

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 07 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PVT Tyre O. Morales, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to reduction to the grade of E-1, and forfeiture of \$500.00 pay per month for 2 months.

On 09 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SGT JoeJoshua K.K. Nobriga, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to 30 days hard labor without confinement.

On 10 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PFC Conner B. Hiser, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of disrespect to a superior commissioned officer, three specifications of wrongful broadcast of intimate visual images, one specification of aggravated assault with means likely to produce grievous bodily harm, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 89, 117, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 39 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 3 years.

On 15 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 21 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, a Private First Class, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of aggravated sexual contact, in violation of Articles 107, and 120, UCMJ.

On 29 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PFC Christian G. Hamley, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 29 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, Sergeant Clovis H. Castro, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Article 92, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 29 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Meade, Maryland, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ.

On 29 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PVT Brian C. Hotaling, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of child endangerment, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 02 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Nicholas A. Stewart, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of involuntary manslaughter of a child, in violation of Article 119, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of murder of a child, in violation of Article 118, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 10 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 06 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SFC Mark A. Delacruz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of false official statement, and three specifications of wrongful wear of an unauthorized military award or badge, in violation of Articles 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4.

On 06 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Jacob D. Meadors, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of drunk and reckless operation of a passenger car, one specification of robbery, and two specifications of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 113, 122, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced in rank to E-1, to forfeit \$800.00 pay per month for one month, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 07 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SFC Frederick O. Linderborn, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to report, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of driving under the influence, in violation of Articles 86, 90, and 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5, and to be confined for 15 days.

On 7 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Jacob J. Jones, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 5 months, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 4 months.

On 15 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PFC Terrance M. Gerald, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and four specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 86, 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 14 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, SSG Sven M. Council, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, one specification of cruelty and maltreatment, one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 90, 92, 93, 120, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 7 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 21 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Rucker, Alabama, SPC Irvin A. Torres, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to forfeit \$1,277.00 pay per month for 3 months.

On 29 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Derrick D. Jefferson, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Jonathan L. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of damaging property other than military property, two specifications of destroying non-military property, one specification of aggravated assault, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 109, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 01 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Evonquae R. Robinson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 27 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 06 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, SFC Aaron D. Jesko, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 7 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 08 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, SGT Juan R. Coloncordero, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 1 year, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 09 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, PVT Davin L. Anglin, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to E-1, to be confined 75 days for each specification, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 16 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, SGT Joseph P. Popp, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of abusive sexual contact in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to E1, to be confined for 1 year, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, the confinement was limited to 180 days.

On 17 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Marcus L. Quisenberry Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 20 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Andrew J. Mazor, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of desertion, one specification of absence without leave, and two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 85, 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 9 months.

On 21 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sam Houston, Texas, SGT Christopher C. Tate, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by battery upon a child, and two specifications of possessing child pornography, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 8 years.

On 29 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC Edward J. Loeve, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 51 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 30 days.

On 31 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Blake C. Raymond, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of kidnapping, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 31 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, PVT Dale M. Peterson, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion, and one specification of the wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 85, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 170 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 4 months.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 03 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Julian D. Wiggins, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 06 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Brandon E. Steffens, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, one specification of resisting apprehension, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and two specifications of disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 86, 89, 95, 112a, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SFC Johnny R. Wells, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, four specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 92, 112a, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 09 May 2019, at a general Court-Martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, SPC Jarrod D. Meaux, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of wrongfully recording the private areas of a victim without their knowledge or consent, in violation of Article 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SFC Robert J. Comingo, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of rape, one specification of sexual assault, one specification of assault consummated by battery, one specification of assault consummated by battery upon a child, one specification of adultery, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 23 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 13 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PVT Leah R. Shepard, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her plea, of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of maiming, in violation of Article 124, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 14 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, CW2 John F. Rindt III, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of aggravated sexual contact of a child and one specification of indecent act, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 11 years, and to be dismissed from the service. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 10 years.

On 15 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT Tyeisha D. Giles, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of three specifications of absence without leave, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of being disrespectful toward a noncommissioned officer, four specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 91, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT Cody J. Frey, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 3 months, to be confined for 100 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT Keshawn L. Dixon, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of wrongful broadcast of intimate visual images, in violation of Article 117a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, of one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, in violation of Article 89, UCMJ.

On 16 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT Fredrick D. Green, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of absence without leave, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of false official statement, and two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 107, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 121 days.

On 17 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Michael Q. Coffman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 121 days.

On 20 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Fernando A. Perez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 112a, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,120.00 pay per month for 10 months, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 181 days.

On 20 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Tyler D. Reed, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Articles 107, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 24 months.

On 20 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Marcos A. Lopes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 20 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC Randy T. Alexander, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of indecent recording, and five specifications of distribution of an indecent recording, in violation of Article 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis McChord, Washington, SFC Robert L. Sarver, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, and three specifications of violating a lawful order, in violation of Articles 86, and 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 40 days.

On 22 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Foster, Japan, PVT Tykeem J. Canty, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of extortion, in violation of Article 127, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 21 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 23 May 2019, at a general Court-Martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, PVT Samuel W. Lester, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 24 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, a Captain, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members, of one specification of dereliction of duty, and one specification of false official statement, in violation of Articles 92, and 107, UCMJ.

On 24 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SGT William I. Kido-Eli, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of false official statement, five specifications of selling military property, and ten specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 107, 108, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 28 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Jeremy L. Kear, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault of a child, and one specification of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 38 years, to forfeit all pay and allowances, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 25 years.

On 30 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Henry, Republic of Korea, SPC Dayvon T. Branch, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 22 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 01 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SSG Marlin J. Fuller, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, one specification of maltreatment, three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 92, 93, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 14 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 08 May 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SGT Kojo A. Acquaye, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of seven specifications of false official statement, and three specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 107, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to E-4, to be fined \$20,000.00, and to be confined for 6 months. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 179 days.

On 12 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, SSG Antonio Ruelas, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general order, one specification of false official statement, and one specification of indecent visual recording, in violation of Articles 92, 107, and 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 13 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, MAJ Joachim G. Eitenmiller, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of maltreatment, in violation of Article 93, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$2,000.00 pay per month for 6 months, and to be confined for 6 months. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 183 days.

On 15 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, PFC Jaylan M. Cole, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 1 year, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 16 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, CPT Michael A. Camarillo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of conduct unbecoming an officer and a gentleman, in violation of Articles 128, and 133, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 20 May 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Wiesbaden, Germany, PFC Emilio A. Vazquez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of distribution of child pornography, and one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 4 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 40 months.

On 31 May 2019, at a general Court-Martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, of one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ.
