MEMORANDUM FOR Commander, 519th Hospital Center

SUBJECT: Authorized Insignia for the 519th Hospital Center

1. The following heraldic items are authorized for the 519th Hospital Center, effective 16 September 2020.

a. A distinctive unit insignia with description and symbolism as follows:

DESCRIPTION

A silver metal and epoxied shield shaped device 1 1/4 inch (3.18cm) in height blazoned as follows: Per pale Argent and Gules, in sinister a fleur-de-lis Argent (Silver), in dexter a cross Gules, in pale ascending from base a contrail terminating to an arrow Azure, point to chief, charged by a mullet in base of the third. Attached below the shield, a silver scroll inscribed "LIFELINE FOR STRENGTH" in Red.

SYMBOLISM

The shield is symbolic of the strength displayed through military service. The colors red, white, and blue suggest the national colors of the United States. The fleur-de-lis denotes the unit's history in the U.S. Army Europe Communications Zone (USAREUR COMMZ). To the left of the shield is a red cross on a white field, which refers to the coat of arms of Rhineland-Pfalz, Germany. The red cross further alludes to the unit's mission in medical care. The blue arrow reflects the heritage of the parent unit, the 819th Hospital Center, while the silver star commemorates the campaign credit earned in World War II (Rhineland).

b. Distinguishing colors IAW AR 840-10.

4. All manufacturing tools (hubs and dies) will be maintained by The Institute of Heraldry (TIOH) as part of our quality assurance program. In addition, TIOH retains a permanent record of the approved design and all correspondence for future reference. A set of standard DUI samples with procurement instructions and a list of our certified manufacturers was previously sent to the POC and mailing address on record.

5. This authorization is in accordance with AR 670-1, AR 840-10 and United States Army Europe Permanent Order No. 59-3, dated 28 February 2019. A copy of this letter will become part of your permanent organizational history files.

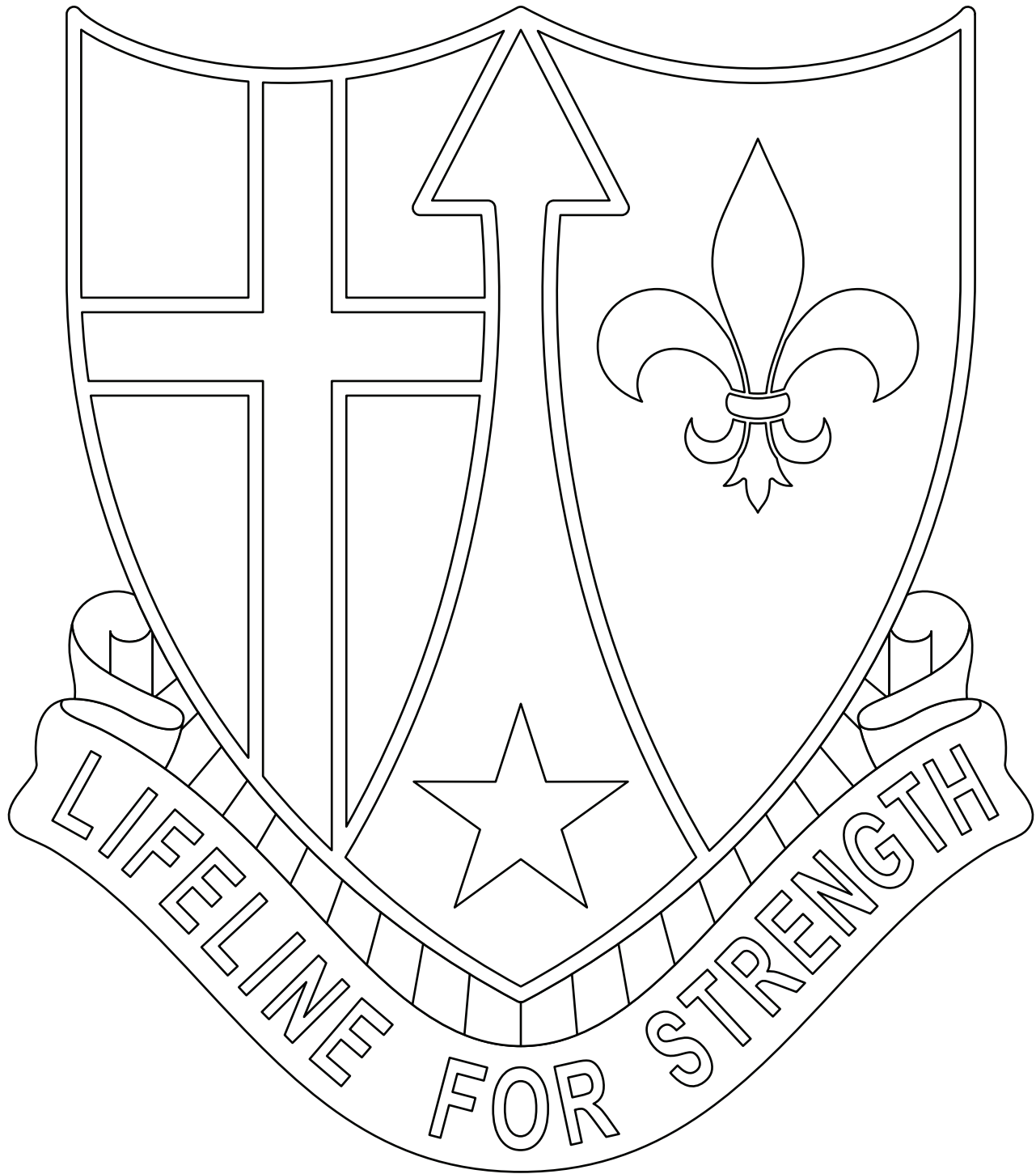

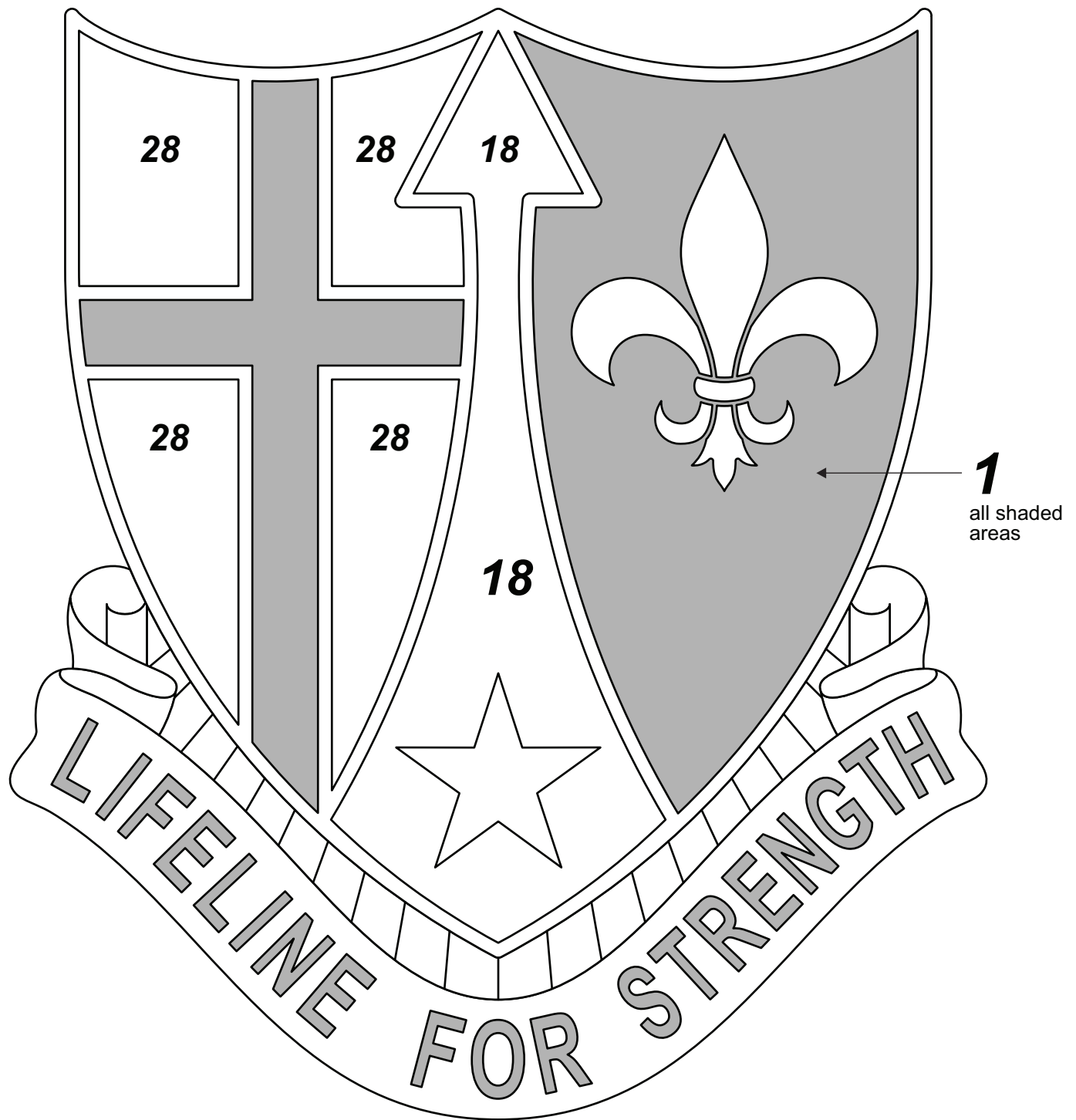

DISTINCTIVE UNIT INSIGNIA

Description. A silver metal and epoxied shield shaped device 1 1/4 inch (3.18cm) in height blazoned as follows: Per pale Argent and Gules, in sinister a fleur-de-lis Argent (Silver), in dexter a cross Gules, in pale ascending from base a contrail terminating to an arrow Azure, point to chief, charged by a mullet in base of the third. Attached below the shield, a silver scroll inscribed “**LIFELINE FOR STRENGTH**” in Red.

Symbolism. The shield is symbolic of the strength displayed through military service. The colors red, white, and blue suggest the national colors of the United States. The fleur-de-lis denotes the unit’s history in the U.S. Army Europe Communications Zone (USAREUR COMMZ). To the left of the shield is a red cross on a white field, which refers to the coat of arms of Rhineland-Pfalz, Germany. The red cross further alludes to the unit’s mission in medical care. The blue arrow reflects the heritage of the parent unit, the 819th Hospital Center, while the silver star commemorates the campaign credit earned in World War II (Rhineland).

Background. The distinctive unit insignia for the 519th Hospital Center was approved on 11 May 2020.

10. Upon Activation or 30 days prior to activation the unit will coordinate with the servicing USAG Official Mail and Distribution Center to receive the unit number in order to complete the addressing for the organization.
11. Unit Status Reporting:
 - a. USR reporting begins with the October 2020 reporting Cycle.
 - b. If the unit cannot report C3 (P3, S3, R3, T3) at activation, the unit will report C-5 until such time that the unit attains a minimum level of 3 in all measured areas (P, S, R, T) or for a period not to exceed 1 year (October 2020 – September 2021).
 - c. If the unit is unable to report level of 3 in all resource areas at the end of the C5 reporting period, the unit will then report the NetUSR calculated levels with appropriate comments.
 - d. Units will use the applicable reason code(s), and provide comments to explain the action(s) that cause the unit to report less than level 3 in all measured areas, and a projected date that the unit will achieve Level 3 or higher.
 - e. During the C-5 reporting period the unit commander is not allowed to subjectively upgrade the overall rating.
