BLAZON

SHIELD: Per saltire Sanguine and Argent, a cross couped Or voided Gules.

CREST: That for the regiments and separate battalions of the Army Reserve: From a wreath Argent and Sanguine, the Lexington Minute Man Proper. The Statue of the Minute Man, Captain John Parker (H. H. Kitson, Sculptor), stands on the Common in Lexington, Massachusetts.

MOTTO: None.

SYMBOLISM

Maroon and white are the colors traditionally associated with the Army Medical Corps. Gold conveys excellence, high ideals and achievement. The red cross denotes medical care and compassion.

couped Or voided Gules.

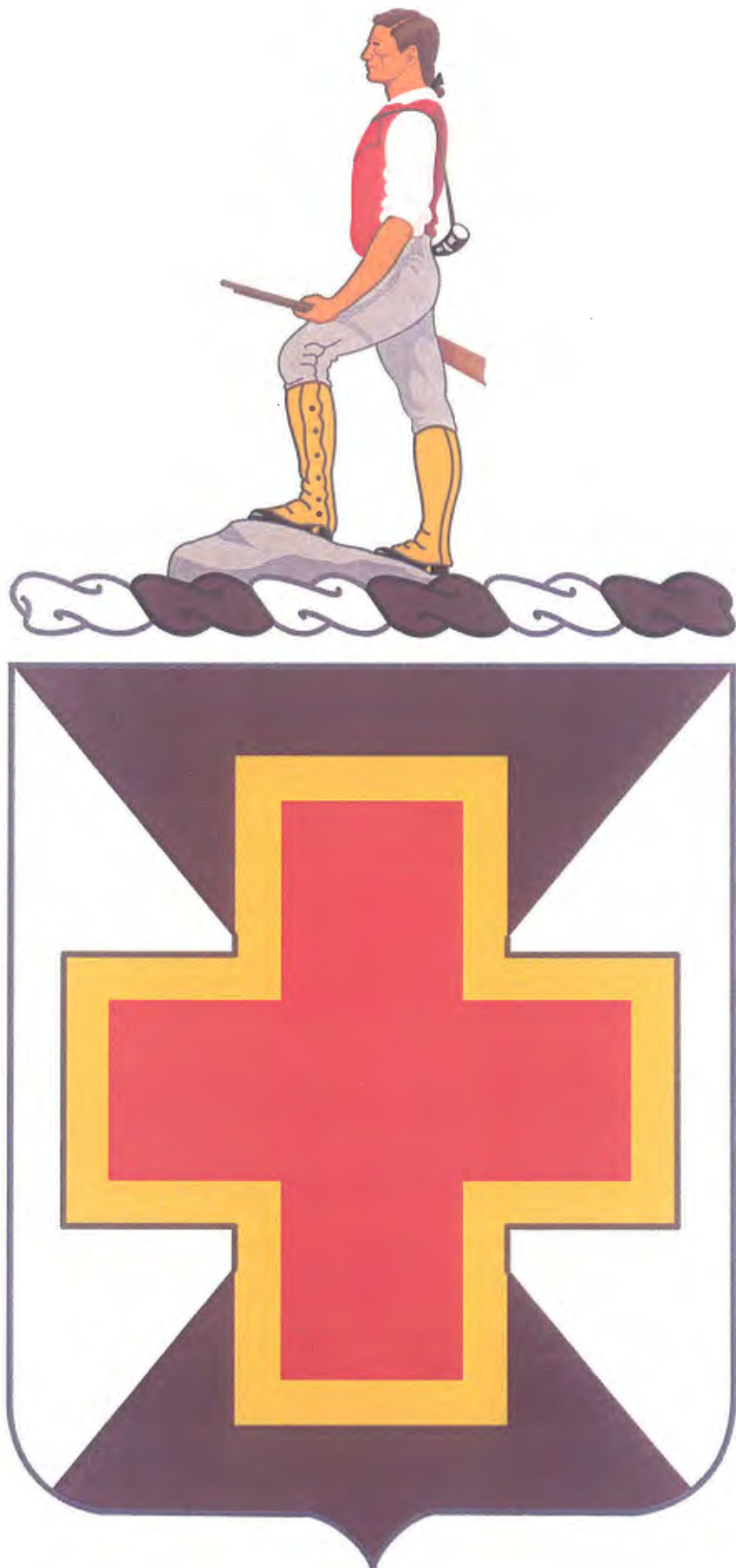
SYMBOLISM

cross denotes medical care and compassion.

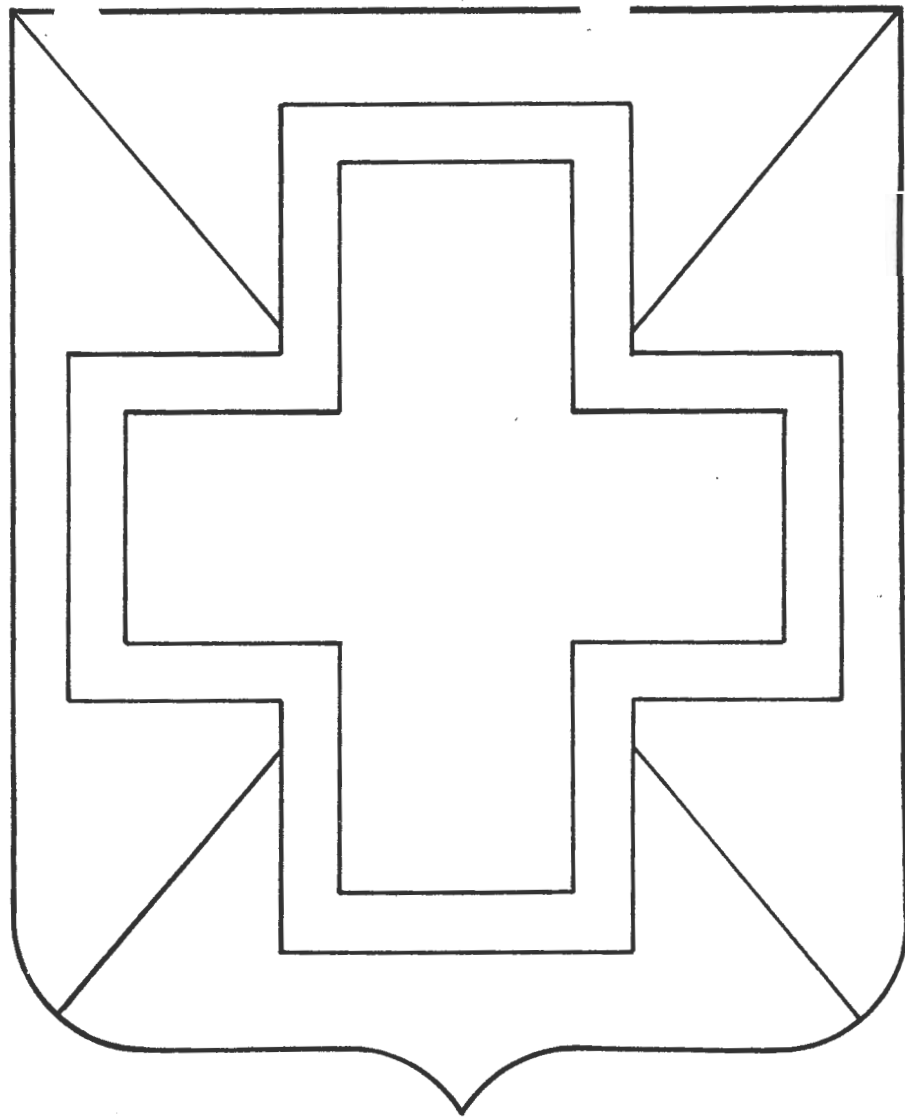
