

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 01 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SGT Jamal R. Williams-McCray, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of conspiracy to commit murder, one specification of murder, and one specification of soliciting another to commit an offense, in violation of Articles 81, 118, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of attempted murder, one specification of sexual assault, and two specifications of wrongfully impeding an investigation, in violation of Articles 80, 118, 120, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for life, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 75 years.

On 12 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, MSG Jeremy P. Daigneault, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of false official statement, one specification of larceny, and one specification of fraud against the United States, in violation of Articles 107, 121, and 132, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, and to be confined for 15 months. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited the sentence to reduction to E-4 and confinement to 119 days.

On 12 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at West Point, New York, MAJ Steven L. Robertson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful order and regulation, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 92 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to forfeit \$1,000.00 per month for 5 months.

On 13 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual assault and one specification of adultery in violation of Articles 120 and 134, UCMJ.

On 19 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Jonathan F. Badgett, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, one specification of possession of child pornography, two specifications of producing child pornography, one specification of viewing child pornography, one specification of distributing child pornography, and one specification of indecent language, in violation of Articles 120b and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 25 years, and to be

discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 years.

On 29 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SFC Michael A. Robinson, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of rape of a child, one specification of sexual assault of a child, four specifications of sexual abuse of a child, one specification of sodomy, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 120, 120b, 125, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of indecent conduct and three specifications of committing a lewd act upon a child, in violation of Article 120 and 120b, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ.

On 30 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at West Point, New York, CDT Levi M. Alton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of indecent recording and one specification of broadcasting or distributing of an indecent recording, in violation of Article 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 3 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 01 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Ronald C. Givens, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of false official statement, one specification of larceny of military property, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of child endangerment, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 107, 121, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault consummated by battery and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,680.00 pay per month for one month, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 05 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Kyle A. Narburgh, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The

military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 07 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, 2LT Robert J. Sharp, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 14 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 12 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 14 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PFC Alvin T. Nelson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of absence without leave, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of disrespect towards a noncommissioned officer, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 91, 92, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of fleeing from apprehension, three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of wrongful communication of a threat, in violation of Articles 95, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 149 days.

On 15 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PVT Peter L. Fernandes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Articles 86 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 15 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 19 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Chad L. Chowning, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 20 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PFC Danny J. Salmond, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Antwan A. Balkcom, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 1 year, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 22 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PVT Tucker J. Dauplaise, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86 and 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 50 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 22 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Rucker, Alabama, SFC Zachary A. Fejeran, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to forfeit \$2,000.00 pay per month for 3 months.

On 25 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 27 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Brandon T.X. States, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted murder, one specification of attempted possession of steroids, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 80 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of attempted murder of an unborn child, and two specifications of solicitation of murder, in violation of Articles 119a and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 15 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, LTC Mark W. Christensen, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification aggravated assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit \$4,000.00 pay per month for 6 months, to be confined for 3 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 04 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Clancey D. Lamb, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault of a child, and two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 48 months.

On 06 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Theadore T. Daniels III, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of kidnapping, and two specifications of child endangerment, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 14 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 06 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Jesus B. Dominguez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 7 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 19 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, PFC Johnathon A. Najera, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of manslaughter in violation of Article 119, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of murder, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of negligent homicide, in violation of Articles 112a, 118, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 20 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, PVT Richard A. Agosto, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and two specifications of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Articles 90 and 111, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 months. As part of an offer to plead guilty, the pretrial agreement limited confinement to 90 days.

On 22 March 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Christopher Rivera-Diaz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge,

contrary to his plea, of one specification of larceny of government property in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 5 months.

On 25 March 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Jarrod A. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willful disobedience of a superior commissioned officer, three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 90, 112a, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 44 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 22 months.

On 26 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SFC Justin T. Silvers, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of drunk on duty, and one specification of drunkenness-incapacitation for performance of duties, in violation of Articles 90, 112, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, two specifications of drunk on duty, and one specification of drunkenness-incapacitation for performance of duties, in violation of Articles 90, 112, and 134. The military judge sentenced the accused to no punishment.

On 28 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SPC Brandon M. Lance, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 12 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, CW4 Elmer F. Hoffman, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of indecent acts, in violation of Articles 120 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape, and two specifications of indecent acts, in violation of Articles 120 and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 9 years, and to be dismissed from the service.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 01 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Corey D. Haggard, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault and one specification of communicating a threat, in

violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, four specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 04 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG James R. Leigh, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, one specification of indecent language, one specification of soliciting another to distribute child pornography, and one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 20 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 06 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of sexual assault, two specifications abusive sexual contact, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ.

On 06 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PFC Darian P. Gonzales, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, three specifications of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of indecent conduct, in violation of Articles 107, 120, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 15 months.

On 07 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Foster, Okinawa, Japan, PFC Justin C. Gaines, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of resisting apprehension and one specification of assault upon a person in the execution of law enforcement duties, in violation of Articles 95 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault upon a noncommissioned officer, one specification of wrongful violation of a lawful general order, and two specifications of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 91, 92, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 07 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Derrick J. Wiebe, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his

pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, two specifications of disrespect toward a noncommissioned officer, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 86, 91, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 121 days.

On 07 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Rashad I. Harris, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of larceny of military property in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 100 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 08 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT William A. Young, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wearing an unauthorized badge, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 107, 112a, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 121 days.

On 11 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC James R. Rochelle, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, six specifications of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Articles 107, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 2 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 18 months.

On 12 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PVT Earl R. Bryan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, two specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of unlawful entry, and one specification of disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 86, 92, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 15 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Shane R. Noblit, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of false official statement, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, one specification of adultery, one specification of communicating

a threat, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 90, 107, 112a, 115, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 18 months.

On 19 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Christopher L. Shepherd, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of nine specifications of absence without leave, three specifications of false official statement, one specification of wrongfully selling military property, one specification of larceny of military property, two specifications of forgery, five specifications of housebreaking, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 86, 107, 108, 121, 123, 128, and 130, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 40 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 21 months.

On 19 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PFC Austin G. Sheehan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to wrongfully possess a controlled substance, four specifications of absence without leave, one specification of false official statement, four specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and two specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 81, 86, 107 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 16 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 12 months.

On 21 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Casey O. Atwell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 3 months.

On 22 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 22 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Anthony A. Andriolo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to commit wrongful possession of a controlled substance, four specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and two specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 81 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PVT Keenan R. Ducksworth, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault, one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 80, 92, and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of accessory after the fact in violation of Article 78, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted by the members of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 26 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SSG Jason D. Vikre, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted murder and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 80 and 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5.

On 26 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, PVT Abraham A. Mahmoud, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 107 and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 193 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 March 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 27 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of rape in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 28 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Trevor I. Tuiolosega, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement in violation of Article 107, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of false official statement, one specification of maiming, one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of reckless endangerment, in violation of Articles 107, 124, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be restricted to the limits of home and place of duty for 60 days, and to be confined for 21 days.

On 28 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of attempted sexual assault, two specifications of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 80, 120, and 128, UCMJ.

On 28 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, SGT Randy White, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 31 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SGT Martin Q. Benson, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Articles 92 and 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of accessory after the fact in violation of Article 78, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 07 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, SPC Jacob D. Adames, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted possession of child pornography in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 20 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, PVT Michael L. Lewis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of eleven specifications of absence without leave, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, two specifications of impaired operation of vehicle, three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of maiming, and two specifications of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 86, 92, 111, 112a, 124, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 36 years and 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 25 years.

On 20 March 2019, at a general court-martial convened in Vilseck, Germany, SPC Shilby R. Henningsen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of drunken operation a vehicle, one specification of reckless operation of a vehicle, and one specification of involuntary manslaughter, in violation of Articles 111 and 119, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 years, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 30 months.
