

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 06 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PVT Kevin L. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of aggravated assault, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 90 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, PV2 William W.T. Lemons, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 4 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, SGT Kyrell J. Stewart, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of larceny, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 86, 121, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for twenty days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 11 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, and conducted at Joint Base Langley-Eustis, Virginia, PV2 Chevy J. Wright, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of conspiracy, and two specifications of violating a lawful general regulation, in violation of Articles 81, and 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 13 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, SSG Chavis Watson, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-5, and to perform 90 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 17 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SSG Scott Chesney, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of distribution of child pornography, in violation of Articles 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 17 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Drum, New York, PFC Nicholas D. Hayes, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of three specifications of attempted sexual abuse of a child, and two specifications of attempted indecent language communicated to another, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 21 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 18 December 2019, on remand at a general court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Anthony R. Clark II, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of aggravated sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. Previously, on 28 April 2016, at a general court martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SPC Anthony R. Clark II, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of indecent exposure, and one specification of indecent viewing, in violation of Article 120c, UCMJ. Based on both the 2019 and 2016 convictions, the military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 9 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 6 years.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 02 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Timothy Barr, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of two specifications of conspiracy to commit larceny, and five specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 81, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade to E-1, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 03 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, PV2 Carlos Solis-Rodriguez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge of one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 240 days.

On 04 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Sagar Patel, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of possession of controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E1, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Jon A. Childs, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongfully receiving and viewing child pornography, and one specifications of the wrongful possession of child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 25 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 10 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 11 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, PVT Atlantis B. Leech, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to her pleas, of one specification of flight from apprehension, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of assault upon a person in the execution of law enforcement duties, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of articles 87a, 112a, 128, and 131b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of attempted murder, and two specifications of violation of a lawful general regulation, in violation of articles 80, and 92 UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 2 years and 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SFC Justin S. McKinnon, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, and two specifications of maltreatment, in violation of Articles 89, and 93, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to perform 30 days of hard labor without confinement, to be confined for 14 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 13 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Private First Class, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of rape, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 18 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGT Juan J. Perez, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of abusive

sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 09 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SSG Ralph J. Sutton, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of willful disobedience of a superior commissioned officer, one specification of destruction of private property, four specifications of assault consummated by battery, one specification of simple assault, two specifications of domestic violence, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 90, 109, 128, 128b, and 131b, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, one specification of rape, two specifications of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of child endangerment, in violation of Articles 120, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be confined for 54 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 09 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PV2 Tyler S. Marquette, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Articles 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 10 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, SPC Kyle A. Curry, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of resisting apprehension, one specification of aggravated assault, one specification of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 87a, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of communicating a threat, and one specification of simple assault, in violation of Articles 115, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to forfeit \$500.00 pay per month for 2 months, and to be restricted to the confines of Fort Sill, Oklahoma for 2 months.

On 17 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Shemed A. Fata, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a commissioned officer, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of obstruction of justice, in violation of Articles 90, 112a, 128, and 131b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 205 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 18 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leonard Wood, Missouri, PFC Ahmad R. Alhadi, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of disobeying a lawful order, and three specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Articles 90, and 120b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 23 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 18 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Richard A. Feliz-Cullers, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of desertion, one specification of larceny, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of house breaking, in violation of Articles 81, 85, 121, 128, and 130, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of burglary, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 129, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 41 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 24 months.

On 18 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, SGT Christopher L. Wilfork, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to no punishment.

On 19 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, a Major, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officer members of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 20 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PVT Jeffery L. Diaz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 20 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, and three specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 90, and 128, UCMJ.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 02 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PV2 Geremi R. J. Pierce, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy to commit sexual

assault, one specification of desertion, two specifications of sexual assault, and two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Articles 81, 85 and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 03 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, SPC Aaron M. Bryant, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of animal abuse, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 190 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 04 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, SGT Winston Cooper, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 60 days.

On 04 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, MAJ Stephen P. Corpus, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of five specifications of violating a lawful general regulation, and one specification of fraternization, in violation of Articles 92, 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to be confined for 22 days.

On 04 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, PFC Rashaun A. Pires, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to report, one specification of disrespect towards a superior commissioned officer, and one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, 89, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$800.00 pay per month for 3 months, to be confined for 75 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 05 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PFC Corey L. Burkes, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of three specifications of the wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of the wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of two specifications of failure to obey a general order, one specification of aggravated assault, one specification of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of drunk and disorderly conduct, in violation of Articles 92, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be discharged from the service with a bad conduct discharge.

On 05 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PV2 Miguel A. Cummings, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of dereliction of duty, two specifications of false official statement, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 92, 107, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 80 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 06 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PVT Devon W. Kampmann, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of larceny, in violation of Articles 86, 112a, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 8 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 180 days.

On 06 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specification of attempted abusive sexual contact, four specifications of maltreatment, three specifications of abusive sexual contact, and one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Articles 80, 93, 120, and 128, UCMJ.

On 10 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Patrick J. Roehrs, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of rape, and one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 120 and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 5 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 48 months.

On 10 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Irwin, California, PV2 Nicholas A. Bond, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion terminated by apprehension, one specification of committing a lewd act upon a child, and one specification of possession/viewing of child pornography, in violation of Articles 85, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 34 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 11 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of three specifications of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 128, and 131b, UCMJ.

On 12 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT William J. Gardner, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of nine specifications of absence without leave, six specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and two specifications of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 86, 112a, and 115, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of disrespecting a noncommissioned officer, in violation of Article 91, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 169 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SSG Manuel Torres, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of violating a lawful general regulation, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of aggravated assault, and two specifications of domestic violence, in violation of Articles 128, and 128b, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to be reduced to the grade of E-5.

On 18 December 2019, at a general court-martial convened at Wheeler Army Airfield, Hawaii, SFC Thomas M. Gillis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of thirteen specifications of wrongfully communicating classified information, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E1, to be confined for 15 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge. As part of an offer to plead guilty, a pretrial agreement limited confinement to 3 years.

On 19 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, PVT Logan M. McGee, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of absence without leave, and one specification of disrespect toward a superior commissioned officer, in violation of Articles 86, and 89, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members of one specifications of absence without leave, one specification of disrespecting a superior commissioned officer, one specification of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of disrespecting a superior noncommissioned officer, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of reckless operation of a vehicle, and two specifications of communicating a threat, in violation of Articles 86, 89, 90, 91, 113, 112a, and 115, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of assault on a superior commissioned officer, in violation of Article 89, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 102 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 19 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PFC Jeremy K. Crawford, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of assault consummated by

a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of communicating a threat, and two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 115, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 14 days.

On 20 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, a Staff Sergeant, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of attempt to violate a lawful general regulation, in violation of Article 80, UCMJ.

On 30 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SGT Cody W. Enneking, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of damaging military property, one specification of wrongfully leaving the scene of an accident, and one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Articles 108, 111, and 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-4, to be fined \$365.00, and to be confined for 45 days.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 03 December 2019, at a special court-martial convened at Ansbach, Germany, SPC Justice J. Gipson, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, one specification of driving while impaired, and one specification of assault upon a person in the execution of civilian law enforcement duties, in violation of Articles 112a, 113, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.
