

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 31 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Kyle B. Miller, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual abuse of a child, one specification of simple assault, and three specifications of assault consummated by battery upon a child, in violation of Articles 120b, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempt of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Articles 80, and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 24 months.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 02 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SSG Jeremiah S. Pratis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, one specification of possessing, receiving, and viewing child pornography, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 120b, and Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of sexual assault of a child, and two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 2 years, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 03 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGT Joeclark M. Ithenya, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to perform 45 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 11 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SSG Stephen D. Penrod, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to perform 90 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 12 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of drunken operation of a motor vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ.

On 16 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 17 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 23 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Christiana F. Haviland, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, five specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful appropriation of a motor vehicle, in violation of Articles 86, 112a, 121, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of sexual assault, and four specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 25 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Zachary O. Hannah, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 29 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PVT Dylanmichael R. McKeag, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of breach of restriction, one specification of incapacitation for duty from drug use, two specifications of drunken or reckless operation of a vehicle, and one specification of drunk and disorderly, in violation of Articles 87b, 112, 113, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$1,120.00 pay per month for 2 months, to be confined for 16 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 31 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Travis D. Cook, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of extortion, in violation of Article 127, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 5 months.

On 31 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SPC Phillip E. Thompson, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of premeditated murder, in violation of Article 118, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for life with the eligibility for parole, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 40 years.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 09 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV2 Derek A. Moody, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of aggravated assault, and two specifications of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 90, 128, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 15 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Matthew B. Dubberly, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 20 days.

On 11 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SPC David T. Tillman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of simple assault, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 months.

On 11 July 2019, on remand at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SFC James E. Hopkins, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, and three specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Articles 120, and 120b, UCMJ. Previously, on 24 November 2014, at a general court martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SFC James Hopkins, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of rape of a child, one specification of indecent act, one

specification of providing alcohol to minors, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 120, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of producing and possessing child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. Based on both the 2019 and 2014 convictions, the military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 24 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 18 years.

On 26 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, PVT Kevin S. Arce, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Article 115, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault, and one specification of simple assault, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Austin P. Sauls, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to E-1, to be confined for 125 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Joshua M. Canavier, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to report, one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, and four specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 20 days.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 02 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Elijah A. Macias, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of leaving the scene of a vehicle accident, and one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Articles 111, and 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 03 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SGT Marcus B. Ariza, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ. The

military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 13 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Anthony E. Prettyman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of maltreatment, and two specifications of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Articles 93, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 150 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 11 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SSG Justin M. Kelly, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of dereliction of duty, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5, and to perform 11 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 16 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, CPT Andrew B. Stomski, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 4 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 16 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PFC Jimmy Li, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion, and one specification of wrongfully possessing and viewing child pornography, in violation of Articles 85, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 17 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Deven L. Vandeneynde, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempt to distribution of child pornography, and one specification of possessing, receiving, and viewing child pornography, in violation of Articles 80, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 36 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 months.

On 17 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, PV2 Jonathan J. Lehr, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general order, one specification of false official statement, one specification of provoking speech, and two specifications of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Articles 92, 107, 117, and 128. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 18 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Joshua Martinez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of indecent viewing, one specification of wrongful possession of child pornography, one specification of soliciting another to commit an offense, and one specification of indecent language, in violation of Articles 120c, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 11 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 5 years.

On 23 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PV2 Duncan M. Larrow, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and one specification of communicating indecent language to a child, in violation of Articles 86, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 300 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 180 days.

On 23 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Christopher H. Hogan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, and two specifications of the wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of damaging non-military property, and eight specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 109, and 128, UCMJ.

On 24 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, CW2 Christopher M. Vessichelli, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, six specifications of wearing unauthorized insignia, and three specifications of reckless endangerment, in violation of Articles 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 4 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 26 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, MSG Justin R. Wolfe, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, one specification of a false official statement, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 92, 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited reduction to the grade of E-6.

On 30 July 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Bryon E. Doncouse, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion, and one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Articles 85, and 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 68 days.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 03 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SGT William E. Marilley, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of indecent conduct, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of aggravated sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 09 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, PV2 Tynaji V. Brown, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault of a child, one specification of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of viewing child pornography, in violation of Articles 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 10 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Arifjan, Kuwait, MSG Lavance E. Payne, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of violation of a general regulation, one specification of extortion, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 92, 127, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to grade of E-6, to forfeit \$2,000.00 pay per month for 5 months, and to be confined for 5 months.

On 23 July 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Rose Barracks, Germany, SSG Joshua L. Carter, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, two specifications of viewing child pornography, and two specifications of possessing child

pornography, in violation of Articles 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

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
