

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 03 December 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Matthew G. Leland, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 169 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 90 days.

On 07 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SSG Erick A. Barchers, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of wrongful possession of child pornography in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 13 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, a Sergeant First Class, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, of two specifications of sexual assault, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ.

On 19 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PVT Joseph L. Feeney-Clark, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion and six specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 85 and 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be confined for 107 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 06 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Timothy J. Evans, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to commit sexual assault and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 81 and 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 15 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 06 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 10 December 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC David S. Eads, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and two specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 210 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 83 days.

On 12 December 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Gordon, Georgia, SFC Michael J. Brown, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of false official statement and three specifications of wearing unauthorized insignia, decoration, badge, ribbon, device, or lapel button, in violation of Articles 107 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-6, to forfeit \$2,000.00 pay per month for 5 months, and to be confined for 5 months.

On 12 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of negligent homicide in violation of Article 134, UCMJ.

On 13 December 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Reo K. Ramirez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer and two specifications of violation of a general regulation, in violation of Articles 89 and 92, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge of one specification of disrespect toward a superior noncommissioned officer and one specification of larceny of military property, in violation of Articles 91 and 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of striking a superior noncommissioned officer, one specification of disrespect toward a superior noncommissioned officer, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 91 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,081.00 pay per month for two months, and to be confined for 81 days.

On 18 December 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, PVT Malcom D. Stevens, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The

military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 18 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PVT Sean G. Hamilton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion and one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Articles 85 and 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 20 December 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PVT Harmoney A. Anderson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of four specifications of absence without leave, four specifications of failure to obey a general regulation, one specification of being drunk on duty, and three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, 92, 112, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 85 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 06 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Brando A. Reese, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of larceny and one specification of unlawful entry, in violation of Articles 121 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 12 months.

On 11 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Jose M. Guzman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 18 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, PVT Erick C. Black, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of rape of a child and one specification of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 years and 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 21 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of attempted sexual assault and three specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 03 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PVT Mikael E. Grullon, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, two specifications of the wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 92 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 13 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 months.

On 03 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Fransheska Carrion, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of dereliction of duty, one specification of false official statement, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 92, 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 03 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Benjamin P. Heidecker, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of larceny of military property in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 100 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 05 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Jervelous D. Drisdorn, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 57 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 45 months.

On 06 December 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Georgio Quiroz, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of false official statement in violation of Article 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of larceny of military property in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The

members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 06 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC Devion E. Dennis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 60 days.

On 07 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a First Lieutenant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers of three specifications of abusive sexual contact, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of communicating a threat, and one specification of indecent language, in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ.

On 10 December 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PVT Bobby D. Moore, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of breaking restriction in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$900.00 pay per month for one month and to be confined for 14 days.

On 12 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Joshua L. Isaias, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 92, 112a, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 20 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 12 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Carnell J. Lawson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted of one specification of abusive sexual contact and two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 8 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 72 months.

On 13 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, SPC David Munoz, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement and three specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 107 and 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to

forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 15 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 13 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SFC Leron D. Delaney, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child and of three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of larceny, two specifications of aggravated assault, four specifications of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 121, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5, and to be confined for 5 months.

On 14 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SGT Clifford M. Parker, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of obstruction of justice in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SSG Michael W. Shaw, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of rape of a child and two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 24 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 84 months.

On 17 December 2018, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Tiger Q. Nguyen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful broadcast or distribution of intimate visual images, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 117a and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 18 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SGT Lucas E. McQueen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 130 days.

On 18 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Dakota W. Welch, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant

to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 90 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 14 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 months.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 01 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, SSG Luis E. Escamilla, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of a failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault upon a sentinel in violation of Articles 92, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 3 months, and to be confined for 3 months.

On 19 December 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Vicenza, Italy, a Private First Class was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, of two specifications of rape, two specifications of sexual assault, one specification of aggravated assault, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of obstruction of justice, one specification of indecent language, and one specification of animal abuse, in violation of Articles 120, 128 and 134, UCMJ.

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
