**SUBJECT:** Shoulder Sleeve Insignia for the 14th Air Force.

**TO:** Commanding General, 14th Air Force, APO 627, c/o Postmaster, New York, N. Y.

1. By the authority delegated to the Quartermaster General by End Indorsement, AG 421.7 Insignia (9-15-42) CD-1, The Adjutant General's Office, October 8, 1942, the following shoulder sleeve insignia for the 14th Air Force is approved:

On a blue disc 2-1/8 inches in diameter a winged Bengal tiger golden orange with black and white markings, below and partially covering a white star 7/8 inch in diameter charged with a 5/16 inch red disc.

The design of this insignia is adapted from the insignia used by the A.Y.G. (Flying Tigers), members of which now form a part of the 14th Air Force.

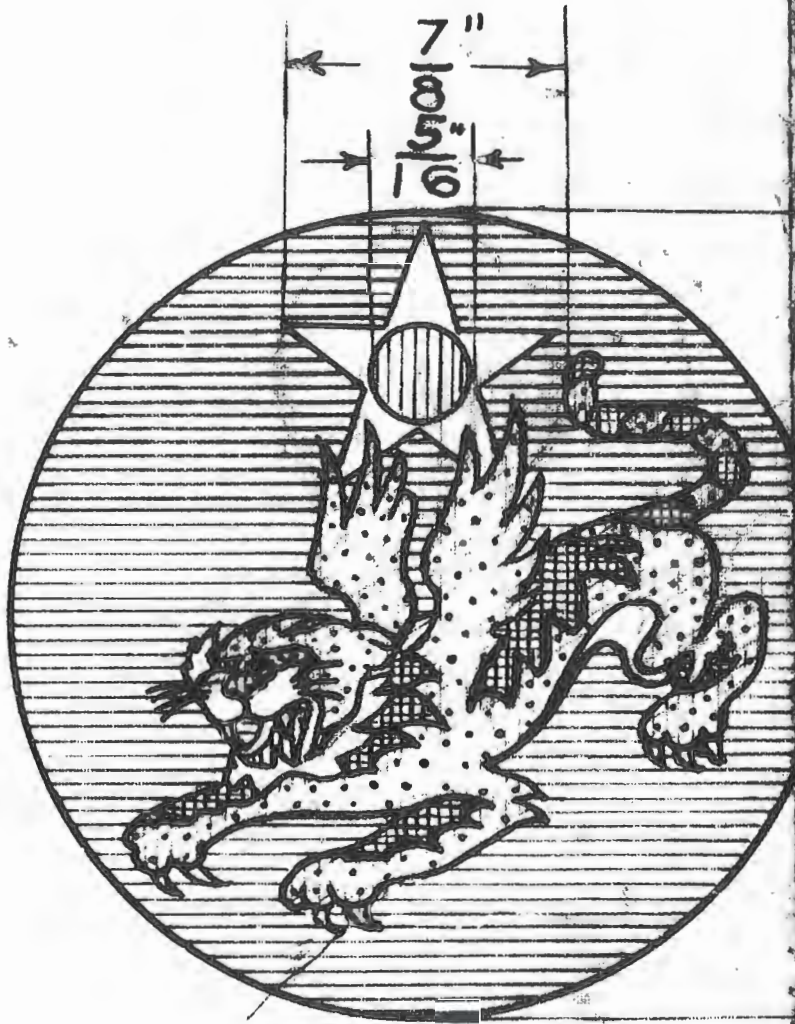
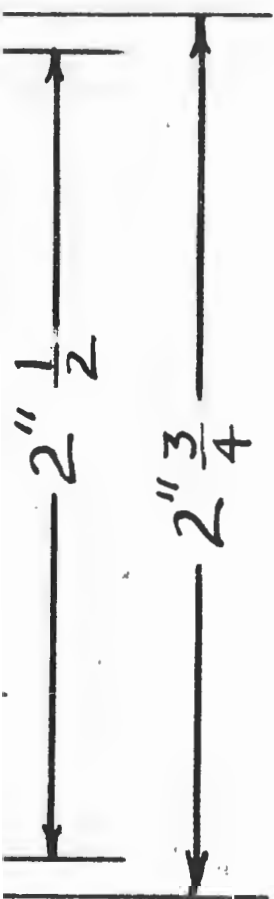
