SUBJECT: Distinctive Insignia (Badge) for the 267th Aviation Battalion

1. A distinctive insignia (badge) for the 267th Aviation Battalion is authorized. It is described as follows:

DESCRIPTION

A silver color metal and enamel device 1 3/16 inches in height overall consisting of a cross, the four arms of equal length but the horizontal arms double in width, divided horizontally with the upper portion blue enamel and the lower orange; the upper portion charged with three silver "T's", one and two, cross piece reversed and the lower portion with the like, two and one with cross piece at top all between two closed silver wings issuing left and down from the top arms of the blue portion and right and up from the lower arm of the orange.

SYMBOLISM

Ultramarine blue and golden orange are the colors for aviation units. The wings and cross simulate rotary wing aircraft, and their position is used to represent both the control and the evacuation aspects of the organization. The complementary colors allude to the Unit's wide scope of operation and the small "T's" refer to the three to seven aviation transport companies under the Unit's command and supervision.

2. The distinctive insignia will be worn as prescribed in AR 670-5.
3. The approved badge design will be centered on the distinguishing flag authorized for your Battalion.

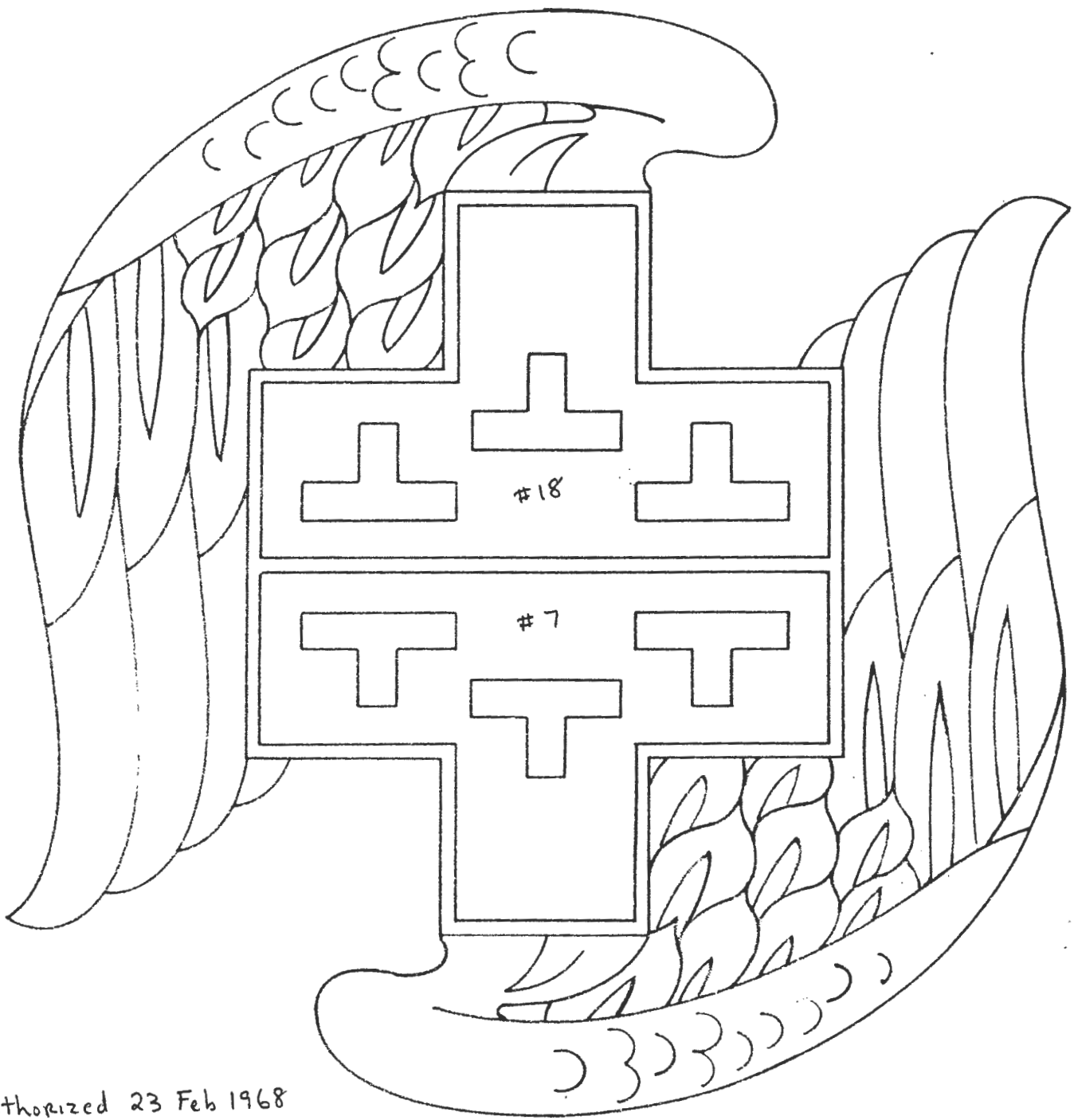

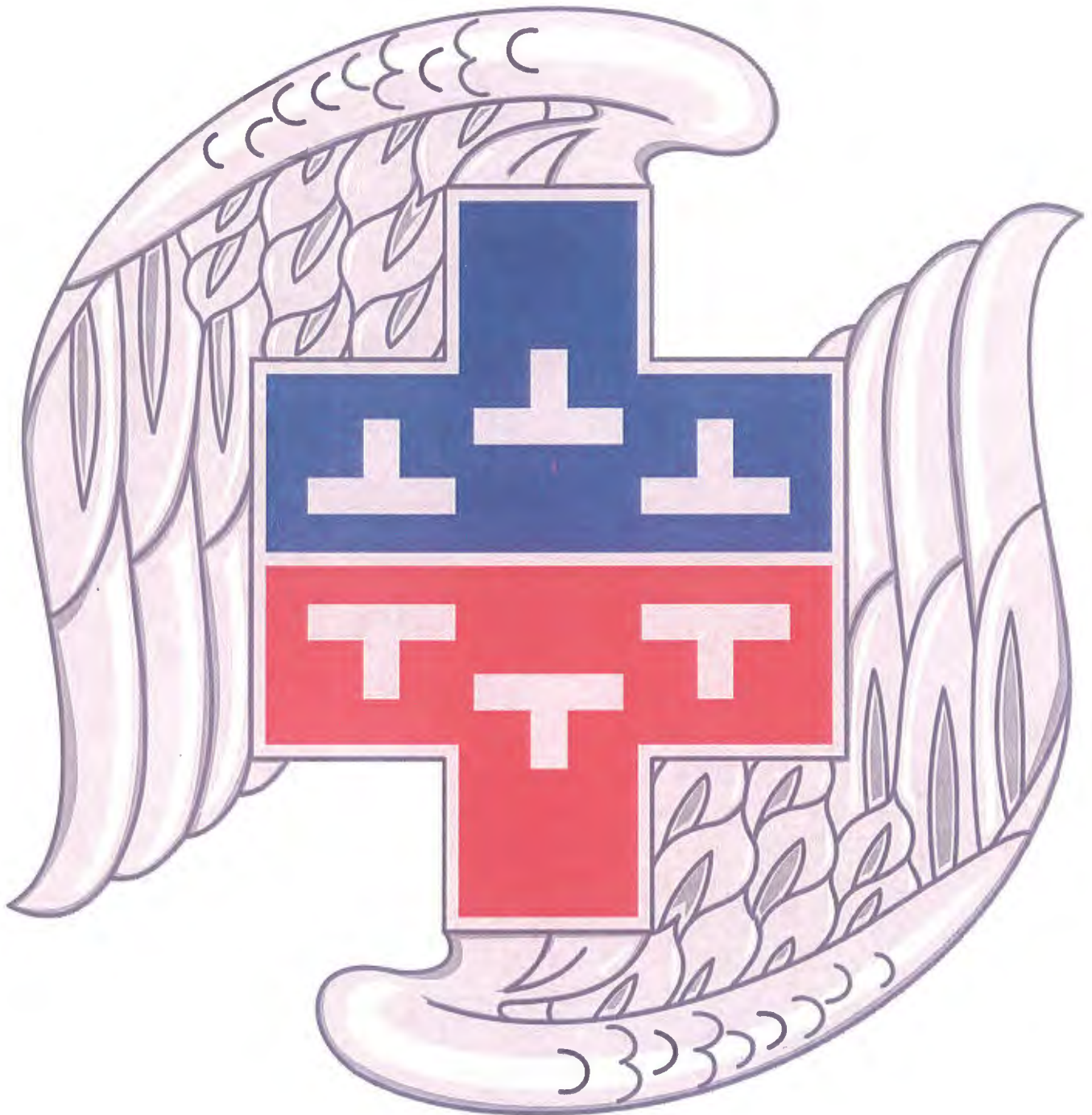

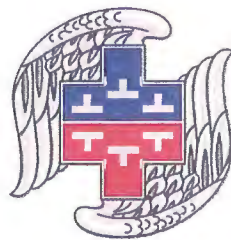
