1. The distinctive insignia (badge) approved for the 36th Artillery Group by letter AGAH-A, this Institute, subject as above, dated 24 June 1968, is rescinded this date.
2. The above action is taken in accordance with the Certificate of Lineage and Honors for the 36th Field Artillery, copy of which is attached. HHB 36th Artillery Group was consolidated 30 April 1972 with the 36th Field Artillery, a parent regiment under the Combat Arms Regimental System.
3. The 36th Field Artillery has an approved coat of arms and distinctive insignia.

1. A distinctive insignia (badge) for the 36th Artillery Group is authorized. It is described as follows:

DESCRIPTION

A gold color metal and enamel device 1 1/4 inches in height overall consisting of a black gun stone beneath a gold axhead, blade up and bearing a red demi-fleur-de-lis surmounted overall by a gold arrowhead point up all above and encircled by a gold scroll with the inscription "Powerful and Swift" in black letters.

SYMBOLISM

Red and yellow are the colors used for Artillery. The gun stone and arrowhead, heraldic symbols for ancient projectile weaponry, symbolize the basic mission of the organization. The arrowhead surmounting the fleur-de-lis for France and the battle axhead for Italy further refer to the organization's two assault awards earned in World War II.

2. The distinctive insignia will be worn as prescribed in AR 670-5.
3. This authorization letter will become a permanent file of the organization in accordance with File No. 206-06, Organizational history files, AR 345-210.
4. This authorization is in accordance with:
  - a. Paragraph 14-18a, AR 670-5, 23 September 1966.

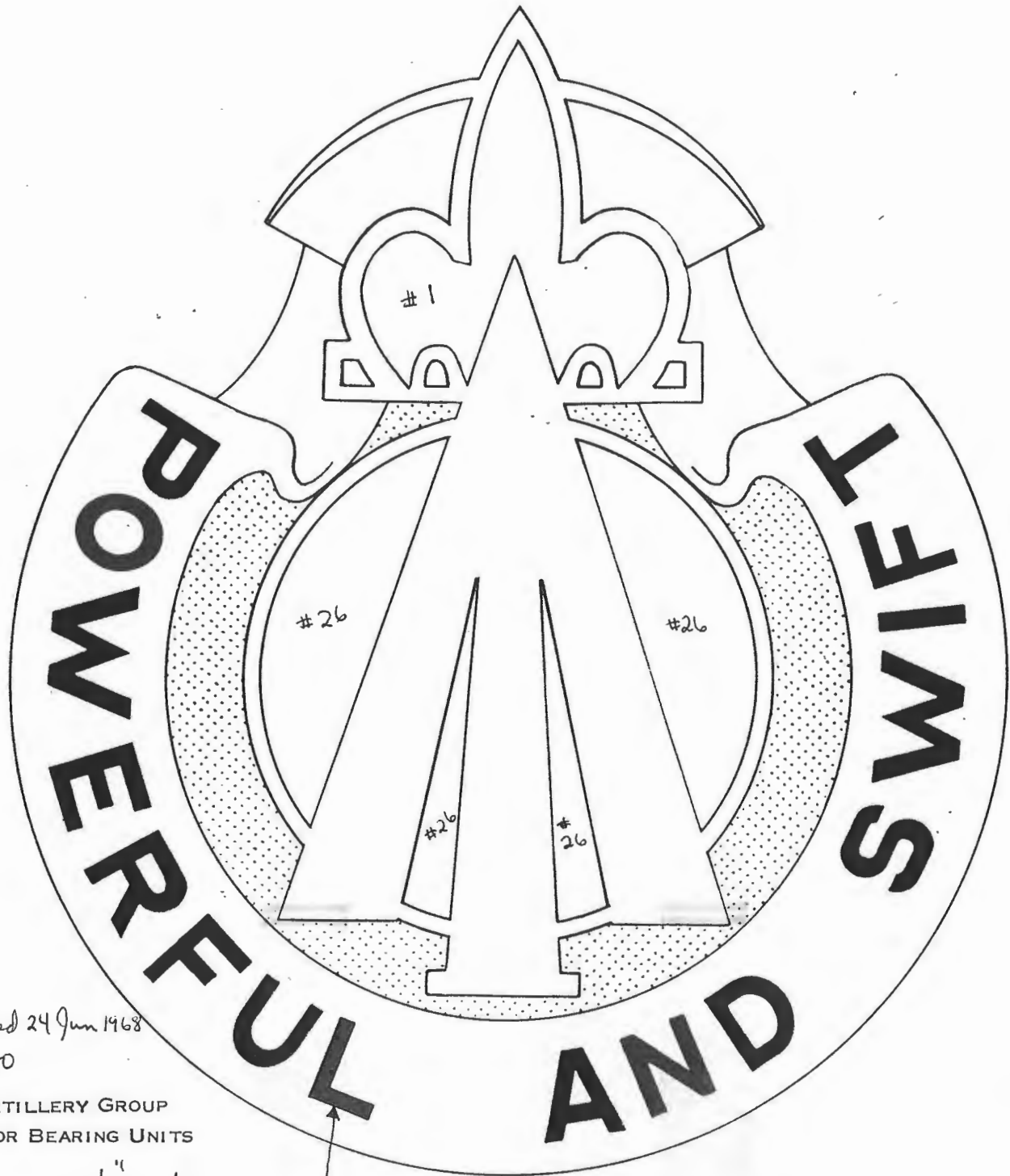

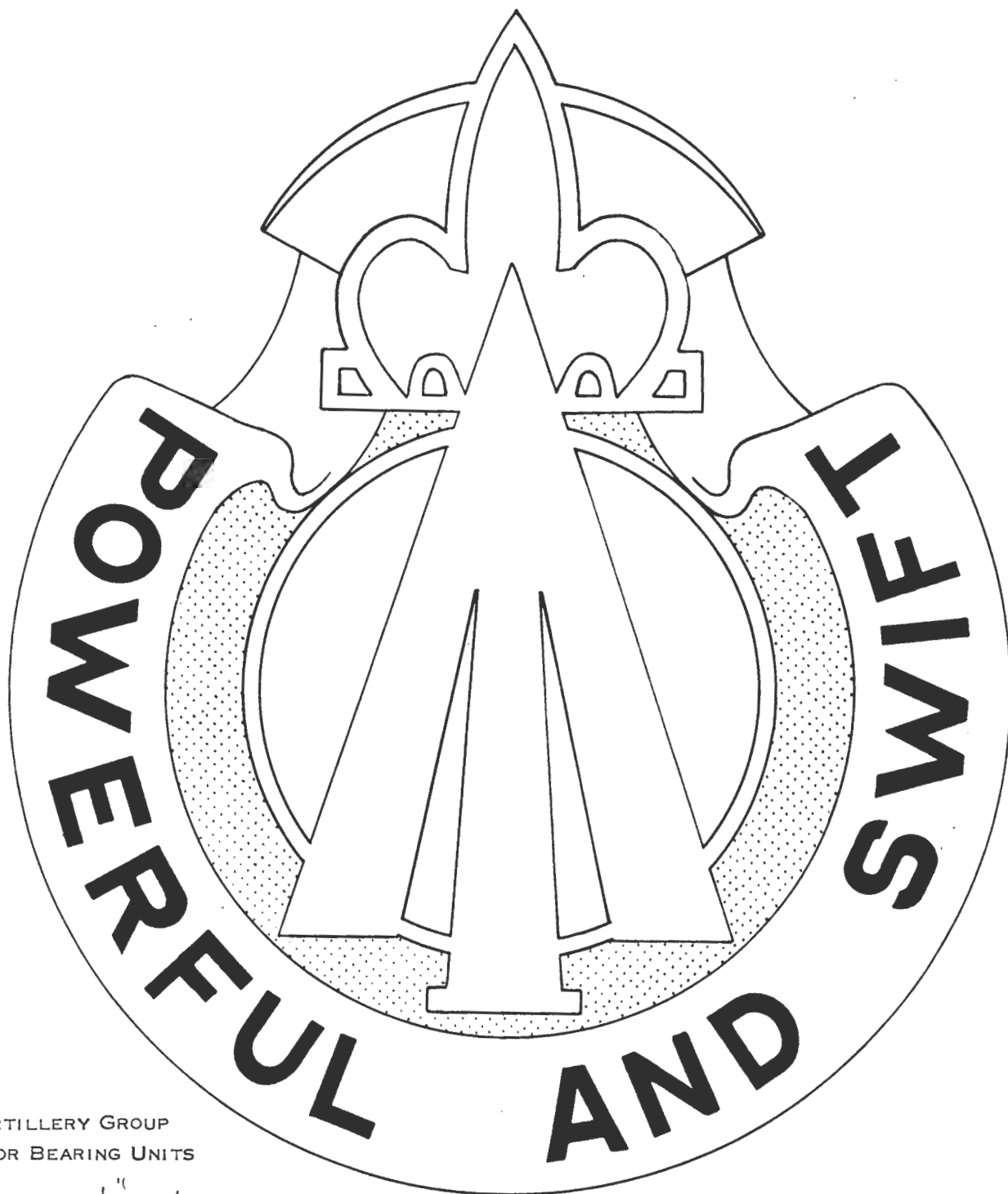
