

4. This redesignation letter is in accordance with letter NGB-ARO-0 207-02, Reorganization Authority No. 68-72, subject: Change of Designation for ARNG Field Artillery Battalions/Batteries, the National Guard Bureau, 8 March 1972.

1. The coat of arms redesignated this date for the 136th Artillery,
Ohio National Guard was:

a. Originally approved for the 136th Field Artillery, Ohio National
Guard by letter AG 421.7 - 136th F.A., (2-19-41) LG, Office of The Adjutant
General, 5 August 1941.

b. Amended to revise the blason description of the wreath colors
of the crest by letter AG 421.7 - 136th Field Artillery (9-11-41) LG, Office
of The Adjutant General, 17 September 1941.

c. Redesignated for the 136th Field Artillery Battalion, Ohio
National Guard by letter SPK 421.7 136th F. A. Bn., (9-14-42) LG, Office of
The Adjutant General, 14 September 1942.

2. The blazonry and description are as follows:

BLAZONRY

SHIELD: Gules, a powder charge or and in base a rammer fess-
wise of the like;

CREST: That for the regiments and separate battalions of
the Ohio National Guard: On a wreath of the colors
(or and gules) a sheaf of seventeen arrows argent
bound by a sprig of buckeye (*Aesculus glabra*) fructed
proper (two leaves with bursting burr).

DESCRIPTION

The red shield is used to represent Artillery. The powder charge and the rammer are distinctive of the 155 mm howitzer.

3. A photostat of the coat of arms as shown on the organizational color is inclosed.

4. The distinctive insignia redesignated this date for the 136th Artillery, Ohio National Guard was:

a. Originally approved for the 136th Field Artillery, Ohio National Guard by letter AG 421.7 - 136th Field Artillery (8-1-41) LG, Office of The Adjutant General, 19 August 1941.

b. Redesignated for the 136th Field Artillery Battalion, Ohio National Guard by letter SPX 421.7 136th F. A., (8-13-42) LG, Office of The Adjutant General, 25 August 1942.

5. The distinctive insignia (metal type for wear on the shoulder loops) is the shield and motto of the coat of arms for this organization which are described in paragraph 2.

TO BE WORN: As prescribed by current regulations.

6. Records indicate the sample of distinctive insignia was approved for the 136th Field Artillery by letter AG 421.7 136th Field Artillery, (10-25-41) LG, Office of The Adjutant General, 13 November 1941. The manufacturer of this insignia was H. S. Mayer, Incorporated, 215 East 91st Street, New York 28, New York. However, if the services of another manufacturer are desired, a painting of the distinctive insignia will be forwarded upon request.

7. This redesignation is in accordance with letter, NG-AROTG 325.4 - Ohio, Office of the National Guard Bureau, subject: Reorganization of the Army National Guard 1958-60, dated 30 June 1959, and letter, QMIRE-R 421.2 & 421.4 C/A Regts, CARS, Ohio NG, Office of The Quartermaster General, subject: Coats of Arms for Regiments of Combat Arms Regimental System, Ohio National Guard, dated 10 August 1960, with 3rd Intersectment, MCOHIO-P-000.4, Office of The Adjutant General of the State of Ohio, same subject, dated 23 September 1960.

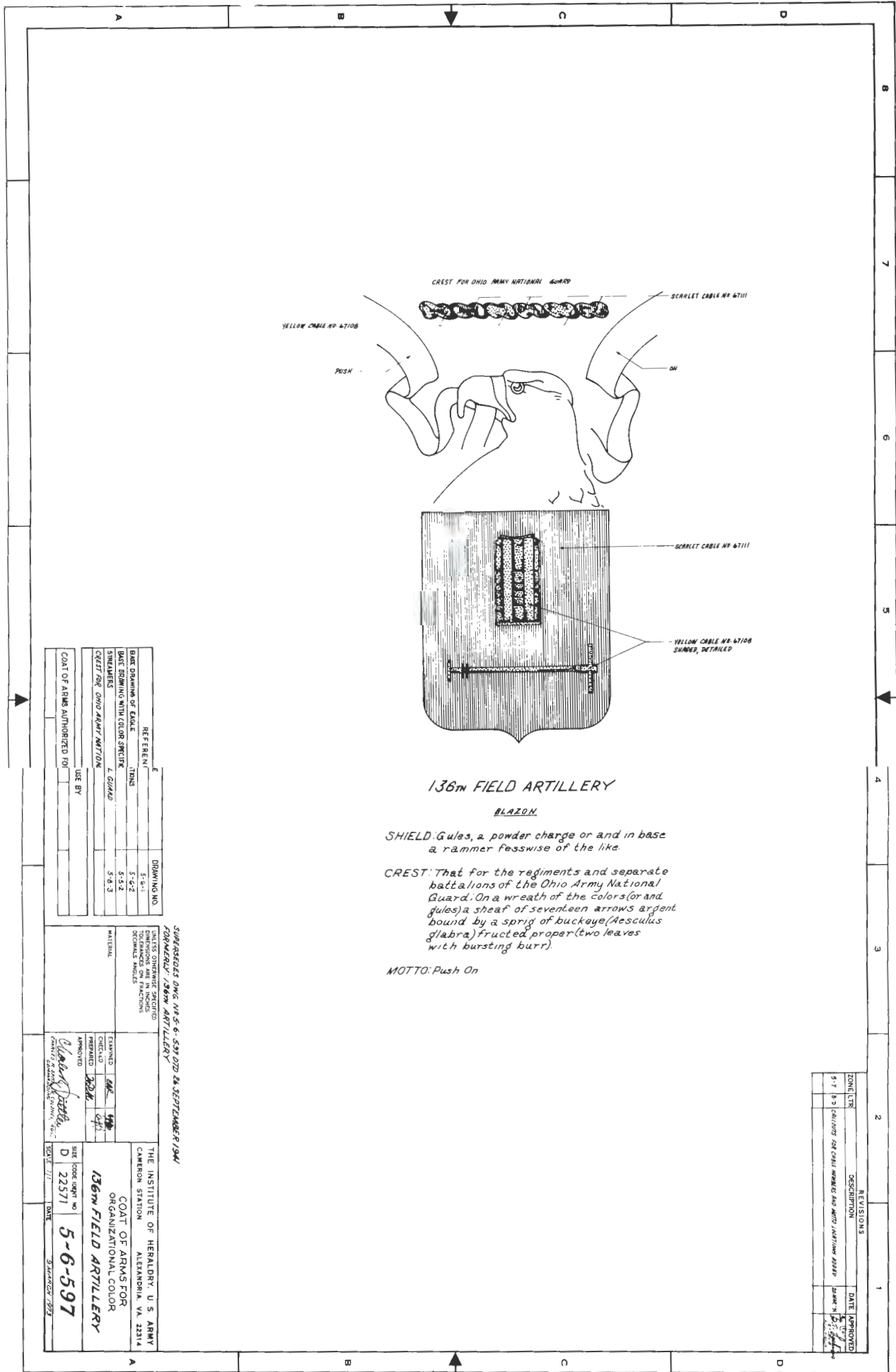

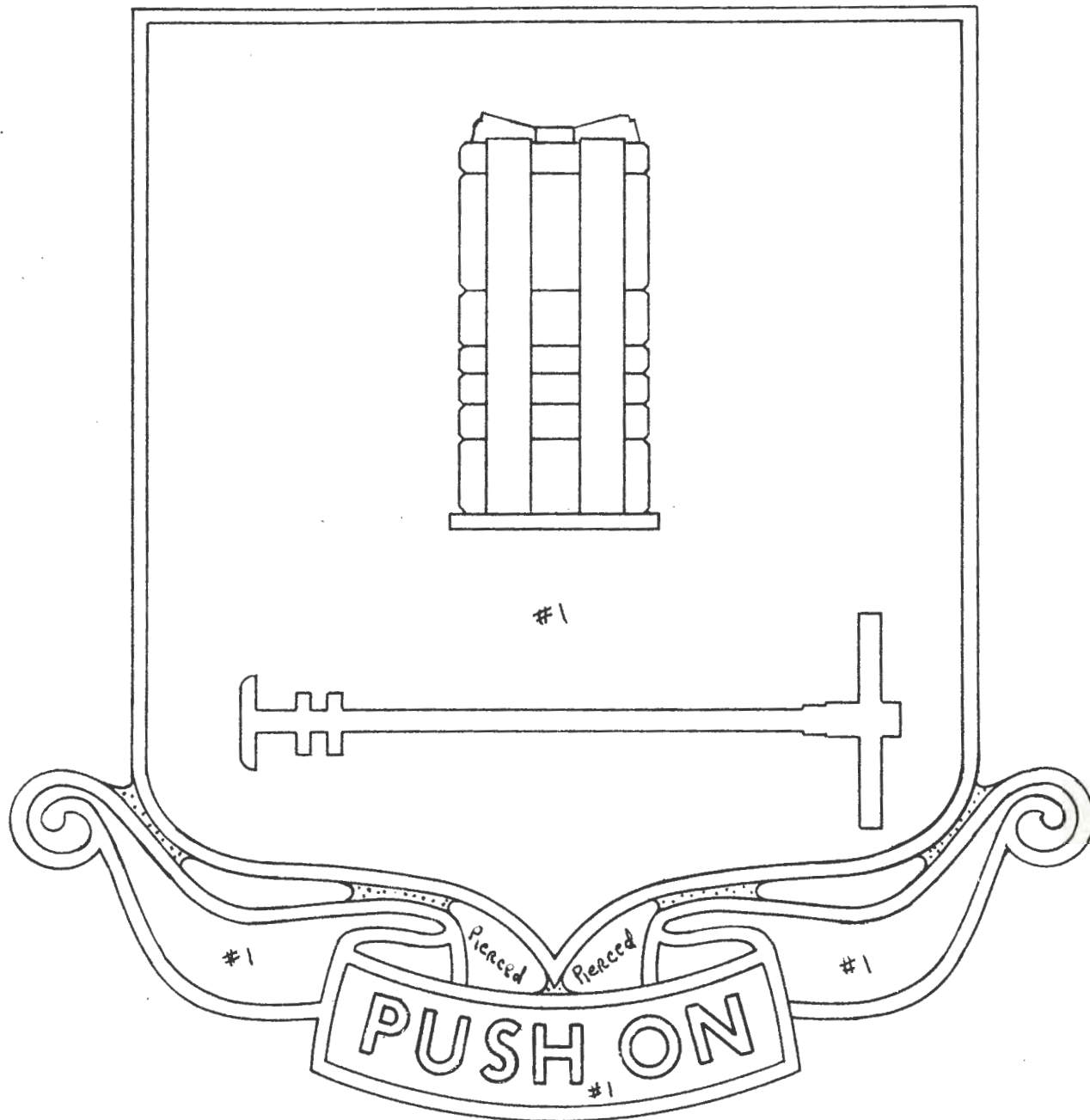

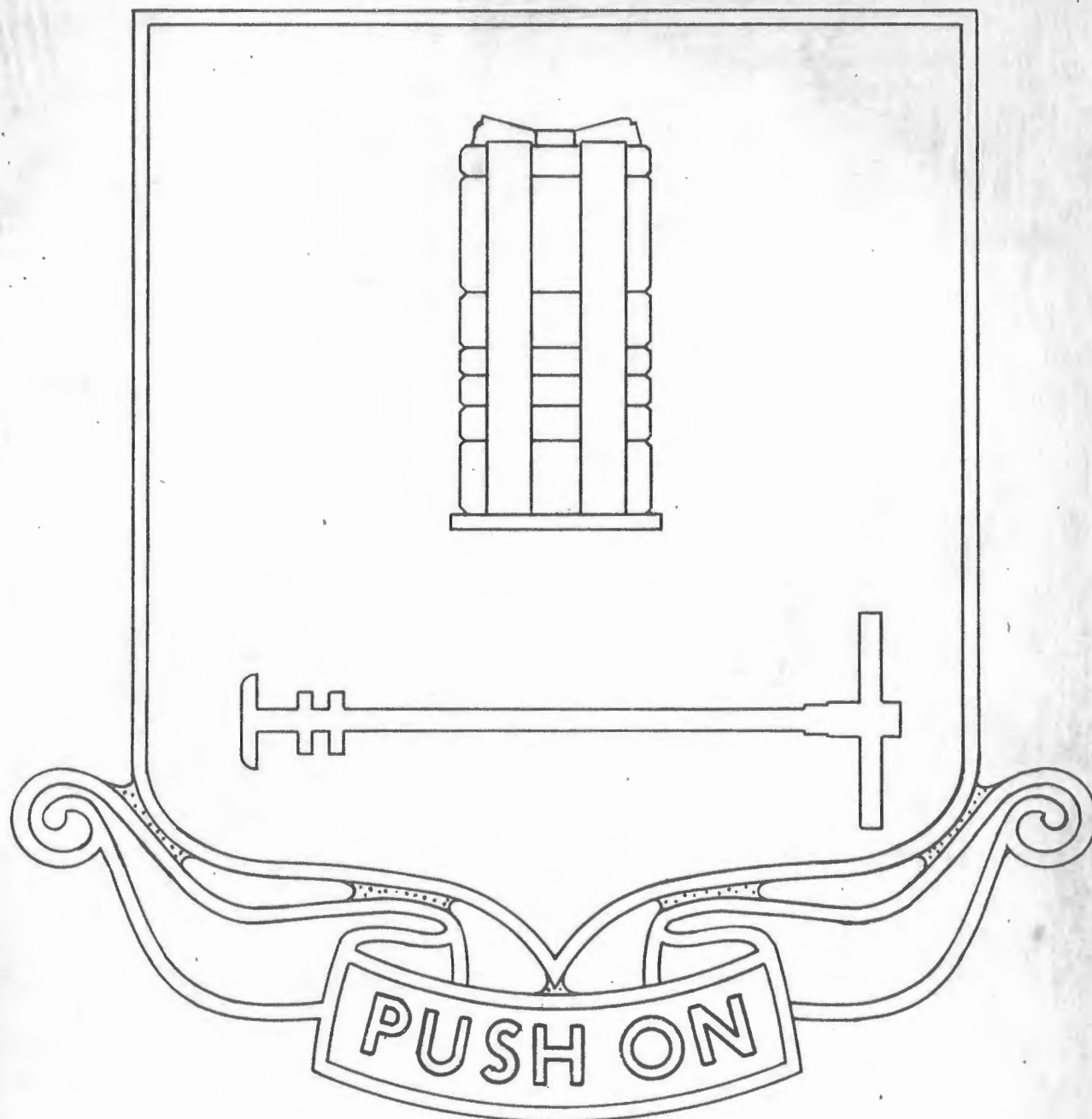
