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 19 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Prince Silva, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 95 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 21 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Bradley E. Rathbun, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of disobeying a lawful order from a superior commissioned officer, one specification of obstruction of justice, one specification of

viewing child pornography, and one specification of photographing a military identification card without lawful authority in violation of Articles 90, 131b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 480 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 22 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, a Private First Class, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 27 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Joseph B. Love, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongfully soliciting to produce child pornography and four specifications of committing a lewd act upon a child in violation of Articles 82 and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 54 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 29 September 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Joshua DeHerrera, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of domestic violence in violation of Article 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 160 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 29 September 2022, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Amilcar Torrento, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.

On 30 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of sexual assault in violation of Articles 92 and 120, UCMJ.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 21 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, a Master Sergeant, United States Army, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 27 September 2022, at a general court-martial convened in Vincenza, Italy, PFC Michael Coffee, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of physically controlling a vehicle in a reckless or wanton manner and one specification of manslaughter in violation of Articles 113 and 119, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 180 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. The sentence was consistent with the terms of a plea agreement.
