

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 15 October 2016, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SSG Sean T. Hayes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of battery upon a child, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 2 years, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SPC Terrence Alfred A. Lapitan, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and three specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Articles 90, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 9 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 42 months.

On 17 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Meade, Maryland, CPT Jose A. Real, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, one specification of perjury, three specifications of conduct unbecoming an officer, two specifications of adultery, and one specification of conduct being to the prejudice of good order and discipline in the armed forces and of a nature to bring discredit upon the armed forces, in violation of Articles 107, 131, 133, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days, and to be dismissed from the service. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement disapproved any adjudged dismissal from service.

On 23 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Matthew J. Lewandowski, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of aggravated assault upon a child, and one specification of disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 89, 90, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 44 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 30 months.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 01 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Luis J. Avalos, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The

military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 03 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SSG Wesley B. Rivera, United States Army, was convicted, by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of willfully disobeying a lawful order, in violation of Article 91, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of aggravated assault, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to be reduced to the grade of E-5.

On 04 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PVT Reo K. Ramirez, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of kidnapping, two specifications of aggravated assault, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 125, and 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 07 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SSG Riggie S. Escomiendo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 45 days.

On 08 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Private, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 09 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PFC Branden J. Middleton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, and one specification of speeding, in violation of Articles 113, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 3 days.

On 09 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Elijah Z. Sajia, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of larceny, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of larceny, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 30 days.

On 09 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PV2 Cristian Z. Corona, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated sexual contact, one specification of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 120, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Valerie T. Jennings, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to pay the United States a fine of \$125.00.

On 11 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SSG Robert C. McKee, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of absence without leave, two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of failure to obey an order, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 86, 90, 92, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 36 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 365 days.

On 15 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Johnathon C. Mitchell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of absence without leave, four specifications of insubordinate conduct toward a noncommissioned officer, one specification of failure to obey an order, three specifications of communicating a threat, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 86, 91, 92, 115, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 180 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 16 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Christopher Johnson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 16 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, SGT Shayne M. Henry, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of rape, and one specification of aggravated sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 18 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV2 Juan G. Ortiz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of missing movement, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of larceny, one specification of burglary, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 81, 87, 112a, 121, 129, and 131b. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 18 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PVT Tydarrion McMeans, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of resisting apprehension, two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, three specifications of disrespect to a superior noncommissioned officer, one specification of disobeying a lawful order, and one specification of assault consummated by battery in violation of Articles 87a, 90, 91, 92, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of absence without leave, and one specification of disrespect to a superior noncommissioned officer, in violation of Articles 86, and 91, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined to 150 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Mitchell J. Houtz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of burglary, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 81, 121, and 129, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 65 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 22 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Robert L. Barnett III, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of viewing child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge of one specification of desertion, and one specification of production of child pornography, in violation of Articles 85, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 11 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 22 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV2 Mason S. Kuntz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of spoilage of non-military property, and one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Articles 109, and 113, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of drunk and disorderly, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$344.00, and to be confined for 21 days.

On 22 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ.

On 24 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, PV2 Donovan M. Cortez-Tamez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to forfeit \$175.00 per month for 3 months.

On 25 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Daniel F. Parades, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of larceny, and one specification of making a fraudulent claim, in violation of Articles 121, and 132, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of larceny, and one specification of making a fraudulent claim, in violation of Articles 121, and 132, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 5 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 28 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Chance Z. Misukaitis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of child endangerment, in violation of Article 119b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 90 days.

On 30 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PFC Jermell K. Reid, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 69 days, and to be discharged with a bad-conduct discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 01 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Eduardo I. Olivera, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of absence without leave, and three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 180 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 08 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SSG Aaron L. Hutti, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of child endangerment, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of

Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to be confined for 4 months.

On 09 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 10 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at JBSA Fort Sam Houston, Texas, SFC Stephen L.D. Eisele, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of kidnapping, in violation of Articles 90, 92, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, one specification of stalking, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of kidnapping, in violation of Articles 92, 120a, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6, and to be confined for 165 days.

On 22 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at JBSA Fort Sam Houston, Texas, CPT Jesus M. Pereira, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 30 days, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 25 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ.

On 29 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SGT Nicholas R. Purcell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of five specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 16 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 01 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PV2 Ryan M. McMullen, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of simple arson, in violation of Article

126, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 48 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 01 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, a Private, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 02 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, a Private First Class, was acquitted by a military judge of three specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 08 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Justin D. Golden, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of false official statement, one specification of wrongful appropriation, one specification of forgery-uttering, and one specification of fraud against the United States, in violation of Articles 107, 121, 123, and 132, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of larceny, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 40 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Nicolas W. Cassell, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of four specifications of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, two specifications of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 22 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Austin K. White, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SPC Brian W. Adams, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of communicating a threat, one specification of aggravated assault, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 115, 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of wrongful broadcast of an intimate image, one specification of wrongful appropriation, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 117a, 121, and 128, UCMJ. The

military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 40 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 30 months.

On 10 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, PFC Alexander L. Haugabook was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault upon a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 15 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT Atipopo S. Tino, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of fleeing apprehension, three specifications of violating a general regulation, two specifications of communicating a threat, one specification of provoking speech, five specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and two specifications of drunk and disorderly, in violation of Articles 87a, 92, 115, 117, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 144 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 16 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Brandon M. Foster, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, four specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and two specifications of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 113, 128, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 190 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 9 months.

On 16 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PVT Antee A. Gravette, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 15 days.

On 16 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Elmendorf-Richardson, Alaska, PFC Jerrica C. Daniels, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of two specifications of larceny of military property, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 25 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 17 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Charles T. Gary, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempted rape of a child, one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child, one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, and one specification of communicating indecent language, in violation of Articles 80, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 17 October 2019, at a special court-martial, convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PFC Andrew F. Langston-March, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of possession of a controlled substance, one specification of use of a controlled substance, and three specifications of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Articles 112a, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, to be confined for 135 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 23 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PFC Jacob Weber, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of attempted sexual assault of a child, and one specification of attempted sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be confined for 38 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 24 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, CPT Richard E. Rasmussen was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to no punishment.

On 25 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PVT Cody W. Connell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of insubordinate conduct toward a noncommissioned officer, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 91, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 22 days.

On 28 October 2019, at a special court-martial consisting of a military judge alone convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SGT Kion T. Wrather, United States Army, was convicted by the military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specifications of failure to report, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge of one specification of failure to report, and two specifications of false official statement, in violation of Articles 86, and 107, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, and to perform hard labor without confinement for 21 days.

On 30 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Jeffery C. Utsumi, United States Army, was convicted by a military

judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 31 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Alan I. Cespedes-Marino, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of possessing child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 3 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 01 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SPC Kenneth L. Leras, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of communicating a threat, one specification of domestic violence, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 115, 128b, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 04 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SPC Joshua L. Wright, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of the wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of patronizing a prostitute, in violation of Articles 112a, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be confined for 5 months.

On 09 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SGT James D. Washington, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of maltreatment, and one specification of indecent viewing, in violation of Articles 93, and 120c, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 179 days.

On 18 October 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SPC Ernesto A. Marquez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of aggravated assault, and one specification of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 8 months.

On 30 October 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Wiesbaden, Germany, a Master Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of larceny, in violation of Article 121, UCMJ.

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
