

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 02 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PVT Henry Phan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault of a child and two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 54 months.

On 14 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Jace M. Heney, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Daniel Soliz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of dereliction of duty and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 92 and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 months.

On 28 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, a Major was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of abusive sexual contact with a child and four specifications of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Articles 120 and 120b, UCMJ.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 02 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a First Lieutenant was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 02 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Redstone Arsenal, Alabama, MAJ David J. Rudometkin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of rape and carnal knowledge, two specifications of aggravated sexual assault, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and three specifications of conduct unbecoming of an officer and gentleman, in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 133, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of assault

consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 120 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 25 years and a dismissal.

On 12 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGM Ronnie S. Knight, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance and five specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 112a and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-8, and to be confined for 100 days.

On 15 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGT Judea M. Divins, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 4 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 23 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Ryan L. McClung, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 8 months.

On 27 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Gordon, Georgia, PVT Paul Jackson, III, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful order, one specification of false official statement, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of indecent acts, in violation of Articles 92, 107, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 4 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 01 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, a Captain was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ.

On 02 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Matthew N. Gray, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 13 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SPC Ignacio G. Perez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 85 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 20 February 2018, at a special-court martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Jakeim D. Jeter, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, three specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, five specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and four specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 92 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 22 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, a Specialist was acquitted by a military judge of one charge of assault consummated by a battery and one charge of child endangerment, in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ.

On 23 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Staff Sergeant was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 28 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Sergeant was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of abusive sexual contact and four specifications of rape of a child, in violation of Articles 120 and 120b, UCMJ.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 02 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, CPT Joseph L. Simmons, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel consisting of officer members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of sexual assault of a child, one specification of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 92, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of five specifications of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b. The members sentenced the accused to be confined for 1 year and 6 months, and a dismissal.

On 02 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SGT Torey D. Jones, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of disrespect towards a noncommissioned officer in violation of Article 91, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of disrespect towards a superior

commissioned officer and one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, in violation of Articles 89 and 90, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be restricted for 30 days to the limits of Fort Carson, and to perform hard labor without confinement for 30 days.

On 13 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Justin D. Cannon, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and two specifications of wrongful appropriation, in violation of Articles 112a and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 6 months, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 13 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC John M. Morales, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 107 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 14 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SFC Scott D. McDaniel, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted larceny and three specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 80 and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to perform hard labor without confinement for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 14 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Sicaria S. Coleman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of two specifications of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,224.00 pay per month for 3 months, to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As a part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 45 days.

On 14 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, PFC Alexander E. Denson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, four specifications of sexual assault, five specifications of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of aggravated assault, and two specifications of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 107, 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ. The

military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 years and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 20 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SPC Michael D. Royal, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of wrongful possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SFC Bradley W. Coffey, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation and three specifications of indecent language, in violation of Articles 92 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was convicted, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of rape, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and two specifications of solicitation of rape of a child, in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 2 years.

On 22 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, SPC Mark R. King, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 23 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Kemarius J. Dyson, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be restricted for 60 days, and to perform hard labor without confinement for 45 days.

On 23 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, SSG Luis R. Burgos-Castro, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 112a and 121, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for 2 months, and to perform hard labor without confinement for 45 days.

On 26 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Peter P. Provenzano, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault, one specification of distribution of child pornography, and one specification of indecent language, in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 years, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 12 months.

On 26 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Keith D. Thomas, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 5 months, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As a part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 3 months.

On 27 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT Michael A. Mays, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from service with a bad-conduct discharge. As a part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 months.

On 28 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of false official statement and one specification of rape, in violation of Articles 107 and 120, UCMJ.

On 28 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, PVT Victor J. Medina, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of false official statement, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 86, 107, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 4 months and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 03 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SFC Christopher B. Chesonis, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a lawful order and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 92 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification

of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5 and to be confined for 144 days.

On 14 February 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Vicenza, Italy, SSG Carlos Gonzalez-Rodriguez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, one specification of larceny, and one specification of fraud against the United States, in violation of Articles 107, 121, and 132, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit \$2,189.00 of pay per month for 5 months, and to be confined for 60 days.

On 22 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, SGT Tamel A. Belton, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer in violation of Article 90, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of rape, one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of kidnapping, in violation of Articles 120, 128 and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 330 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 25 February 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Wiesbaden, Germany, SPC Jaquan N. Porter, United States Army, was convicted by a panel of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of false official statement and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 107 and 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of false official statement and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 107 and 121, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be restricted for 60 days to the limits of United States Army Garrison Wiesbaden, and to perform hard labor without confinement for 60 days.

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
