MOTTO: Ours to Save.

DESCRIPTION

The shield is sanguine with a bend argent in the colors of the Medical Department.


3. The distinctive insignia will be worn as prescribed in AR 670-5.

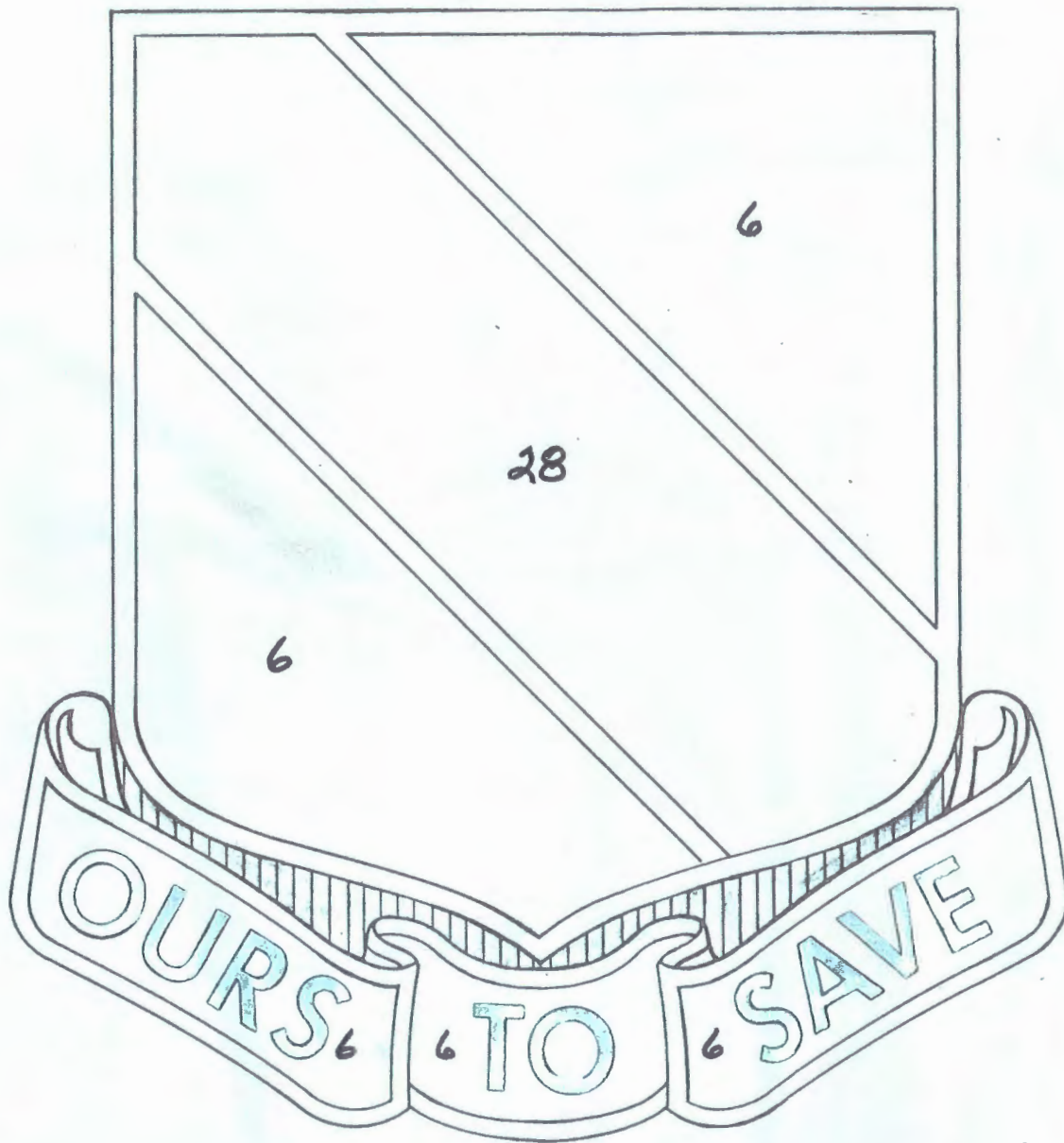
