

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 01 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, SFC Gautrelle Spears, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of maltreatment, and one specification of false official statement, in violation of Articles 92, 93, and 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6, and to be confined for 3 months.

On 07 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer and enlisted members of one specification of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ.

On 13 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SSG Jaqushia J. Buddie, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to her pleas, of one specification of assault upon a person in the execution of law enforcement duties, and one specification of obstruction of justice in violation, of Articles 128, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to E-4, and to be confined for 4 months.

On 15 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PV2 Leeroy M. Sigrah, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 12 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 16 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Meade, Maryland, SFC James H. Taulbee, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, three specifications of maltreatment, and one specification of false official statement, in violation of Articles 92, 93, and 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for 3 months, and to perform 90 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 27 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SSG John A. Howard, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of attempted sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted indecent language, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 17 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 27 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PVT Tyler J. Cabrera, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of absence without leave, and two specifications of the wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement disapproved any amount of confinement.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 06 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Salvador M. Donida, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of sexual assault of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 7 years.

On 07 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, SFC Alan D. Ross, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of adultery, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 08 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PVT Louis F. Espinosa III, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of incapacitation for duty from drug use, and one specification of preventing the seizure of authorized property, in violation of Articles 112 and 131e, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of a violation of a lawful general regulation, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 141 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 09 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, SSG Braxtyn L. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, one specification of maltreatment, one specification of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 92,

93, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 120 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 14 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, a Captain, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 27 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Antoine Bychurch, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, one specification of willfully disobeying a lawful command, one specification of assault, and two specifications of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Articles 89, 90, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, SGT Vali N. Johnson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of two specifications of failure to go to appointed place of duty, one specification of absence without leave, three specifications of false official statement, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 86, 107, 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 193 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 28 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, SSG Eric M. Driscoll, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 5 months.

On 28 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PVT Dante J. Vannuck, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 92, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 135 days.

On 30 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Jeremiah S. Garcia, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of involuntary manslaughter, one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 119, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of maiming, in violation of Article 124, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 6 years, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 06 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Nathen E. Fielder, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of assault consummated by a battery upon a child, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy, in violation of Article 81, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 06 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, CPT Erik M. Garrett, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of adultery, in violation of Articles 120, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be dismissed from the service.

On 13 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of distributing a controlled substance, one specification of rape of a child, three specifications of sexual assault of a child, two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 112a, 120b, and 134, UCMJ.

On 14 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, PVT Zacharia B. Nebeker, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful possession with intent to distribute a controlled substance, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 14 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SGT Michael C. Walther, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of false official statement, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Articles 107, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 16 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, SGM Philip D. Pennington, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of sodomy, and two specifications of indecent acts or liberties with a child, in violation of Articles 125, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined

for 17 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 7 years.

On 28 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual assault, and one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 28 August 2018, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, SPC Hanna M. Woods, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, seven specifications of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and two specifications of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 81, 92, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 29 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, CW2 Abdul M. Shuford, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of attempted indecent recording, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 3 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 29 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Romeo E. Aguillon, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of the wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be confined for 16 days.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 01 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Justin S. Foster, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of maltreatment, and two specifications of assault, in violation of Articles 93, and 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-5, to forfeit \$300.00 pay per month for 2 months, to be restricted for 45 days, and to perform 45 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 02 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, CW3 Richard L. Livingston, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of false official statement, two specifications of assault consummated by battery, one specification of conduct unbecoming of an officer and gentleman, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 90, 107, 128, 133, and 134, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military panel

composed of officer members of four specifications of assault upon a commissioned officer, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of rape, one specification of sexual assault, one specification of aggravated sexual contact, three specifications of conduct unbecoming of an officer and gentleman, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 120, 133, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of assault upon a commissioned officer, one specification of communicating a threat, and one specification of kidnapping, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 17 years, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 02 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC James T. Richardson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 50 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 06 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Richard L. Murray, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey an order, two specifications of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 92, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 11 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 07 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, CPT Antonio Chavez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of nine specifications of indecent conduct with a child, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 24 years, and to be dismissed from the service. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 15 years.

On 07 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Huachuca, Arizona, PVT Shannon V. Gilday, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of striking a noncommissioned officer, in violation of Article 91, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, forfeiture of \$1000.00 pay per month for 3 months, and to be confined for 3 months.

On 09 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, Private First Class Deandre L. Kirby, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 75 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 45 days.

On 12 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Brian K. Bowman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of child endangerment, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 75 days.

On 13 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 13 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PVT Dautrail Peppers, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of absence without leave, one specification of escape from custody, one specification of striking a non-commissioned officer, one specification of disrespecting a non-commissioned officer, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 86, 87a, 91, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, 2LT Tchounke M. Ngwameni, was convicted by a military panel composed of officer members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of adultery, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to forfeit \$1,000.00 of pay per month for 9 months.

On 15 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, PVT Mark A. Haygood, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of ten specifications of absence without leave, one specification of disrespect toward a commissioned officer, two specifications of disobeying a commissioned officer, two specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, eight specifications of insubordinate conduct toward a non-commissioned officer, one specification of damage to non-military property, and one specification of disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 86, 89, 90, 91, 92, 109, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of burglary, in violation of Articles 128b, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 288 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 15 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SGT Jonathan P. Paplia, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of the wrongful use of a controlled

substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 16 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Joshua C. Beckhart, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a general regulation, three specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, and two specifications of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PVT Malik A. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of disobeying a superior commissioned officer, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, and one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 90, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, 1LT Joel R. Lester, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of absence without leave, two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and five specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, 90, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 13 months, and to be dismissed from service. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 4 months and 1 day.

On 27 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Foster, Japan, PV2 Devon M. Alvis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of failure to obey a lawful order, one specification of failure to obey a general order, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 92, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 60 days.

On 28 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Brandon Sicklinger, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of disrespect toward a superior officer, two specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, three specifications of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, four specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 89, 112a, and 115, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 15 months, and to be

discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 12 months.

On 29 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SPC Oscar Juarez-Guzman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of assault upon a person in the execution of law enforcement duties, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 150 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 30 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PV2 Manuel B. Castro, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault, and one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 3 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 07 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Kaiserslautern, Germany, SPC Jevante T. Jackson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 22 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 18 months.

On 12 August 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Wiesbaden, Germany, MSG Justin L. Glover, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of assault, and one specification of drunk and disorderly, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade E-6, and to be confined for 6 months.

On 14 August 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SPC Dearies A. Robinson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 107, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to grade of E-1, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.
