

## **Summarized Report of Results of Trial**

### **First Judicial Circuit**

On 02 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PFC Andre J. Felton, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, four specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, four specifications of disobeying a noncommissioned officer, three specifications of disrespect towards a noncommissioned officer, one specification of assaulting a noncommissioned officer, one specification of dereliction of duty, one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of provoking speech, and one specification of disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 91, 92, 117, and 134, UCMJ. The members acquitted the accused of one specification of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,120.00 pay per month for 3 months, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 03 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Eustis, Virginia, PFC James R. Robertson II, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, and one specification of wrongfully possessing child pornography, in violation of Articles 86, 92, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 04 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PVT Juan C. King, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of attempted sexual assault of a child, and one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 10 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, SSG David L. Chatman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded and to perform hard labor without confinement for 45 days.

On 11 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at West Point, New York, SGT Felipe R. Garcia III, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be

confined for 66 days. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement required the disapproval of the sentence to confinement.

On 17 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, SSG Anthony E. Hill, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to commit larceny, one specification of attempted larceny, one specification of dereliction of duty, one specification of larceny, and one specification of fraud, in violation of Articles 80, 81, 92, 121, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 36 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 18 months.

On 25 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Belvoir, Virginia, LTC Ronald S. Walls, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement and two specifications of an offense not capital, in violation of Articles 107 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy to commit larceny in violation of Article 81, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to pay a \$30,000.00 fine.

### **Second Judicial Circuit**

On 03 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC James B.A. Riley, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of a violation of a lawful general regulation, four specifications of larceny, and one specification of receipt of stolen property, in violation of Articles 92, 121, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 12 months.

On 08 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Rashad S. Rickards, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 128 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 245 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, PFC Donald P. Laviolet, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating of a lawful general regulation, four specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 92, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of resisting apprehension, and one specification aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 95 and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the

accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 11 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PVT Parker E. Liscano, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, three specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, four specifications of willfully disobeying a noncommissioned officer, one specification of disrespect toward a noncommissioned officer, one specification of false official statement, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 91, 107, 112a, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Ricky L. Olivo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of sexual abuse of a child, three specifications of sexual assault of a child, one specification of production of child pornography, and five specifications of possession of child pornography, in violation of Articles 120b and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 25 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 15 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PVT Alejandro Reyes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of negligent homicide in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of involuntary manslaughter of a child in violation of Article 119, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 16 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PVT Seth M. Hubbard, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of absence without in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 months.

On 17 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Nathaniel Meadows, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of larceny, and one specification of unlawful entry, in violation of Articles 81, 121, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Marvin L. Goodman II, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of bribery in violation of Article 124a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$500.00 for 3 months, to be confined for 75 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, SGT Jared D. Crain, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of destruction of military property, one specification of wrongful disposal of military property, three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, two specifications of larceny, one specification of wrongful appropriation, and one specification of attempted escape from confinement, in violation of Articles 80, 92, 108, 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PFC Aquavius M. Grisson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be confined for 126 days. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 121 days.

On 24 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Nicholas L. Johnson, United States Army was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGT Adam P. Galavotti, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to commit larceny of military property, one specification of wrongful sale of military property, and one specification of larceny of military property, in violation of Articles 81, 108, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

### **Third Judicial Circuit**

On 03 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Tyler A. Waters, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of willfully disobeying a noncommissioned officer, one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 90, 91, 92, and 128, UCMJ. The

accused was acquitted of one specification of aggravated assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 04 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, SPC Kristopherallen L. Stegall, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of attempt to commit a lewd act with a child in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 285 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 9 months.

On 05 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Joshua K. Pheloan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 90 and 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 months.

On 09 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, PFC Primitivo F. Delgado, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and six specifications of sexual assault of a child, in violation of Articles 86 and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 28 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 11 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Zachary R. Shrader, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 25 months. and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 24 months.

On 11 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Alexander V. Coleman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion, one specification of absence without leave, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 85, 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a

bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 12 months.

On 15 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, Inmate Wesley V. Eaton, a person in the custody of the armed forces serving a sentence imposed by a court-martial, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of possession of a controlled substance, and one specification of possession of a prohibited item, in violation of Articles 112a and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 25 days.

On 16 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC George M. Kelly, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, one specification of sexual abuse of a child, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault, in violation of Articles 120, 120b, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 17 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, Inmate Leshan Jones, a person in the custody of the armed forces serving a sentence imposed by a court-martial, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of production of obscenity, and one specification of possession of obscenity, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 42 months.

On 19 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Ryan J. Everett, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86 and 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 25 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SSG Shawn E. Ellis, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault of a child, and one specification of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 20 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 24 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, MSG Antonio D. Barron, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery on a child, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of

two specifications of assault consummated by a battery upon a child in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited reduction to the grade of E-7.

On 26 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Darrin M. Hill, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of desertion in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 150 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

#### **Fourth Judicial Circuit**

On 01 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Kyle D. Ashe, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of distributing child pornography, and one specification of receiving child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 46 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 24 months.

On 02 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Fernando J. Rodriguez-Rabago, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 200 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 180 days.

On 02 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Richard N. Hartman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of false official statement, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of rape of a child, in violation of Articles 92, 107, 120, and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 11 years, and discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 120 months.

On 02 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, PVT Justin R. Vega, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 03 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, a Private, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, of four specifications of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120 and 128, UCMJ.

On 04 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, PVT Jarrid D. Singleton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of false official statement, one specification of aggravated assault, and of one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 107, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be restricted to the limits of Fort Irwin for 45 days, and to perform hard labor without confinement for 45 days.

On 04 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Dylan W. Weeks, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of false official statement, two specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, four specifications of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto an installation used by the armed forces, four specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 92, 107, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 36 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 18 months.

On 04 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Irvin Parades-Martinez, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, one specification of unlawful entry, and one specification of housebreaking, in violation of Articles 120, 130, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 6 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 05 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Isaiah L. Carrera, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 180 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 08 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Shaquilla N. Salmon, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of desertion, and one specification of absence without

leave, in violation of Articles 85 and 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 08 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Brandon A. Glasscock, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, two specifications of rape of a child, and five specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Articles 107 and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 08 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PVT Alexandre Z. Davis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of disrespect toward a noncommissioned officer, one specification of false official statement, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of breaking restriction, and one specification of unlawfully entering a motor vehicle, in violation of Articles 91, 107, 121, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful violation of a lawful general regulation, one specification of false official statement, two specifications of wrongful sale of military property, one specification of abusive sexual contact, three specifications of larceny of military property, and two specifications of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 92, 107, 108, 120, 121, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Eric S. Powell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of fleeing apprehension, three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, three specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, one specification of negligent homicide, one specification of disorder and neglect, and one specification of disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 95, 112a, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 56 months and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 48 months.

On 09 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, PFC Jose F. Castaneda, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of false official statement in violation of Article 107, UCMJ. Contrary to his plea, the accused was convicted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge

sentenced the accused to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 11 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Joshua T. Binion, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of damaging non-military property, three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, three specifications of drunk and disorderly conduct, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 109, 128, and 134 UCMJ. The accused was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of damaging non-military property, one specification of simple assault, three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, two specifications of aggravated assault, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 109, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade E-3, to forfeit \$2,233.00 per month for 1 month, and to perform hard labor without confinement for 3 months.

On 11 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of seven specifications of sexual assault and one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 12 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Air Field, Hawaii, SGT Michael A. Horner, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of cruelty and maltreatment, and one specification of indecent conduct, in violation of Articles 93 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault and one specification of forcible sodomy, in violation of Articles 120 and 125, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Dale E. Long, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 18 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 15 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Gary W. Baugh, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to reprimanded and confined for 4 days. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 0 days.

On 17 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SFC Nicholas C. Edwards, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer and one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, in violation of Articles 90 and 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 4 months.

On 18 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Alec J. Olson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of a false official statement, two specifications of rape, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and in violation of Articles 107, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 8 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 18 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT Marcus S. Jones, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of disrespecting a noncommissioned officer, five specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Articles 90, 91, 112a, and 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 7 months.

On 18 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, CW3 John A. Grabowski, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of maltreatment, five specifications of abusive sexual contact, and two specifications of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 93, 120, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 90 and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 23 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, SPC Cristion A. Gordon, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to introduce a controlled substance onto a military installation, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, and one specification assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 81, 112a, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 15 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Lamont R. Holloway, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of insubordinate conduct, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of false official statement, six specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of malingering, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 91, 92, 107, 112a, and 115, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Air Field, Hawaii, SFC Corey L. Bruner, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of attempted armed robbery in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The accused was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted larceny, one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and six specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 80, 92, 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 27 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 25 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SFC Ladarius M. Purter, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of maltreatment and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 93 and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of attempted adultery and two specifications of indecent language in violation of Articles 80 and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of cruelty and maltreatment, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 93, 120, and 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-6, to forfeit \$2,000.00 pay per month for 3 months, and to perform hard labor without confinement for 3 months.

On 27 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC Christian R. Treb, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of child endangerment by culpable negligence resulting in harm in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to E-1, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 April 2019 at a special court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, SGT Charles T. Dalley, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 75 days

and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 30 days and no punitive discharge.

On 30 April 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SSG Justin F. Volkmuth, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of damaging non-military property, and one specification of assault, in violation of Articles 90, 109, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, two specifications of stalking, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 90, 120a, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 75 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SSG Ezequiel Pagan-Gonzalez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

### **Fifth Judicial Circuit**

On 01 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, SPC Brianna Jones, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her plea, of one specification of aggravated assault in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 2 months.

On 02 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, SPC Antonio D. Epps, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 20 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 05 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, SPC Michael P. Whiteeyes, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape of a child, and one specification of sexual abuse of a child in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 5 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 11 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Vicenza, Italy, a Sergeant was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of aggravated assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ.

On 12 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened in Stuttgart, Germany, SFC Patrick W. Fagan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted production of child pornography, five specifications of rape of a child, seven specifications of aggravated sexual contact with a child, nine specifications of rape of a child, three specifications of possession of child pornography, two specifications of distribution of child pornography, and three specifications of indecent language, in violation of Article 80, 120, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for life with the eligibility of parole, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As a part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 25 years.

On 16 April 2019 at a special court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, PVT Clyde R. Byrd, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of driving while impaired, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute, one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance to a military installation, and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 92, 111, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced the grade of E-1, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 7 months.

On 19 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SSG Christopher S. Dossett, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child, one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, one specification of attempt to commit a lewd act upon a child, one specification of attempted production of child pornography, and one specification of attempted adultery, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 2 years and 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 2 years.

On 30 April 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, PFC Stephen Britt, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of distribution of child pornography in violation of Articles 80 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and

allowances, to be confined for 20 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.
