**SUBJECT: Distinctive Insignia (Badge) for the United States Disciplinary Barracks**

1. A distinctive insignia (badge) for the United States Disciplinary Barracks is authorized. It is described as follows:

DESCRIPTION

A gold color metal and enamel device 1 3/16 inches in height overall consisting of a gold sun on a blue enamel area with nine gold rays issuing from it and surmounted vertically overall by a gold sword between two green enamel post oak leaves, vertical with stems conjoined in base below point, all between two white enamel columns at the sides and two red enamel scrolls above and below the columns, the upper scroll surmounting the rays and sword inscribed, "OUR MISSION", and the lower scroll inscribed, "YOUR FUTURE", all in gold letters.

SYMBOLISM

The sun, symbol of authority, healing, knowledge and of a new beginning represents the overall mission of the organization. The sword depicts all military personnel. The oak leaves and columns refer to military and civilian stability in rehabilitation. The columns and enarched scroll simulate a doorway and allude to the custodial guidance of the unit.
