

Summarized Report of Results of Trial

First Judicial Circuit

On 12 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Meade, Maryland, PFC Carlos Muniz Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of violation of a lawful command, in violation of Article 90, UCMJ. Contrary to his pleas, the accused was convicted by a military judge of five specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 2 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 13 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Campbell, Kentucky, SGT Rickey D. Nichols, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of dereliction of duty, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of dereliction of duty, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to perform 45 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 18 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Lee, Virginia, SSG Fernando J. Quinones-Colon, Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of violating a lawful general order, one specification of a prohibited act with specially protected junior member of the armed forces, one specification of false official statement, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 92, 93a, 107, and 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of violating a lawful general order, and one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 92, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 18 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Knox, Kentucky, SSG David N. Mayhugh, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful general regulation, and one specification of indecent conduct, and in violation of Articles 92, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of indecent exposure, in violation of Article 120c, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, to be confined for 5 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Second Judicial Circuit

On 11 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, PVT Noah C. Davis, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of three specifications of abusive sexual contact, in violation of

Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Corporal was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of aggravated sexual contact, one specification of abusive sexual contact, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, and one specification of assault, in violation of Articles 120, and 128, UCMJ.

On 12 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Jackson, South Carolina, SFC Robert E. Bethea, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of violating a lawful general regulation, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of disobeying a noncommissioned officer, one specification of a prohibited act with specially protected junior member of the armed forces, one specification of false official statement, and one specification of extramarital conduct, in violation of Articles 91, 93a, 107, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-6.

On 13 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGT Shaquille D. Craig, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of failure to obey a lawful order, two specifications of premeditated murder, and two specifications of obstructing justice, in violation of Articles 92, 118, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of stalking, in violation of Article 120a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for life without the possibility of parole, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 14 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, SSG Michael P. Poindexter Jr., United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of rape of a child, and two specifications of sexual abuse of a child, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 4 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 19 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Benning, Georgia, 2LT Arthur C. Lynch, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, and to forfeit \$1,000.00 pay per month for 3 months.

On 21 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Stewart, Georgia, SGT Brandin J. Byers, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of willfully disobeying a

superior commissioned officer, one specification of a false official statement, one specification of larceny of military property, one specification of selling military property, two specifications of adultery, and two specifications of furnishing alcohol to persons under 21 years of age, in violation of Articles 81, 90, 107, 108, 121, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of two specifications of attempting to possess child pornography, one specification of wrongful broadcast of intimate images, one specification of indecent viewing, one specification of broadcasting an indecent viewing, two specifications of indecent language, one specification of possessing child pornography, and one specification of distributing child pornography, in violation of Articles 80, 117a, 120c, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, total forfeiture of all pay and allowances, to be confined for 12 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SPC Sang H. Do, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, and one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 80, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to be confined for 31 days.

On 25 February 2020, at special court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ.

On 27 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, SGT Brandon A. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, and to forfeit all pay and allowances for one month.

On 27 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bragg, North Carolina, a Specialist, was acquitted by a military judge of one specification of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

Third Judicial Circuit

On 11 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SGT Jared D. Pakeman, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of child endangerment, one specification of simple assault, and one specification of assault by battery, in violation of Articles 119b, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 18 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 12 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Polk, Louisiana, SPC Zachary D. Miner, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 1 year, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 19 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, CPL Brandon K. Raspberry, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of resisting apprehension, one specification of disrespect toward a noncommissioned officer, one specification of damaging nonmilitary property, and one specification of assault by battery, in violation of Articles 87a, 91, 109, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be confined for 27 days.

On 20 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Hood, Texas, PFC Demetrius J. Slaughter, United States Army, was convicted, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of aggravated assault and one specification of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of three specifications of assault consummated by battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 120 days and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 26 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, SPC Kenneth J. Strunz, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 26 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, PFC Steve A. Levrie Pena, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 100 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 26 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, PVT Alejandro Rufino-Gonzalez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of wrongful introduction of a controlled substance onto a military installation, one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, and one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit \$1,154.00 pay per month for 6 months, to be confined for 6 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Riley, Kansas, PVT Damien D. Marshall, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to

his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 50 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

Fourth Judicial Circuit

On 11 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SSG Shane S. Smith, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his plea, of one specification of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Article 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to grade of E-4, and to perform 45 days of hard labor without confinement.

On 12 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Christopher S. Crotty, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his plea, of one specification of communicating a threat, in violation of Article 115, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be confined for 9 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 13 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, MAJ Jeffrey I. Jaramillo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, one specification of escape from confinement, one specification of destroying non-military property, seven specifications of assault consummated by battery, and one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Articles 86, 87a, 109, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 26 months, and to be dismissed from the service.

On 18 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Torrian D. Ollie, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of absence without leave terminated by apprehension, in violation of Articles 86, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 18 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, PV2 Christopher A. Nall, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, one specification of false official statement, and four specifications of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Articles 90, 107, and 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 21 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 19 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, PFC Dontaye M. Daniels, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of aggravated assault, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit \$1,155.40 pay per month for 2 months, and to be confined for 60 days.

On 19 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SGT Raymundo Solorzano, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of damage to nonmilitary property, two specifications of assault consummated by a battery, one specification of simple assault, and one specification of drunk and disorderly, in violation of Articles 109, 128, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 130 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 20 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PFC Daniel Browning, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, contrary to his pleas, of one specification of false official statement, one specification of sexual assault, and one specification of abusive sexual contact, in violation of Articles 107, and 120, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 7 years, and to be discharged from service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 20 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Camp Humphreys, Republic of Korea, SSG Aaron L. Hill, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of violation of a lawful general regulation, in violation of Article 92, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reprimanded.

On 21 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PV2 Darian C. Andrews, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of indecent language, and three specifications of indecent conduct, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 45 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SPC Travis M. Murphy, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his plea, of one specification of assault consummated by a battery, in violation of Article 128, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 30 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 21 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Wainwright, Alaska, a Private First Class, was acquitted by a military judge of two specifications of sexual assault, in violation of Article 120, UCMJ.

On 21 February 2020, at a general-court martial convened at Schofield Barracks, Hawaii, SPC Brendon Velez, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of attempted wrongful possession of a controlled substance, one specification of violation of a lawful general order, one specification of wrongful possession of a controlled substance, and three specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 80, 92, and 112a, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 124 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 24 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Joint Base Lewis-McChord, Washington, SGT Alexa E. Ramon, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her pleas, of one specification of conspiracy, one specification of wrongful solicitation, two specifications of false official statement, one specification of wrongful distribution of a controlled substance, one specification of possession of a controlled substance with intent to distribute, and two specifications of prostitution, in violation of Articles 81, 82, 107, 112a, and 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-2, to be confined for 150 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 25 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Fort Carson, Colorado, PV2 Jacob T. O'Connell, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and two specifications of wrongful use of a controlled substance, in violation of Articles 86, and 112a, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of absence without leave, in violation of Article 86, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 60 days, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 27 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SGT Michael R. Parma, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of two specifications of selling military property, and two specifications of larceny, in violation of Articles 108, and 121, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 10 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 28 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Fort Bliss, Texas, SPC Daesung Kim, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of desertion, and one specification of possession of child pornography, in violation of Articles 85, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of distributing of child pornography, in violation of Article 134, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be

confined for 24 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 28 February 2020, at a special court martial convened at Fort Shafter, Hawaii, SSG Katherine R. Powell, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to her pleas, of two specifications of disrespecting a superior commissioned officer, in violation of Article 89, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of absence without leave, of one specification of disrespecting a superior commissioned officer, three specifications of willfully disobeying a superior commissioned officer, two specifications of disrespecting a noncommissioned officer, and one specification of false official statement, in violation of Articles 86, 89, 90, 91, and 107, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reprimanded, to be reduced to the grade of E-5, and to forfeit \$1,160.00 of pay per month for two months.

Fifth Judicial Circuit

On 13 February 2020, at a general court-martial convened at Wiesbaden, Germany, SPC Christopher P. Morris, United States Army, was convicted by a military panel composed of officers and enlisted members, contrary to his pleas, of two specifications of violation of a lawful general regulation, one specification of sexual assault of a child, and two specifications of child endangerment, in violation of Articles 92, 120b, and 134, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of sexual assault of a child, in violation of Article 120b, UCMJ. The members sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to forfeit all pay and allowances, to be confined for 18 years, and to be discharged from the service with a dishonorable discharge.

On 20 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Vilseck, Germany, SPC Nathaniel S. Montgomery, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to his pleas, of one specification of absence without leave, and one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Articles 86, and 111, UCMJ. The accused was acquitted of one specification of desertion, in violation of Article 85, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-1, to be confined for 7 months, and to be discharged from the service with a bad-conduct discharge.

On 25 February 2020, at a special court-martial convened at Ansbach, Germany, SPC Agatha M. Kyalo, United States Army, was convicted by a military judge, pursuant to her plea, of one specification of drunken operation of a vehicle, in violation of Article 113, UCMJ. The military judge sentenced the accused to be reduced to the grade of E-3, and to be restricted to specified limits for 45 days.

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
