1. The coat of arms for the 186th Artillery, New York National Guard is approved. The blazonry and description are as follows:

BLAZONRY

SHIELD: Per fess abased gules and barry wavy of six or and azure, a pale argent between in dexter chief a fleur-de-lis and in sinister chief a prickly pear cactus of the second, the pale charged with an apple slipped and leafed of the first bearing the white figure "2" and in chief a Roman sword in sheath (from the Spanish War Medal) of the third.

CREST: That for the regiments and separate battalions of the New York National Guard: On a wreath of the colors (or and gules) the full-rigged ship "Half Moon" all proper.

MOTTO: Ad Omnia Parati (Ready For All Things).

DESCRIPTION

The colors scarlet and yellow are used for Artillery. The apple with white figure "2" alludes to the badge of the old 2d Infantry Regiment, New York National Guard, to indicate the parent unit which was known as the "Appledockers."

New York National Guard


The descent of the present unit from the 105th Infantry Regiment thru the 186th Armored Field Artillery Battalion, New York National Guard, is depicted by elements from their coats of arms and the colors blue and white for Infantry. These elements are the Roman sword, prickly pear cactus and fleur-de-lis. The organization's three campaign awards for service in the Pacific area, World War II are represented by three wavy blue bars.


2. The distinctive insignia for the 186th Artillery, New York National Guard is approved. The distinctive insignia is the shield and motto of the coat of arms for this organization, which is described in paragraph 1.

TO BE WORN: As prescribed by current regulations.

3. The approved painting and drawing for use in the manufacture of the distinctive insignia will be forwarded on or about 28 January 1963.

4. This approval is in accordance with the Certificate of Lineage and Honors for the 186th Artillery dated 26 June 1962.

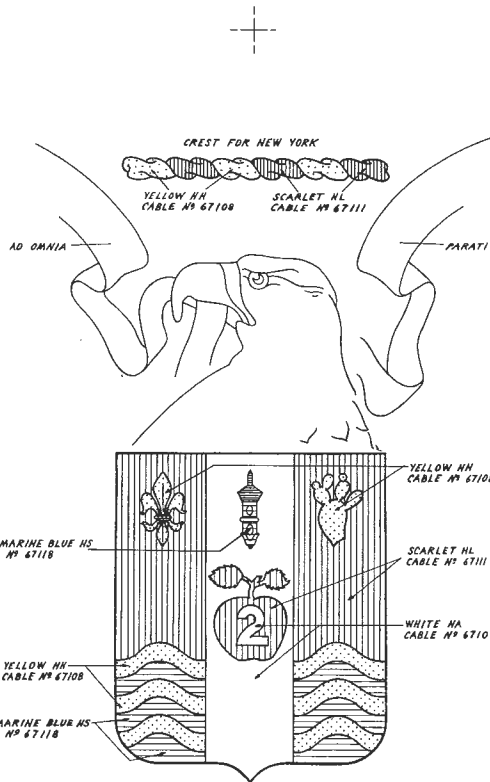
